Dear Sir:

As requested in your letter dated February 3rd,
1942, I am delivering herewith the following:

1. Map of Marin County (In two parts) giving the requested information.
2. Report concerning each japanese found in the unincorporated areas of the county.
3. Requested city maps for San Rafael, Fairfax, Larkspur, Corte Madera, Mill Valley, Belvedere and Sausalito.
4. Reports submitted by the Chiefs of Police of each city above mentioned, with the exception of Sausalito.

Upon the completion of the maps and reports for San Anselmo, Ross, and Sausalito, the same will be forwarded to your office in San Francisco.

Calling your attention to the county map, you will notice that the locations of all properties in question have been indicated by a red dot, whether within city limits or within the unincorporated areas. In the unincorporated areas, we have designated the number of japanese living on each location by key numbers from 1 to 25, there being at the present time a total of 25 individuals residing in such area. These numbers correspond with numbers given in the written report covering the unincorporated area. No key number is given on the county map for japanese within city limits,, however a numerical total (in red circle) is given for each city and an attempt has been made to locate the properties as well as possible within each city.

In the city maps, you will notice that each property is more exactly located and that a key number refers to the individuals covered by the written reports submitted for each city.

I desire to acknowledge receipt of both pages of the two-page map of your County which was sent to you in connection with the Alien Land Law survey being carried on by this office, together with maps of the cities in your County. Your courtesy and cooperation in connection with the completion and return of these maps are greatly appreciated. We are finding these maps generally useful in the National Defense work which is being carried on by this office.

I presume that there will probably be material changes in connection with the maps of your County which reflect the location of Japanese thereon.
