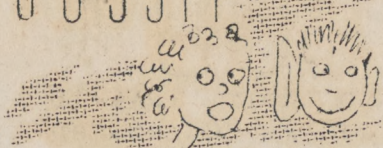

Also, he has been a star player on the Eagles, and was a sharp shooter at that!! Don't you agree girls?

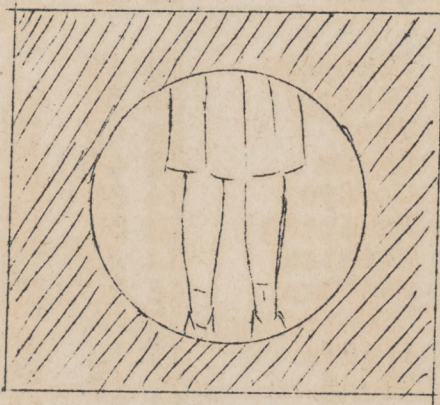
He stands about 5' 5" in height and weighs enough for his size.

The Cody boys held a slight lead for a short time in the opening minutes of the game, but when the Eagle machine started rolling, there was no stopping them until the final whistle.

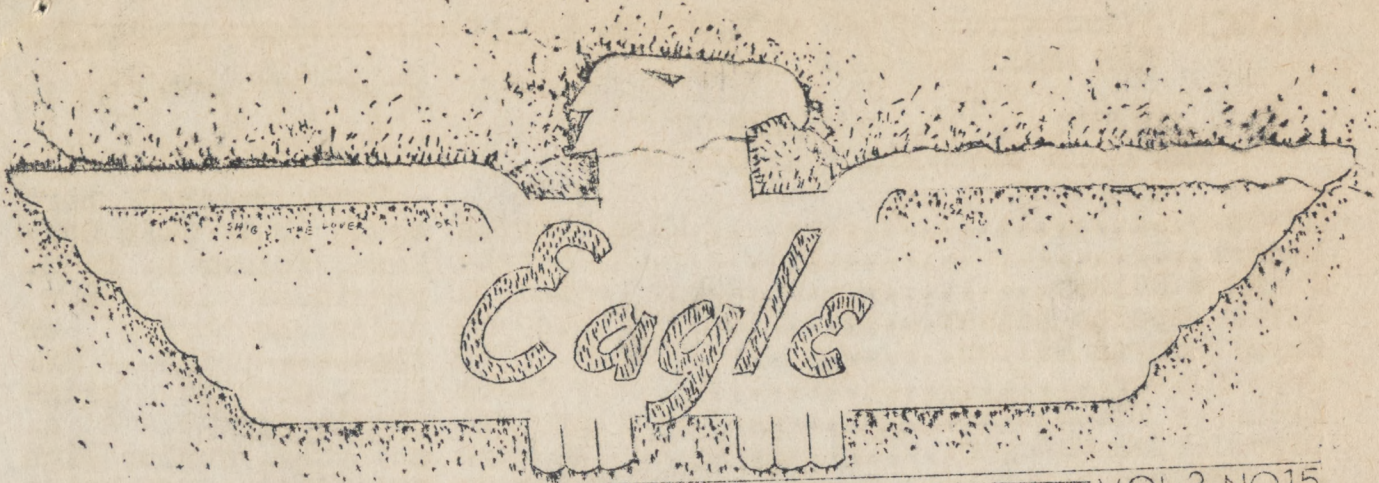
