Marquette University: In response to your letter of July 30, we are extremely sorry to be obliged to say that, because of the international situation, we are not accepting any students of Japanese extraction in our School of Medicine.

University of Alabama: In answer to your letter of July 30th, Alabama is a two-year school of Basic Medical Sciences. We transfer our students at the end of their second year to four-year schools to graduate. Therefore, of course, we could not grant your request.

Harvard Medical School: I am very sorry to report that it is not possible for us to consider you as a candidate at this school. The eastern seaboard is very much in the same position as the west coast, and under the unfortunate circumstances of the time we are unable to send you material and applications. PP We are most regretful, but possibly you will have better success in applying to schools in the central part of this country.

University of North Carolina: Due to the fact that there are more applications from qualified residents of this State, and from out of state students who are graduates of this University than we can now admit, it will be impossible for us to consider your application. It would be wiser for you to apply to a medical school in your own section of the country.

Ohio State University: Inasmuch as this is a State University applicants for admission to the College of Medicine are limited to residents of Ohio.

University of Illinois: Owing to the large number of applications we receive each year from those who are residents of Illinois, it is not possible for us to consider requests for admission from candidates who are not residents of Illinois.

Syracuse University: Your letter of July thirtieth has been received. PP This is a small medical school with limited clinical and laboratory facilities and it is the policy of the school not to accept any students to advanced standing. I regret to inform you that the Admissions Committee would therefore be unable to consider your application for admission to the third-year class.

Medical College of Virginia: In reply to your letter of July 30, we regret to advise you that our third year class in medicine is complete and that it will not be possible therefore to consider your application for admission to this class.

Columbia University: In reply to your letter of July 30th, I regret to say that we shall not be able to admit any transferring students to our third year class next March. Our prospective third year class is an unusually large one and we are therefore unable to accommodate additional students.

COPIES

- University of Rochester: I regret to advise you that there is no vacancy in any class in this school.
- Jefferson Medical College of Philadelphia: I am sorry to have to advise you that we do not have any vacancies in the third year class for the coming session and will not be able to consider your application. PP I trust you may be successful in securing admission elsewhere.
- Duke University: We regret to inform you of our inability to consider your application for admission to this school of medicine.
- University of Vermont: I regret to inform you that we have no vacancies in this college at the present time.
- Indiana University: There are no vacancies in the Indiana University School of Medicine.
- Wayne University: Owing to the large number of applications we receive each year from those who are residents of Michigan, I regret that it is not possible for us to accommodate any non-residents.
- Baylor University: In reply to your letter of July 30th I must advise that we do not have any vacancies in our next junior or third year class, consequently, we cannot consider your application for transfer. I trust you will be able to gain admission elsewhere to complete the medical course.
- University of Iowa: Our classes are filled and our registration is closed. Therefore we cannot consider your application for admission to our third year class.
- New York University: In reply to your inquiry of July 30th, we regret to have to advise that there are no vacancies for advanced standing in the third year class of this medical college at this time.
- Washington University: In response to your inquiry of recent date I am sorry to have to inform you that it will not be possible for us to consider your application for admission to our third year class.
- Temple University: All classes are now in session for the year 1942-1943. It is, therefore, impossible to consider your application for transfer to our Junior Class. PP The next classes will enter medical school April 1.
- Dartmouth Medical School: Your letter addressed to the Dean has been referred to me for reply. PP The curriculum of the Dartmouth Medical School offers only the first two years of instruction. There would, therefore, be no opportunity for considering your application here.
- Western Reserve University: We regret that we are unable to consider your application for transfer to the third year class at the School of Medicine of Western Reserve University since our classes are already filled to capacity.
- University of Texas: In response to your request of recent date please be advised that admission to the School of Medicine, University of Texas, is limited to bona fide residents of Texas. Residence in Texas for educational purposes does not satisfy this requirement. Enrollment is restricted on account of limited laboratory and clinical facilities.
