The class in fingerprinting completed was given to evacuees not attached to Police Department. Nine new policemen were given training of 12 hours in Investigation of Crime Scene, Descriptions of persons and property and Traffic Control. This will qualify these men for a "C" rating as soon as they have worked 3 months.

Segregation of first Tule Lake contingent completed without incident. Trend is one of complete cooperation. There appears a feeling of more respect for administration and a lifting of morale throughout the camp.

Captain Yo Ishida has received his induction papers and is leaving November 3rd for Camp Savage Language School. We will feel the loss of Captain Ishida but know that he will be a credit to the army and to Manzanar.

Victor Spanswick, A.P. police, has transferred to Poston, Arizona where he is reported to be Chief of Internal Security. This makes two men who have left Manzanar recently. First being Arthur Jewett who accepted position at Inyo Counting Sheriff's Office. These men have not been replaced as yet. A 24 hour watch is expected of the a.p. officers so we find ourselves shorthanded at this time. It is possible, replacements will be made shortly.

MANZANAR POLICE DEPARTMENT
Manzanar, California

November 29, 1943

The month of November has been a fairly quiet period for the Internal Security of Manzanar.

Members of the Police Department have worked many hours in an attempt to apprehend person or persons responsible for molesting girls and women returning home from evening sewing classes and social affairs. This person or persons have been approaching girls walking alone and has frightened them by speaking to them and reaching toward them in an apparent attempt to attack the girls. While we have had only a total of 3 cases reported, rumor says many girls have been annoyed.

On November 23rd, 1943 at 8:30 p.m. Officers under direction of Lieut. Eddie Higashi found a boy acting in a suspicious manner outside of a block dance and the boy was brought to the Police Station for questioning. He denied any molesting of girls, however next day, he came to the Station and admitted twice annoying women, during the past month. As this boy is only 14 years old, he has been turned over to his parents. A doctor's examination indicated boy is normal in mental and physical development. While it is possible more than one boy has been annoying women, I believe this arrest will put a stop to this type of activities.

There has been two cases of gambling noticed by Police Department. One man was warned to stop such activities and has done so. The report came from other members of the block, indicating that any type of organized gambling is frowned upon by the majority of the people.

One member of Police Department, Capt. Yo Ishida has been inducted into Camp Savage this month. Others are planning and training for this school.

This month a first aid class was started for the policemen who have not heretofore had this training. Sixteen men signed up for this class.

The month of December has brought forth several interesting developments.

Evacuee officers of the Internal Security Division were appointed by Ralph P. Merritt, Project Director. This is the first time the appointment method has been tried. Heretofore, the officers had been elected. It is thought that the appointment method will **work** out better than the elective method.

Assistant Chief Kiyoshi Higashi left on a short term leave, while out he will visit the Gulf States where he plans on finding a place for Terminal Island Fishermen to relocate.

An interesting case has developed **from** the actions of one Matsukichi Kamo. Kamo was involved in a case sometime ago, in which he was stabbed in the arm by one Frank Asa; Asa being turned over to the Immigration Department at that time. It seems that Kamo blamed three other men for the attack, claiming they had hired Asa to knife him. Therefore, Kamo, after waiting until after December 7th, so his motives would not be mis-construed called on each of the three men and attempted to beat them with a club.

Kamo was taken into custody by the evacuee police before he was able to do much damage. His trial has been set for January 3rd and in the mean time he was posted a peace bond. Investigation of the case shows that a group of small time gambling are trying to operate, and Kamo had attempted to operate in opposition to the others. In an effort to stamp out organized gambling operations, the case is being investigated from every angle and it appears that an arrangement will be reached, by the time Kamo has his trial, that will clear up the situation.

One burglary occurred at the Co-op canteen on the night of Dec. 6th. Investigation indicates that children may have been responsible.

On December 24th the Military Police received orders to leave gates from the Center into the Area, unguarded during the hours of 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. The responsibility for checking passes and trucks in and out from these gates during 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. has been delegated to the Internal Security Evacuee Police Department.

In comparison with December of 1942, it will be noted that there is now in Manzanar a complete change of attitude on part of both evacuee and appointed personnel. There is now an attitude of cooperation **with** the office of the Project Director and a desire to promote better peace and understanding.

The fact that there remains in Manzanar about 1500 persons that are scheduled to go to Tule Lake is apparently the only thing that stands in the way of an almost complete harmony.

Seven boys were arrested by the Military Police, for being out of bounds, they were turned over to the Project Director for trial. Were given a 6 months probation and release to custody of their parents.

The Police Department worked hard in effort to assist in the movement to Tulalake. We have lost eight men during this movement, all going to Tulalake.

Monthly Report for March 1944

In crime prevention work, the Police, Community Activities, Education Department and Community Welfare are working together. Meetings have been held and arrangements are being made to include all unorganized groups of boys and girls in regular community activities, making them into more responsible groups.

Cases referred to Welfare include one listed as assault. Evidence in the case did not justify an arrest. Subject is also a logical suspect in a previous assault case. Subject appears to be a psychopathic case, at least as far as sex is concerned. Arrangements have been made to keep him under observation in his block and it is quite possible, additional evidence will be obtained.

Among cases referred to Education, is one involving a disturbance of the peace at a school entertainment. The boys involved were not arrested at the request of the school principal. However, they were lectured and arrangements were made to keep them busy.

Convictions were obtained in one drunk case, one speeding case, three stop sign violations, one unauthorized use of government vehicle and a gambling case. One drunk case was continued until April 3, 1944

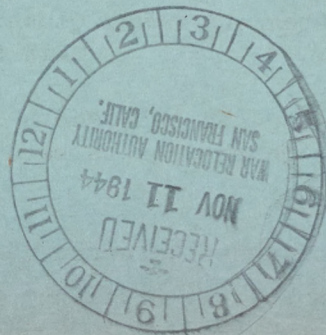

This month, due to the return of Chester Howard, assistant Internal Security officer, it has been possible to assign 1 man to the enforcement of traffic within the Center. Asso. Chief A.L. Williams being detailed.

The traffic problem in Manzanar has not been a bad one, until the past month or two. Lately the tendency has been toward speeding and failure to observe parking and stop signs. Immediately following the assignment of Mr. Williams this has been corrected to a certain extent. A continued enforcement program is now being arranged. A committee has been appointed by the Project Director, to work with Williams, to make a traffic survey and recommendations. An educational program is also being started in the schools and among the drivers in Manzanar.

Speeding tickets are given for all moving violations and these are referred to the Project Director for trial. Parking tickets are also given, however these are dismissed for the first offense by the Police Dept. and a card index kept of the violators. If a second ticket comes in, a case is made and it is to be referred to the Project Director for trial. The above applies to both appointed personnel as well as the evacuee driver.

It had been noted that during the month of November there has been an increase of minor disturbances and intoxication in the Center. This is due in part to the return of men from Work Group Leave. These men brought liquor into Manzanar when they returned. Instructions have been issued to make arrests in all cases of intoxication. There also appears a certain feeling of unrest. This may be resulting to the necessary restriction of camp life against the freedom that work groups have had on the outside. It is thought that a strict enforcement of regulations will keep things under control.

An arrest was made by an Evacuee Patrol Sergeant on the night of Nov. 27, 1944 that created a problem. There are regulations and laws that effect both Evacuee and Appointed Personnel. There appears no regulation for persons from the outside, except the one that requires passes to be issued to those entering the Center. There appears a question, in the mind of the District Attorney, whether the term Public Place would apply to Manzanar property. A resident of Independence, Sam Segal, was arrested for being intoxicated. This person entered Manzanar by going through the fence. His pass had been taken from him on Saturday, Nov. 25 at the termination of a garbage hauling contract. Segal was found at 11:50 P.M. wandering around, in the vicinity of the Auditorium building, in an extreme state of intoxication. Segal was taken to the County Jail and booked for drunk and disorderly conduct. On advice of the District Attorney, a complaint was filed under the Vagrancy section of the California Penal Code. The Justice of Peace in Lone Pine, that tried the case, gave a sentence of 90 days in the County Jail, of which 60 days were suspended, a 2 year probation during which time Mr. Segal is to refrain from taking a drink of alcoholic liquor. It seems that a ruling should be made as to whether Manzanar is a Public place in law, and regulations should be made to apply to anyone entering the Center. Many present state laws use the term public place, public street, public property and a conviction in these would be impossible, if in fact this Government property is construed to be private streets, places or property.

The month of December has proven to be one of the best since the camp started. Intoxication has not been noticed and the only case of disturbing the peace was found to be a very minor case.

The arrest of one evacuee for practicing medicine without a license and the search of another evacuee's apartment has placed this type of an offense. No court trial has been held for the person arrested. The case being referred to outside authorities, who have indicated they do not wish to prosecute. The case may be settled by relocation of the evacuee involved. Of the two burglaries, only one of them could be classified as a burglary in fact. The other burglary has been cased, but it is possible that a strong wind blew the door open, breaking the door casing and making it appear as if the door had been entered. However it was thought better to work on the assumption that a burglary had occurred.

The Internal Security Department was honored by a visit from Arthur James, the new Chief of Internal Security from Washington. His visit was enjoyed by all persons with whom he came in contact. We all hope that he returns often.

The first two books to be sent from Washington arrived and will be used in a Police School starting in January, 1945. Such assistance from Washington office is appreciated.

The resignation of Arthur Williams, Associate Internal Security Officer has been accepted with regret. Mr. Williams needed full time to devote to his hotel in Independence, Calif.

INTERNAL SECURITY REPORT FOR JANUARY 1945

The only case deserving of comment is case #1206. This case of Lewd Conduct resulted in the arrest and conviction of Jackson Nakashima. Nakashima has been mentioned several times in cases from Manzanar. The arrest and conviction of such a person relieves Manzanar considerably. The Inyo County Courts acted promptly and on a plea of guilty, sentenced Nakashima to San Quentin to serve a term of 1 year to life. The exact time to be determined by the State Prison Board later.

Army hearings in Manzanar have kept the Internal Security busy this month. The delivering of notices to all persons being interviewed and in many instances the escorting of the person to the hearing board has taken a great deal of time. Because of this the classes in Police Work have been postponed until a later date.

Acting on information given the Police by residents of Manzanar, the Police placed Zennosuke Sasayama of Block 18, in the hospital for observation. It was found that this man had been sent to Manzanar from the State Hospital for the Insane at Stockton, Calif. After a few days observation the doctors decided to return Sasayama to the State Hospital. A Police guard has been posted pending Sasayama's removal by the State Authorities.

Mr. Henry P. Collins, Internal Security Officer resigned on the 20th. The vacancies left by both Mr. Collins & Mr. Williams, who resigned last month, have not been filled. However Personnel reports both positions will be filled soon.

New Gate Clerks at the Main Gate have been assigned by Statistical Office releasing Internal Security Officers for their regular work.

May 1945 has shown an increase of burglary cases over that of May 1944, there being 2 more cases. The property loss however has been low, the total loss being less than \$50.00.

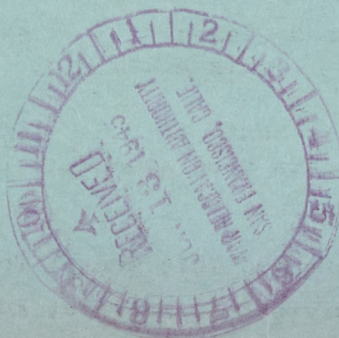
Assaults and other crime has shown a decided decrease, there being no assaults for May of this year against 3 for May 1944.

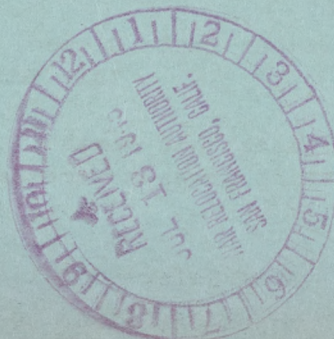

Case held pending, by the Project Director, due to the circumstances of the case. Both families are planning on relocation in the near future. The case of burglary involves juveniles. It is thought the boys were frightened enough in this case so as to prevent further burglaries by this group. No further trouble of this kind has been reported.

The cutting down on the number of vehicles for W.R.A. will curtail the number of Public Services the Police have been offering. However as we have lost 7 Evacuee Police to Relocation this month and will lose more as time goes on we wouldn't have been able to continue these extra services.

The two cases listed this month represent the lowest number of cases recorded since Manzanar opened. We hope that we can have less next month.

Increased work, however, is necessary as residents relocate, blocks are vacated and more property is stored in warehouses. We are trying to retain all members of the A.P. officers, until the camp is vacated. Unless the 48 hour week can be retained it will be necessary to increase the A.P. officers to at least 10 men. It seems impossible to employ men in Guard positions.

Most of the Evacuee force have planned on relocation during the next 30 days. Those remaining will be the old men, good only as gate guards.
