With the addition of more suggestions for our church bulletin name, the list of names have been swelled to twenty-three.

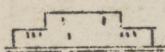

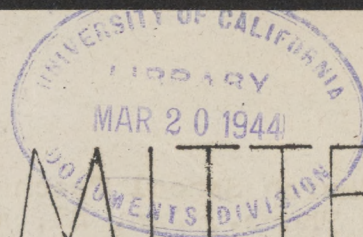

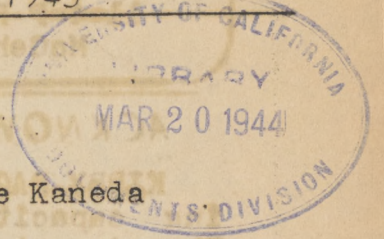
