The Japanese-Americans are entitled to the rights equal to that of them. There were approximately 200 Japanese ancestry. The majority of them have been transfered from Manzanar to Minidoka, while 2 or 3 from each family are now in the army.

the West Coast; however, while they were in the Relocation Center, Anti-Japanese sentiment has been insitagted by the agitators.

A luncheon party was held last week at the Benjamin Franklin Hotel under auth of Seattle Mayor. Mr. Myer who was under visit to Seattle made an off-hand-speech announcing that the general opinion toward the Japanese ancestry on the West Coast will turn for the favorable tendency. In defiance of Myer's opinion, Mr. Doil, the chairman of Seattle Central Labor committee, has expressed his strong opinion as following:

I have the army discharged document of my grand-father at the time of the South-North American War. Consequently, I think I cansay to be an American. However, I oppose absolutely to the Japanese return at this time, and the majority of our 20000 members is in an accord of opinions. I have interviewed with many Marines and soldiers. They all want to know the reason for the permission of Japanese return. We have to prepare the way for the returned soldiers rather thanbeing clamorous on the Japanese question. To this criticism, Mr. Myer answered as following: "The Japanese return depends on the judgement of the army Authority, but not on us. In accordance with your announcement that 20000 members are in accord of the opinions, the great work is still pending in this area. You said that you talked with the mariner and thesoldiers, however, I wish you understant that, on that occasions the conversation was on the American, but not on "Japs". If these solders are still before overseas

departure, I wish you would let them know that the fact that 17600 Japanese Americans are serving with the American force. You need have no misgivings about the soldiers in Italy and on Iwo Island because these soldiers know too well what they are fighting for. I can hardly believe that 200000 members are all in accord with your opinion and also the accurate facts have been reported on the other hand."

THE EXTENT OF THE KNOWLEDGE OF THE AMERICANS

In a line of "Capital Information" written by Mr. John Odonell: "In the propagating tactic at the old time, the level of the intelligence of the Americans is understood to have been of an extent of the anti-quoted idea. 200 Japanese ancestories working in the tire manufactory at Acron, Ohio, show the result exceeding the Caucasian fellow workers. While the photograph party was taking the picture of the Niseis on the work to propagate this good result, a self-satisfied psychologist came in and said: "The publication and delivery of this picture shall not be allowed. Applousing the Japanese and delivery of this picture will demoralize the American spirit and cool down the fighting spirit on the Pacific Ocean. By this protest, the Picture of Niseis was prohibited.

THE QUESTION REGARDING TO THE RACIAL

DISCRIMINATION OF THE WEST COAST

Mr. McWilliams--the publisher of "Prejudice" under the main theme of the Japanese question and discrimination--has

written a long criticism on the "New York P. M." regarding the racial discrimination on the West Coast. Referring to McRosly who is making the ill gotten money in avail of the Anti-Japanese group, and also refering to the Alien land law passed by the Oregon Congress which is the only discrimination law on the West Coast ever since the announcement of the Military Order on December 17 Mr. Williams expressed that the fair people in that state held the mass-meeting with intention of retarding the pass of the bill, but it was too late for it.

Observing that, as was reported by the governor of California to the State-Cabinet, the majority of the State unholds the return right of Nisei and the sentiment toward the Japanese ancestry is generally turning favorably, Mr. McWilliams has concluded as following:

The agitators are not many; however, it is a question how to retard their offensive movement. To do so, it is necessary to have the majority of the fair people stand by our side. It is now in the most momentous time. If the fair persons spring to their feet, it is nothing hard to keep them isolated. San Francisco Conference is now in session. The West Coast is looking like a new place of the racial question. Would it be possible that the West Coast, joining the allied nation, abandons the illiberal racial question being behind time. If the question of the evacuation is the great cause of uneasiness on the West coast, the answer made a while ago is "Yes." However, the really greatest question is that regarding to the Negroes moving to the North West in enormous number.
