Community Council meeting, Friday, August 7, 1942
9:00 a. m.

Block 28, mess hall
The meeting called to order by Chairman of the Council, Dr. T. G. Ishimaru.
Roll call by secretary, Mrs. Tachibana.
Minutes were read and corrected. Hiroshi Amano, chairman of Community & Enterprises Committee instead of Bill Kasuga.

Several announcements were made by the chairman.
Election in Camps Two and Three and blocks who did not vote at the last election will in newly settled blocks of Camp One will be held on September 1. A special election will be held in Block 4/42/54, as a result of following the resignation of Harvey Suzuki, because of his heavy work in his project.

The chairman then mentioned that fact that at the first meeting, he requested a person to leave to the room because he was not a member of the council; that later he learned that that person had asked a councilman

one of the permission to come to the meeting. The chairman stated that although these meetings are not public, if any councilman felt that the presence of a non-member was necessary, the councilman should notify the chairman before the meeting. Dr. Ishimaru pointed out that, of course, he would not let the visitor would not have no voice.

Dr. Ishimaru suggested that various committees take down notes at these council meetings on subjects relating to their divisions.
Dr. Ishimaru announced that Com. Collier is visiting Camp and will address and deliver an address at a public meeting tomorrow night, August 8, at 8 o'clock on the roof of the Adobe Project.

Andrew Sugimoto/- his attention was called to the item in the Press Bulletin of August 2: "-----"
The cooling system at the present time in the wards and hospital are very poor. So long as we have 70 coolers here, it would be a good idea to make a recommendation to install several coolers in the hospital before installing of coolers in any other building. Mr. Sugimoto asked for ideas on the subject. Opened for discussion.

Chairman: opened for discussion. It is up to the council to make recommendation. It has been brought to the attention of the council that a certain number of coolers have come are here. We should try to install them in places where they will do the most good, at least for the benefit of the patients who are in the hospitals. I shall take up upon myself to send in a memorandum to Mr. Head as a recommendation from the council.

Recommendation from the committee *states that* *Mr. H. B. 4*

Now with respect to coming back to penalties. The committee arbitrarily selected the ~~of~~ term of not more than \$500 and not exceeding 180 days. If person charged with crime is unable to pay fine, he should be allowed to work it out, on the basis of ~~perhaps~~ *\$3 per day, or something like that.*

Mr. Kuwahara raised a question regarding "vagrancy." Did I understand correctly that one who refuses work that is offered him, shall be liable for vagrancy. *Mr. Kuwahara added that the project director has stated that no one will be forced to work and yet in the community itself we are going to make them work.*

Chairman - It will be up to the council and when you offer them work, the council can do what it wants to do with those such people.

Haas - The WRA issued a bulletin some three weeks ago or so which states that there would be a debit of \$20 on the part of anybody who did not work and a similar charge for each of his dependents.

A question was asked as to
Question: Who is considered eligible for work?

Mr. Haas answered that
Anyone 16 years of age or over who is not exempt under any good cause and is able-bodied. So far, there has been no instances of anyone being forced to work.

Kado - There was that ~~clause-i~~ provision that if they did not pay the \$20 then the WRA would transfer them to some other center.

That bulletin is available and that
Mr. Haas - All the basic documents, if the council wishes, could bring to the council so that they would have a chance to be reviewed.
