
It gives me great pleasure and a distinct honor to nominate for the "Alumnus of the Year" Award Ms. Yoshiko Uchida who graduated from our University "Cum Laude". In 1942 she received her diploma in absentia in the confines of a horse stall, a victim of racism and discrimination, from which she emerged without bitterness to become one of the most prolific writer of children's books.

My esteem for her comes not only from how she writes or what she writes but from her reasons for writing. In Ms. Uchida's own words, "Each of us must take pride in our special heritage, but there is purpose in searching our past to better understand ourselves only if we can one day understand each other and thereby celebrate our common humanity". "It is a happy thought that children in so many countries can have a good time hearing the same stories. But this is only natural, and was true a hundred years ago as it is today. With so much in all of us that is alike, it is a pity people the world over have continued to find so much in each other that is different and strange." "Just as the universal qualities of the folk tales can bring the children of the world together, it is my hope that a further sharing of common ideas and hopes will eventually bring them together as adults".

The greatness of our University as well as our Nation is the result of the contributions by different cultures and ethnicities, like threads of varied colors woven into one durable cloth which even time cannot erode.

In conclusion, I would like to apologize for burdening you with all the enclosures, some which are repetitious; but not being blessed with the ability of putting my thoughts in writing it was necessary for me to rely upon the words of people who are better endowed. Also, to thank you for giving me this opportunity to make this nomination.


Dear Mr. Sammet:

Graduated Cum Laude - 1942 University of California

Received her diploma in absentia in the confines of a horse stall in Tanforan Assembly Center a victim of racism and discrimination from which she emerged without bitterness to become one of the most prolific writers of children's books. Among the 26 children books she has written she has received coveted Silver Award from the Commonwealth Club of California. "Samurai of Gold Hill" (1973) and "A Jar of Dreams" - 1982.

Among the many awards she received the Distinguished Service Award from the University of Oregon.

"Desert Exile" is her most recent book. Daniel Inoue - "In "Desert Exile" Yoshiko Uchida has given us a chronicle of a special kind of courage, the courage to preserve normalcy and humanity in the face of irrationality and inhumanity. Her family's story, told in living detail, brings alive the internment experience and is an important book for all Americans. It is not a history of the decisions that were made during this period but rather is a story of human lives touched and molded by those decisions. As such it is infinitely more important and infinitely more precious"
