FOREWORD

THE Brotherhood of Sleeping Car Porters was organized in 1925 in New York City. It has had fifteen years of hard and difficult struggle. During this period, many Porters have lost their jobs. Nevertheless, groups of Porters and Divisions throughout the country have remained loyal to the cause of the Brotherhood.

Because of this loyalty on the part of the Porters, Attendants and Maids, even though in small numbers in the various Divisions from coast to coast, the Brotherhood was able to sign an Agreement with the Pullman Company in Chicago in 1937.

That Agreement brought recognition to the Brotherhood of Sleeping Car Porters as the duly authorized bargaining agency for the negotiation of agreements concerning rates of pay and rules governing working conditions for Porters, Maids and Attendants.

During the early days of the struggle of the Brotherhood, opposition was bitter and determined, not only from the Pullman Company, but also from some Negro leaders in the press, church and politics. Despite this fact, the Porters never quit. They fought tenaciously on.

Today, the Brotherhood of Sleeping Car Porters is an outstanding symbol of the capacity, will and spirit of the Negro people to stand on their own feet, for the Porters in the Brotherhood paid the price of their victory. They endured privation and suffered incident to the loss of jobs.

Thus, the officials and members of the Brotherhood consider that the most important contribution the struggle of the Porters has made to the life of the Negro people is the record of self-reliance.
