The Analysis of Employment Record

Aug. 10--Sept. 26, 1942

The statistical report, prepared for the Placement Office, Minidoka, W. R. A. , is originally based upon the following questions about registrations and assignments for employment from Aug. 10 to Sept. 26:

1. How many registrations had been made for employment?
2. What is ratio of the registration of persons from North Portland Center to those from Puyallup Center?
3. What is ratio of citizen registrations to that of non-citizen?
4. How many had been assigned for employment?
5. What is ratio of Portland assignments to Puyallup assignment?
6. What is ratio of citizen assignment to non-citizen assignment?

This investigation has been done by the methods of tablar and graphic presentation. First, the daily employment record was made in tablation form (Table 3) showing daily interviewed and assigned, secondly, the employment record was made because of avoiding serious fluctuation of trend due to Sunday and Saturday (Table 5), and finally, charts were set up for showing comparative ratios of citizen employment to non-citizen employment.

In the process of investigation, several lacks of information were found on the interview cards. That was said to be due to the fact that the interviewers in the first week did not receive an ^{unified instruction, and at the same} ~~for the registration.~~ ^{time they met a rush of people for the registration.} The total number of persons whose informations were not registered correctly is 210, including male 111 and female 99.

Consequently, the data which showed the lacks of informations could not be recorded because they were not clear in citizenship, interviewed date, and preset and former addresses.

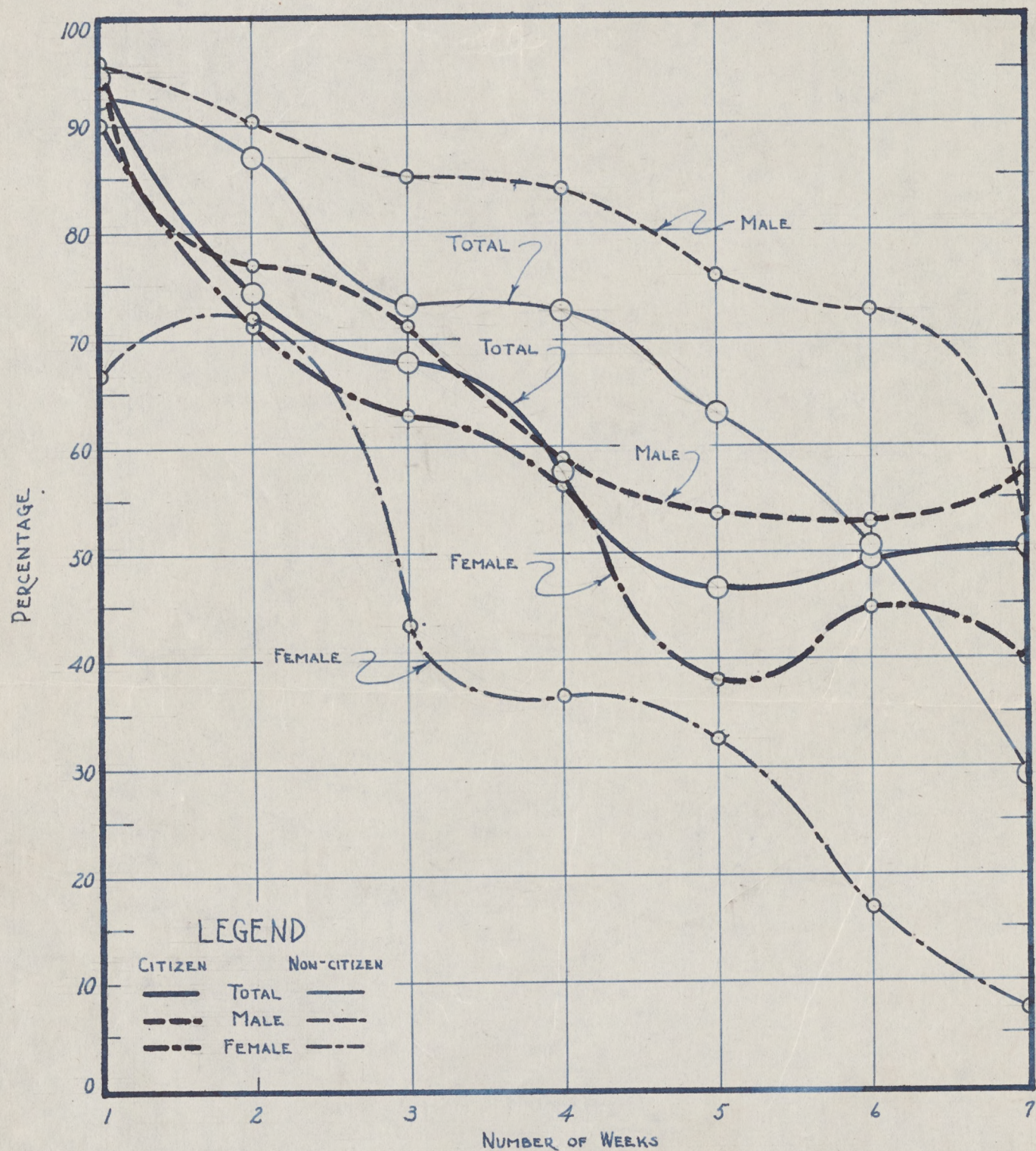
On the other hand, an other trouble in this statistical work was that those who went out for farm harvest could not be shown an exact number of persons. Their termination papers were not returned immediately from each division to the Placement Office. Some of them, therefore, were still in the assigned file until they were approved with their documents. Although the total number of them showed 83, in fact, great number of persons was to be terminated since Sept. 13, 1942. Naturally, the total number of employed shown on the table should be more than the actual figure.

The main purpose of this statistical work is, however, to show a registration and employment relation during the past 7 weeks.

AUGUST 10 TO SEPTEMBER 26, 1942

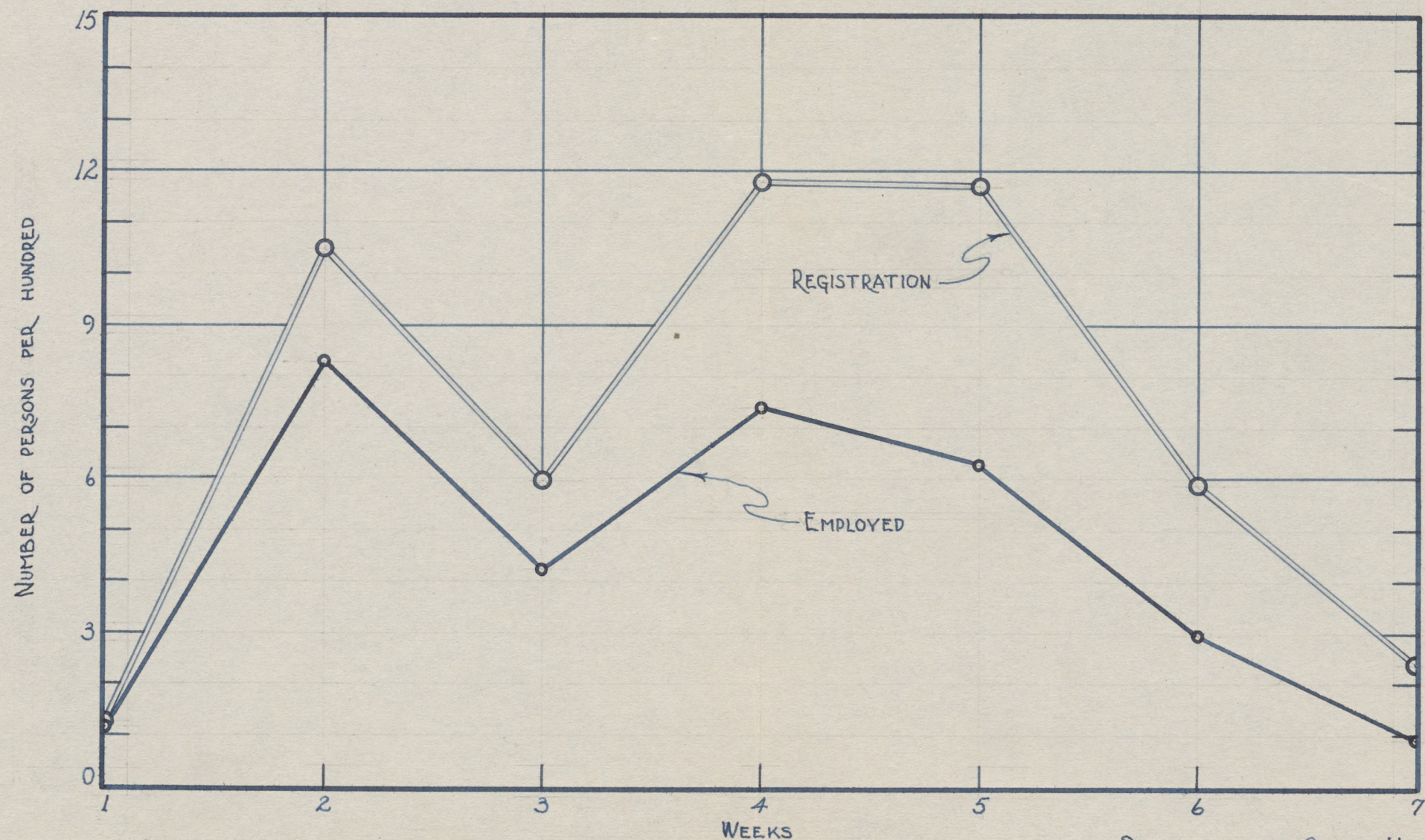

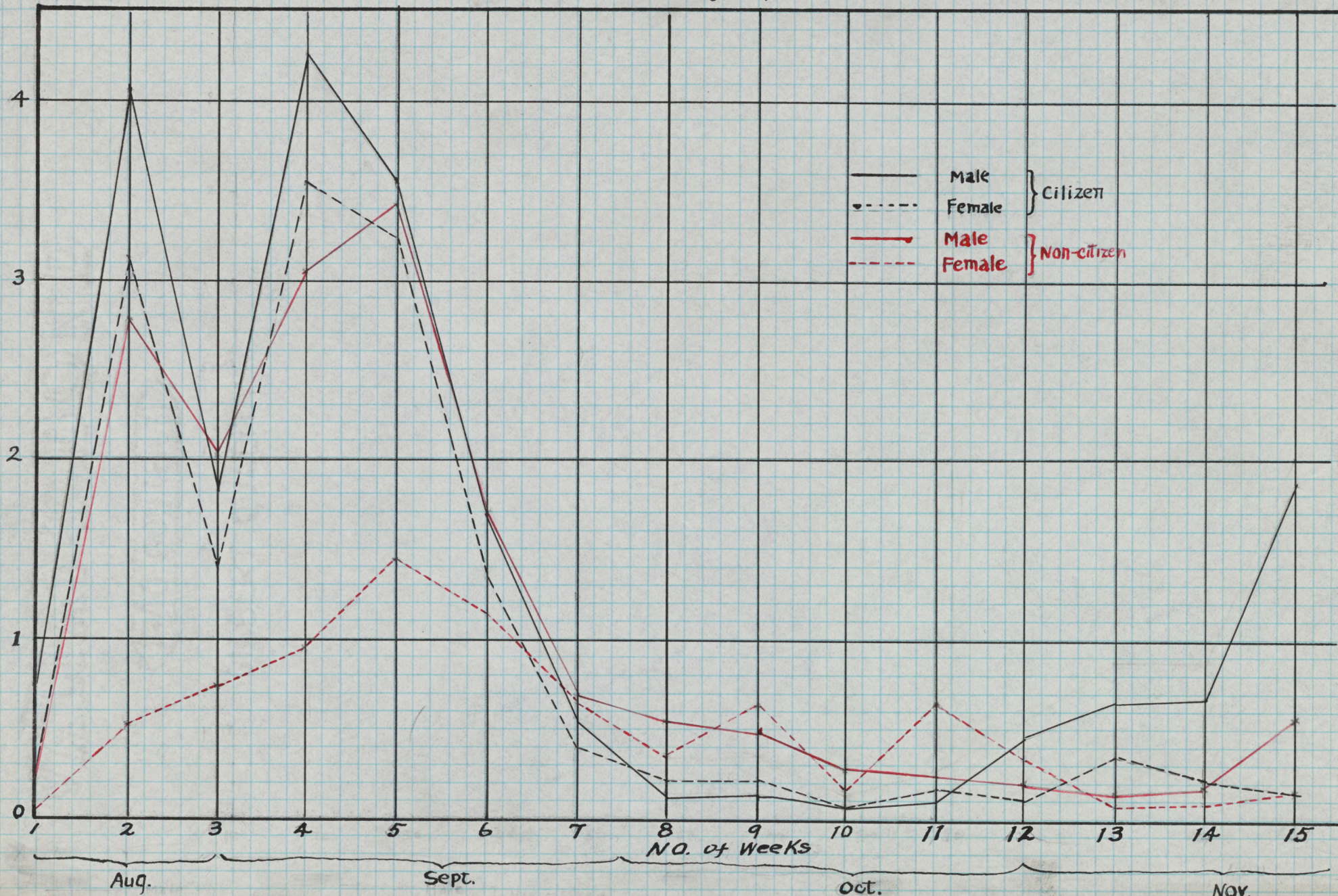

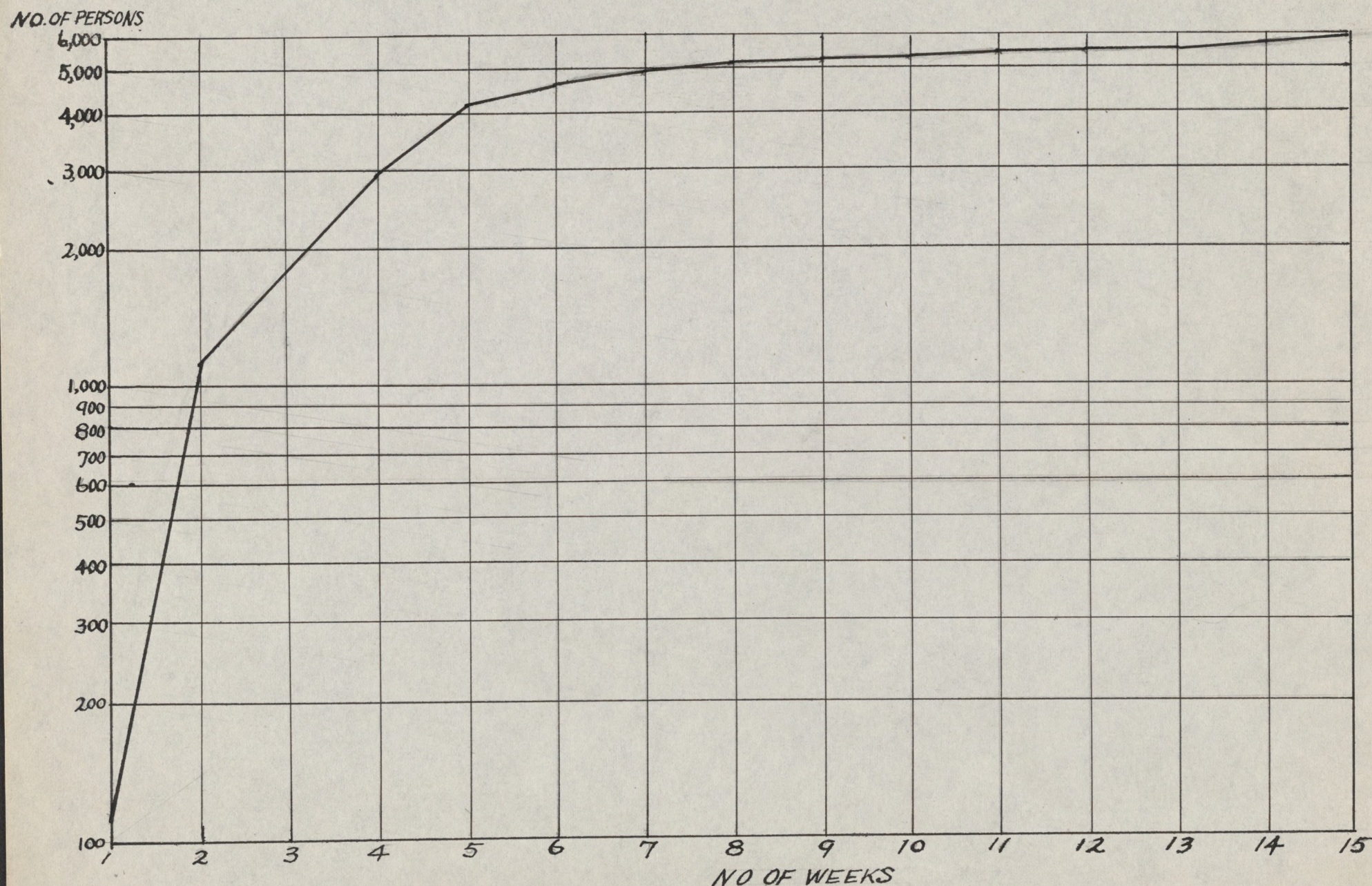

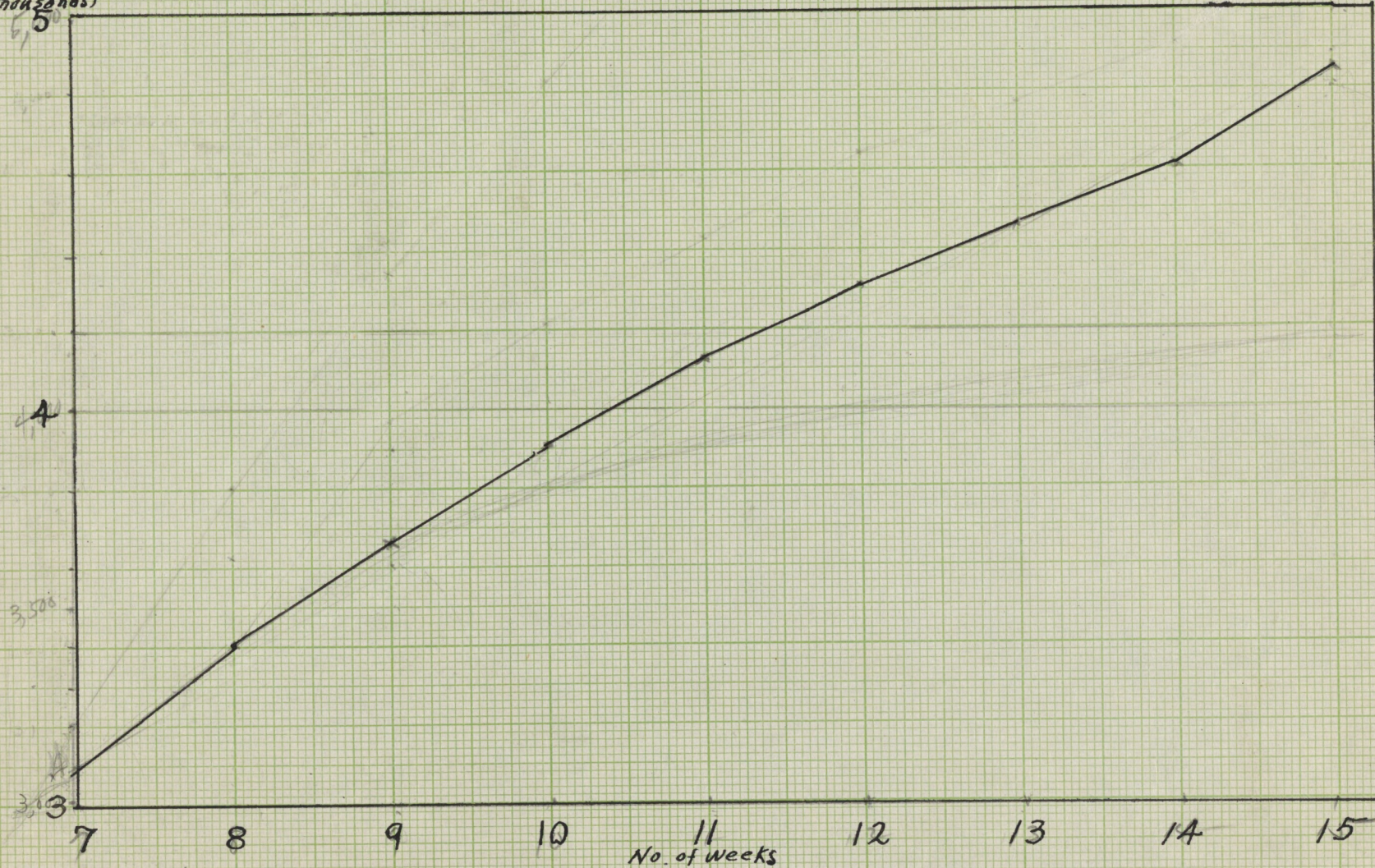

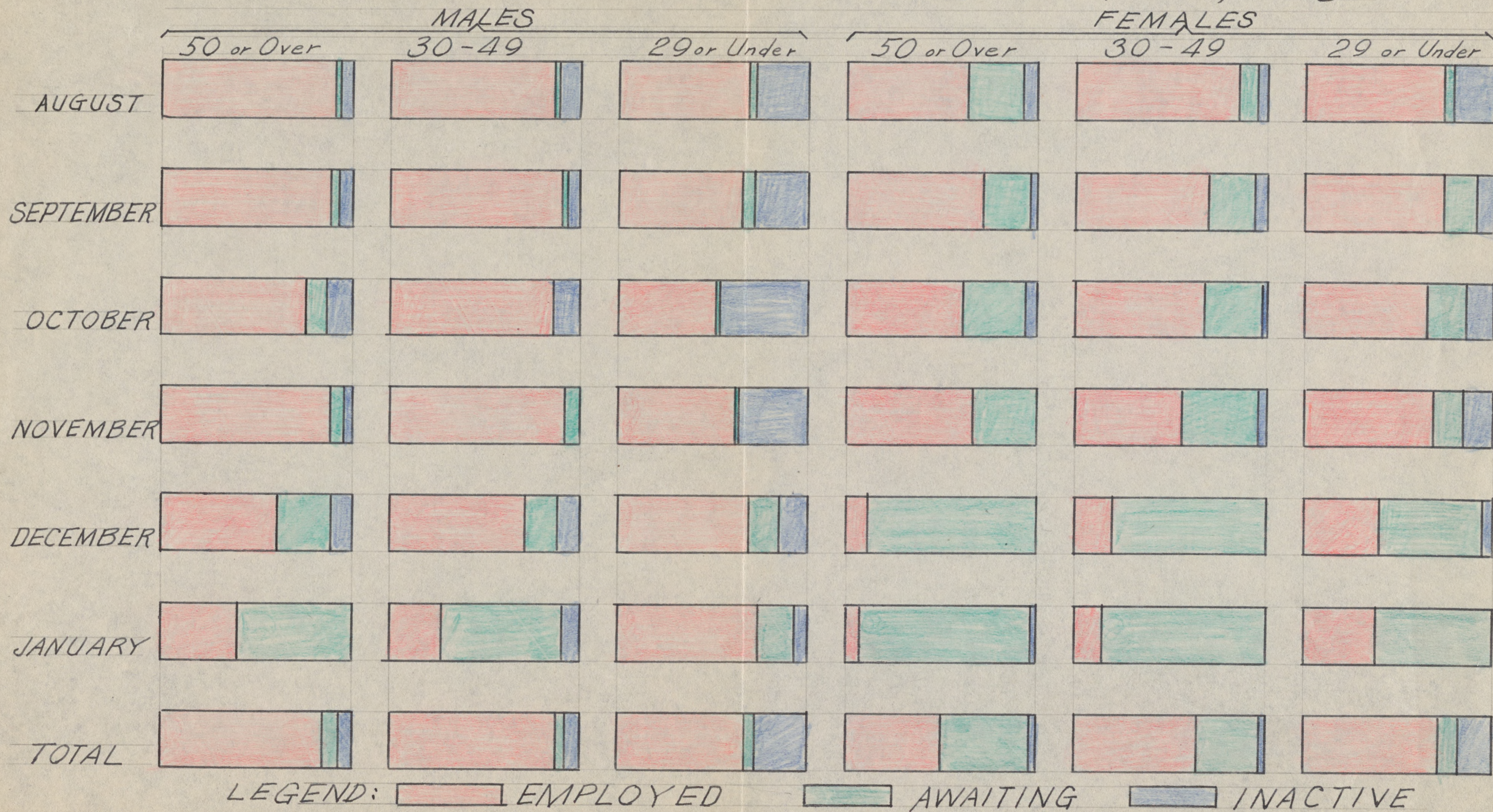

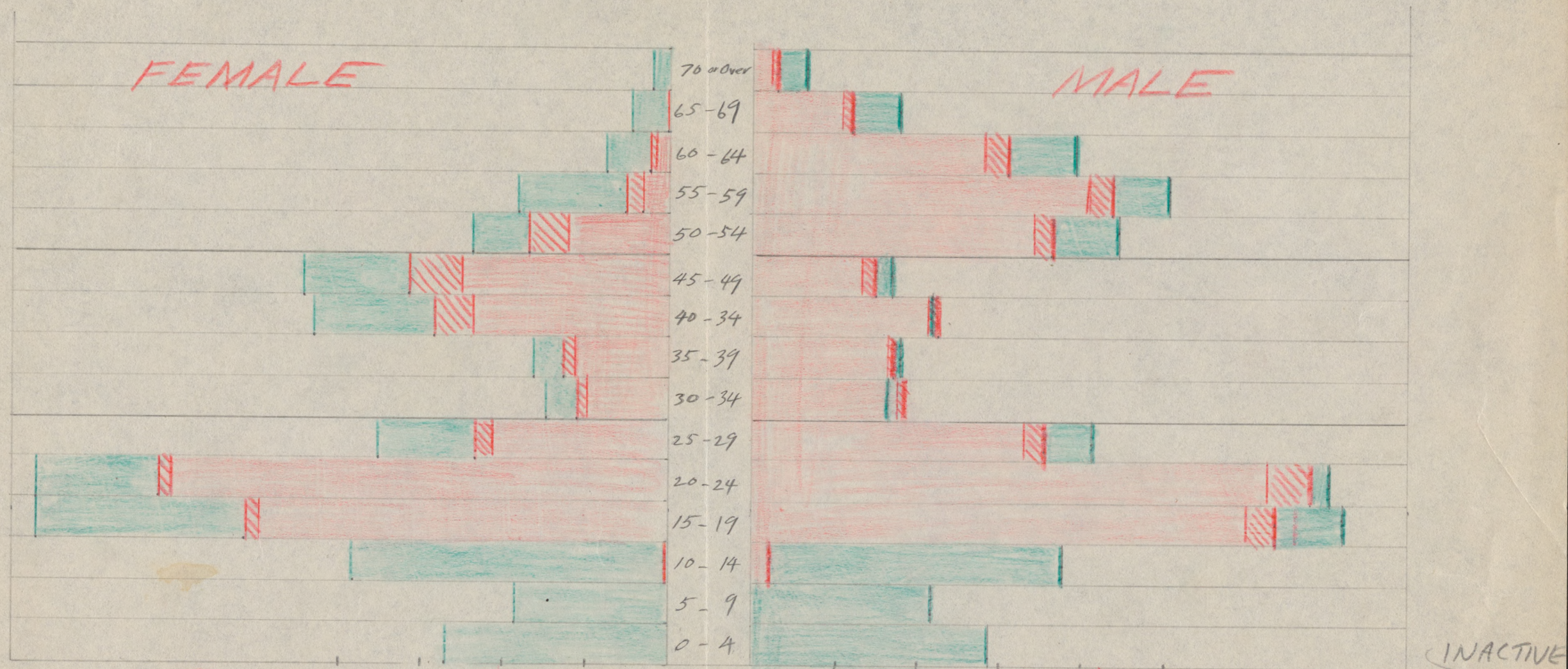

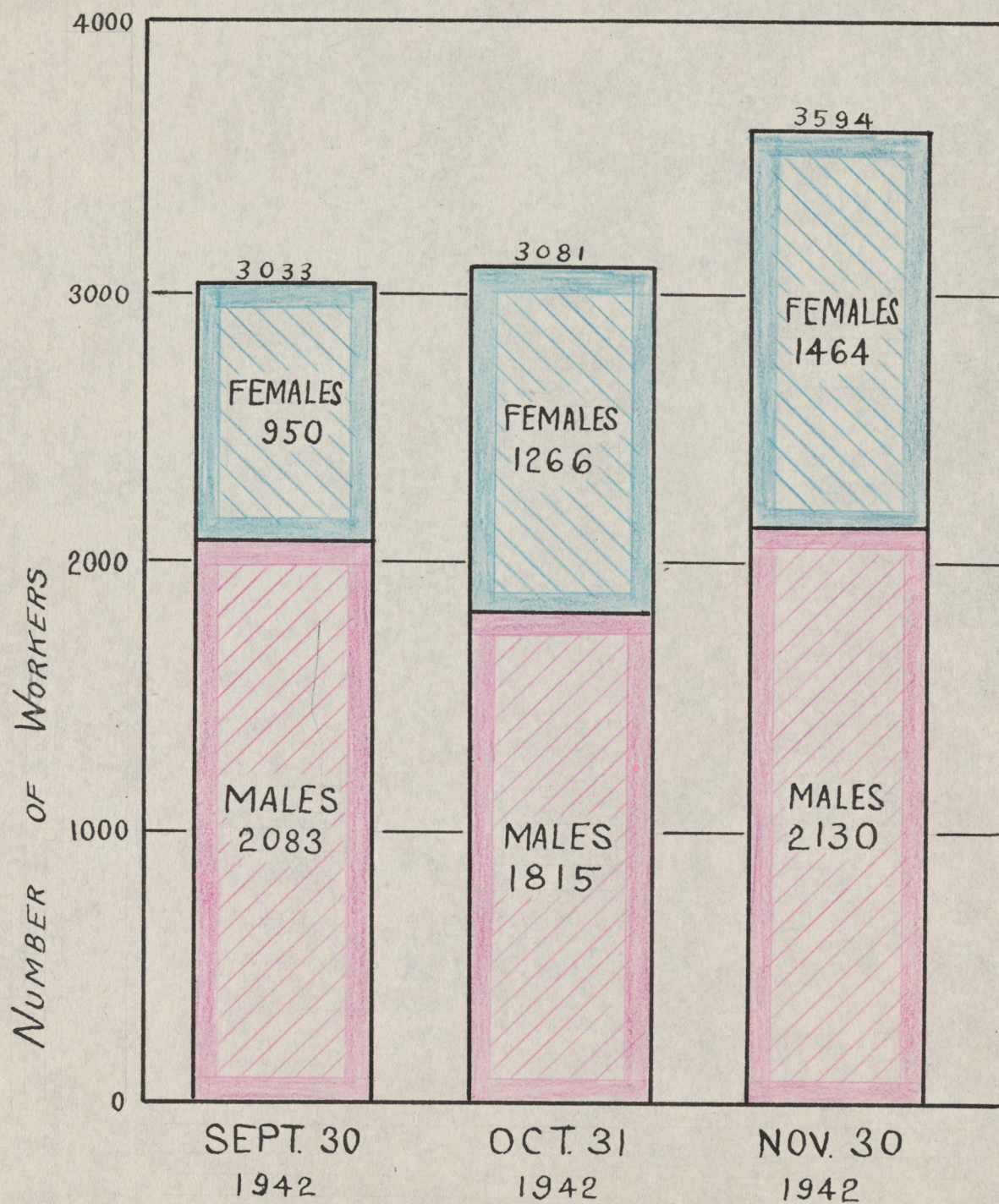

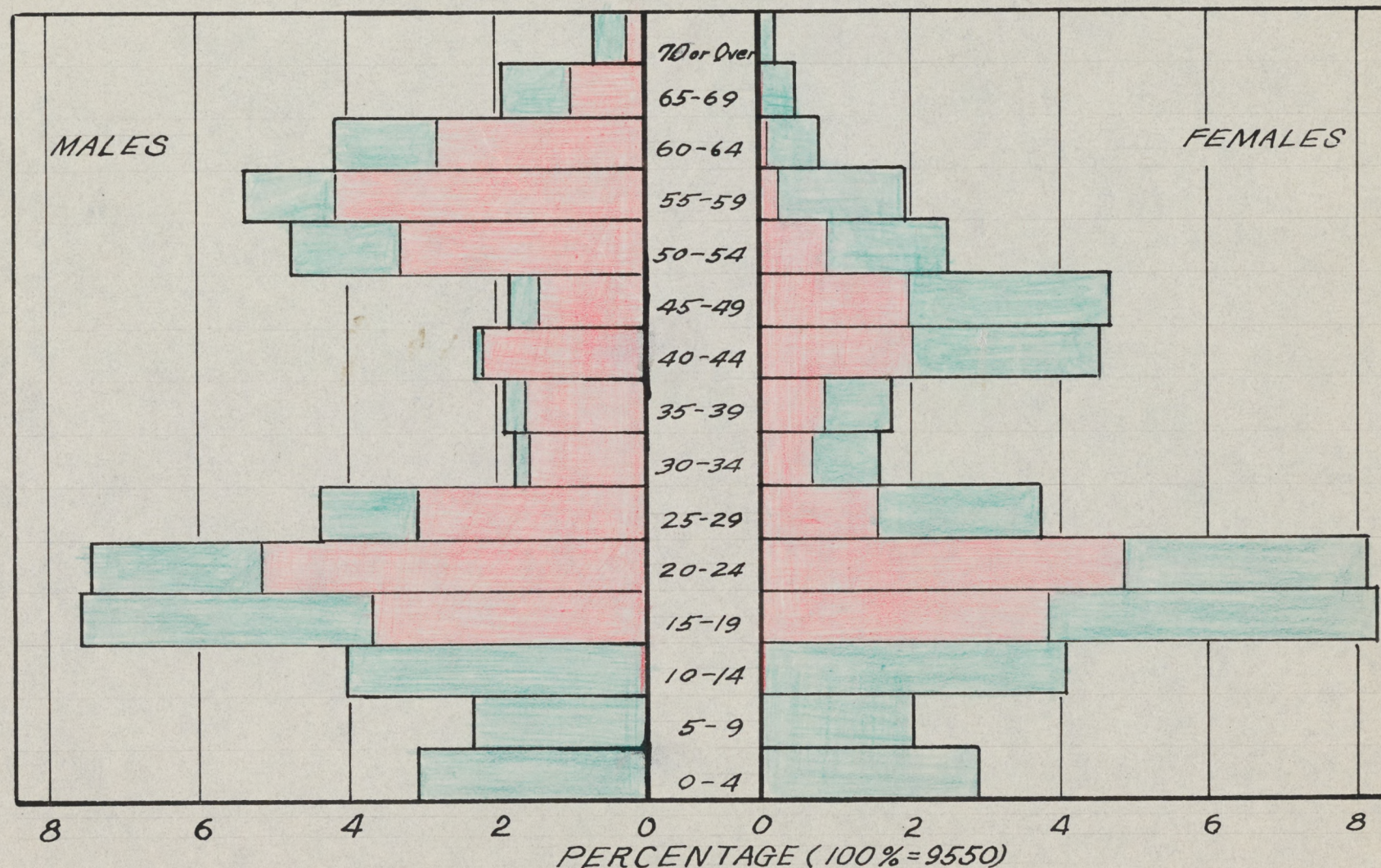

BY MONTH

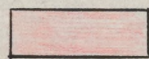


AGE-SEX DISTRIBUTION OF PROJECT POPULATION AND PROJECT EMPLOYMENT

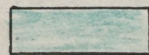

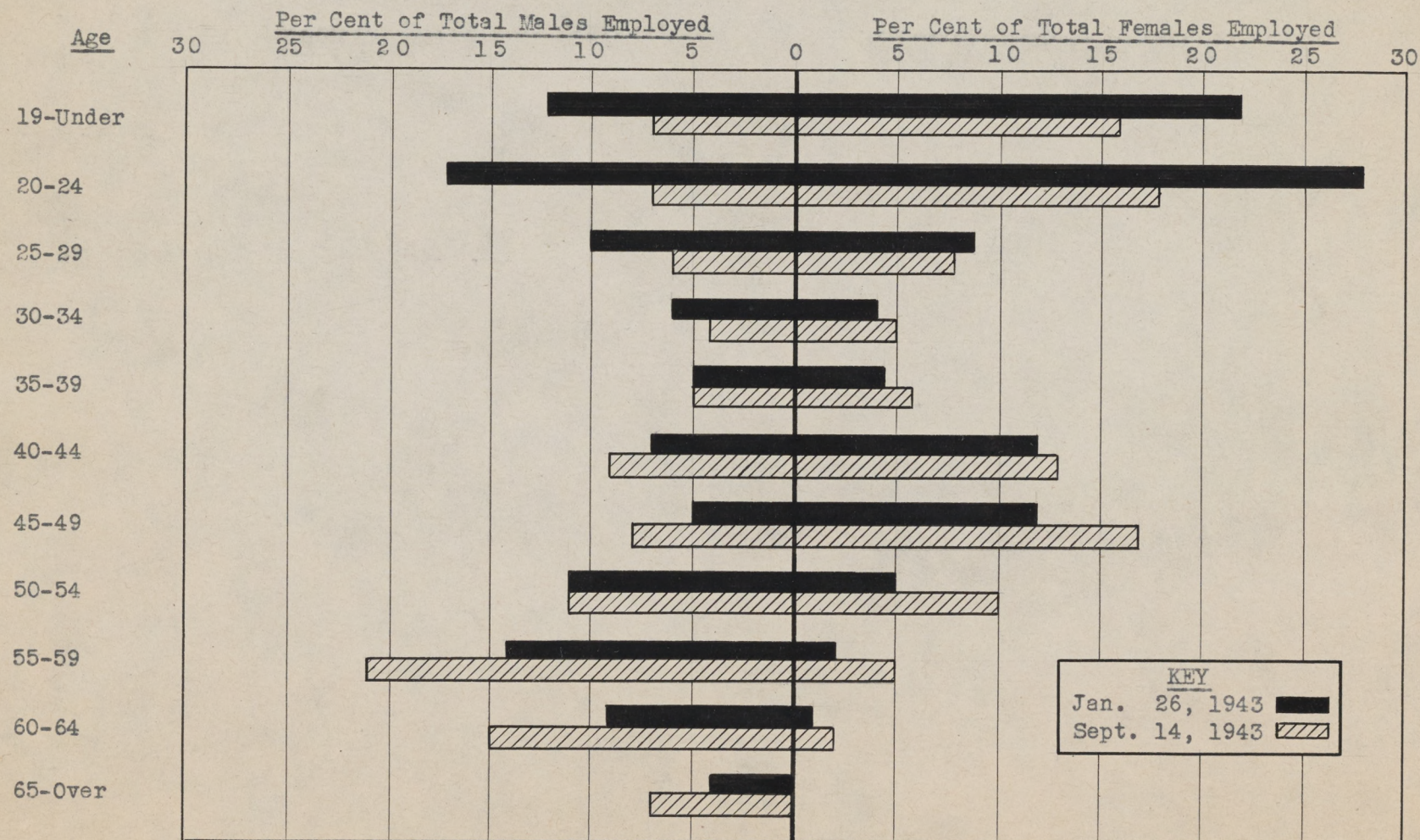

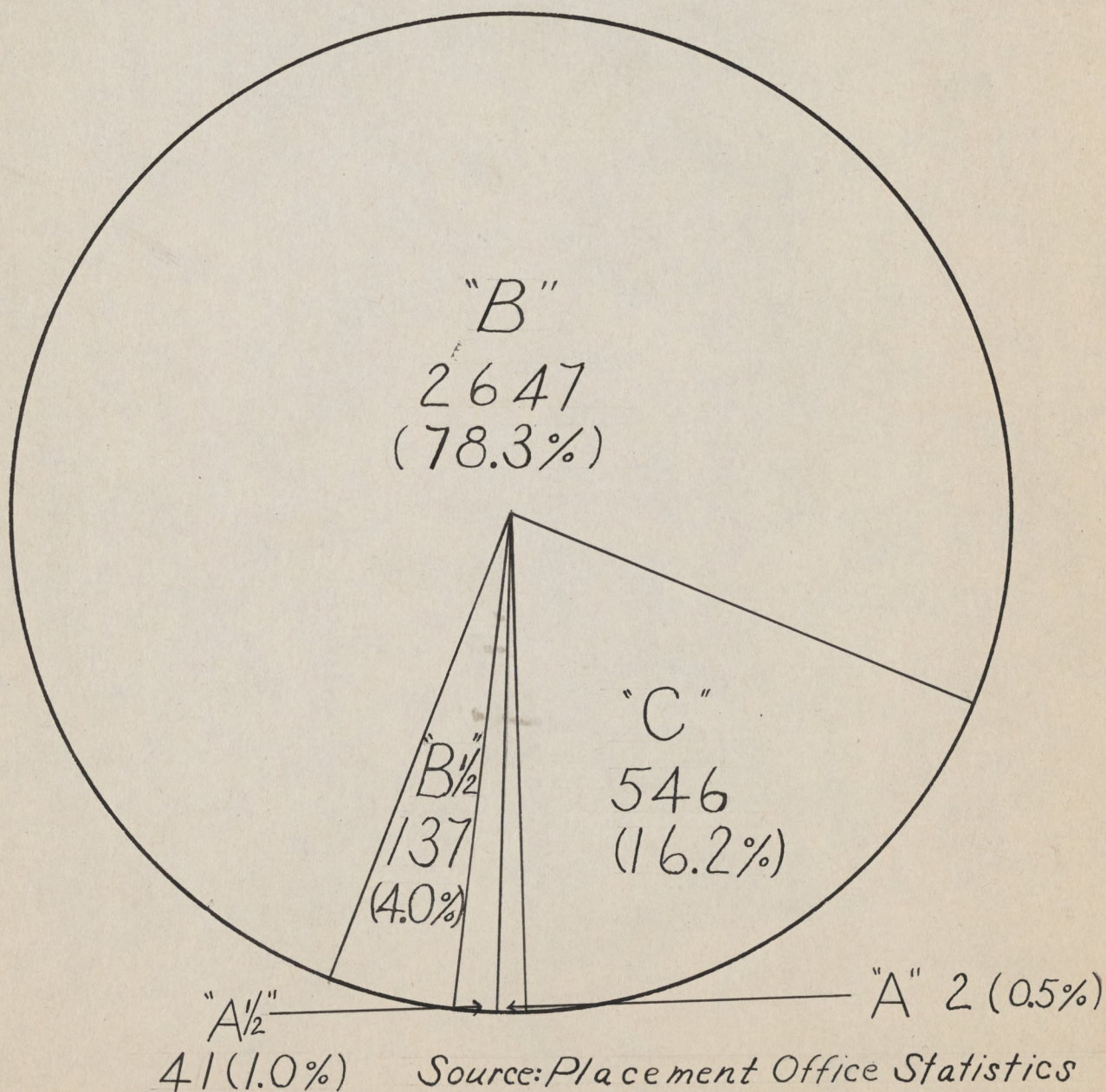

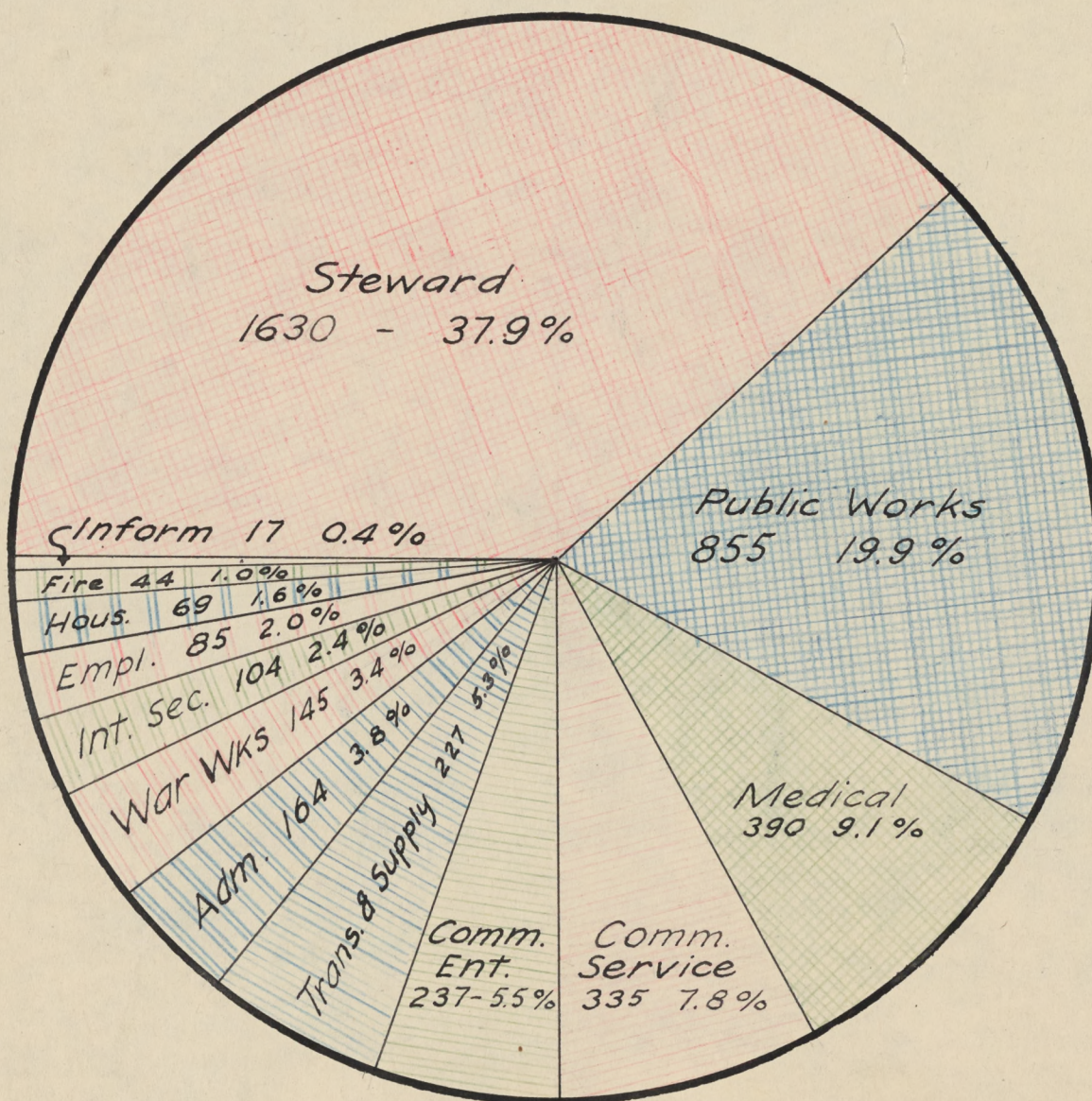

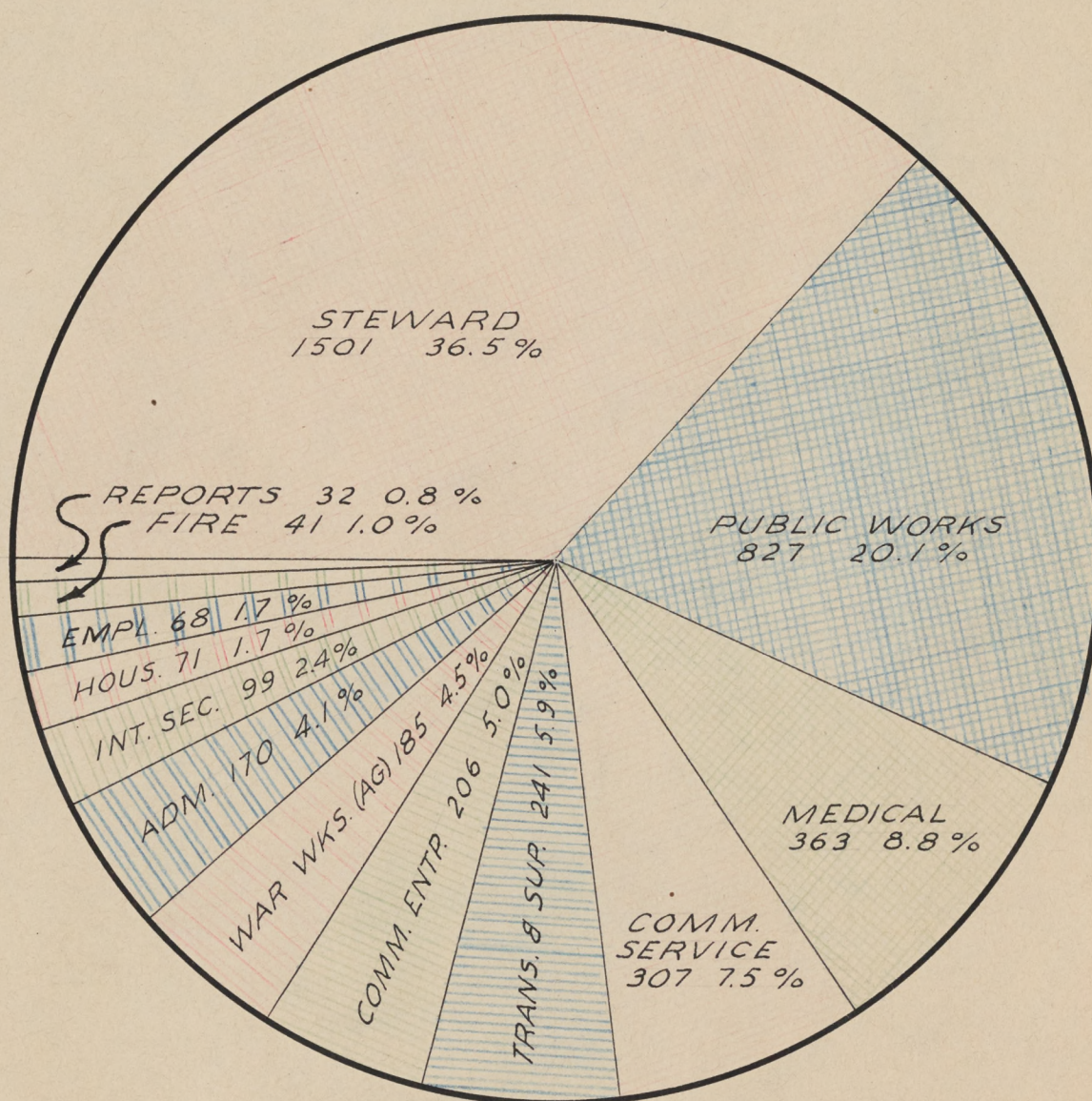

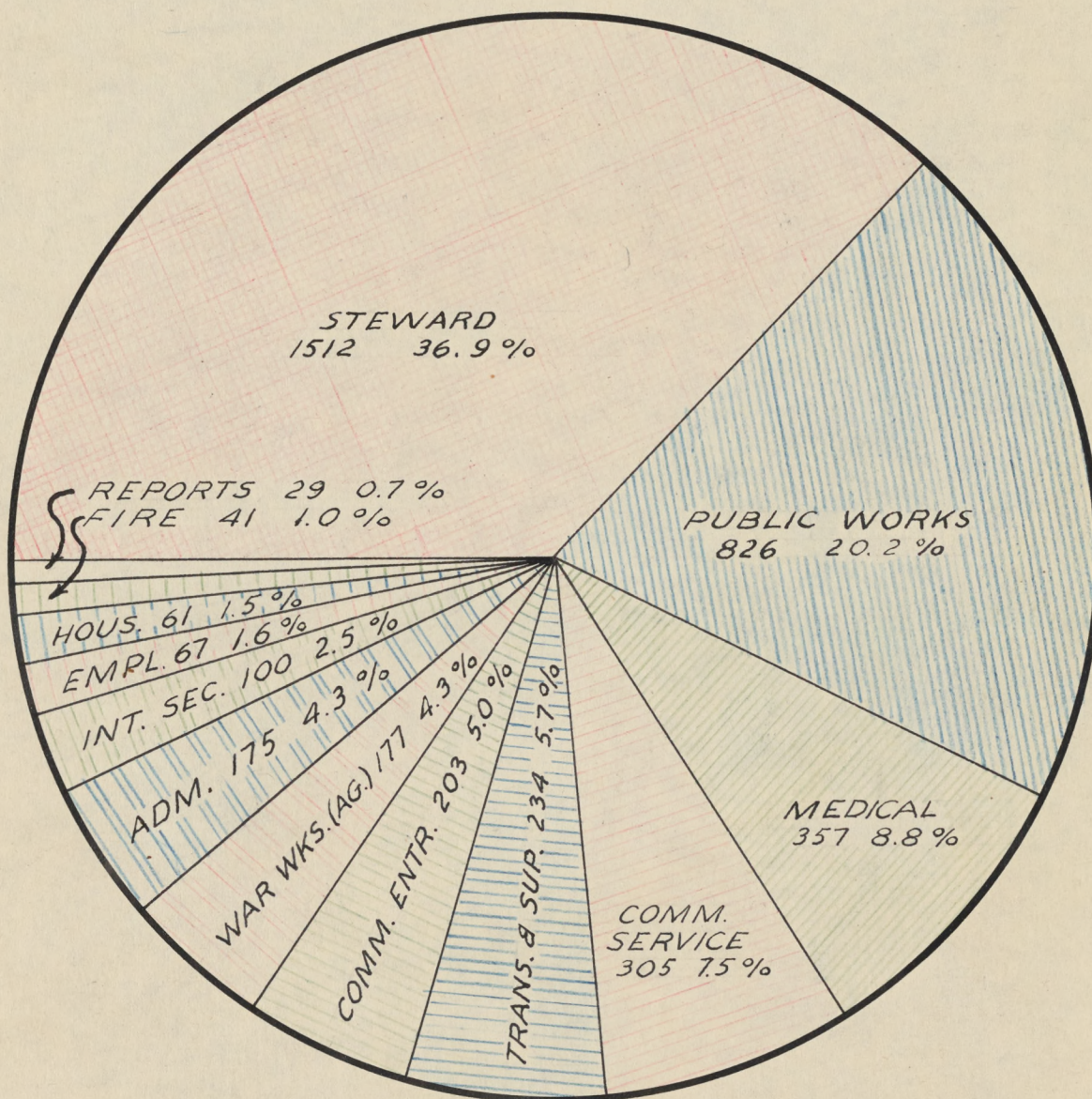

JUNE 30, 1943

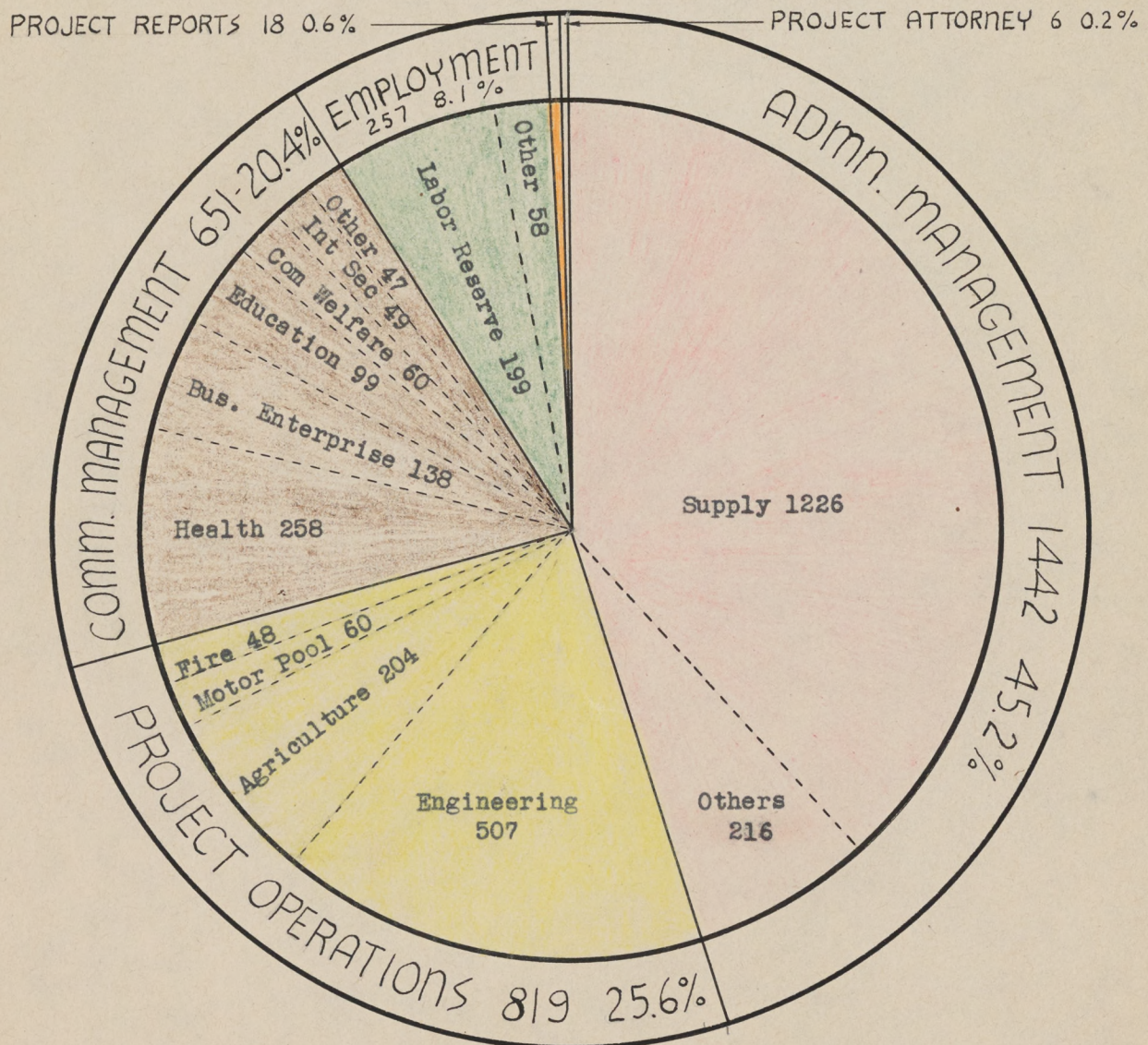

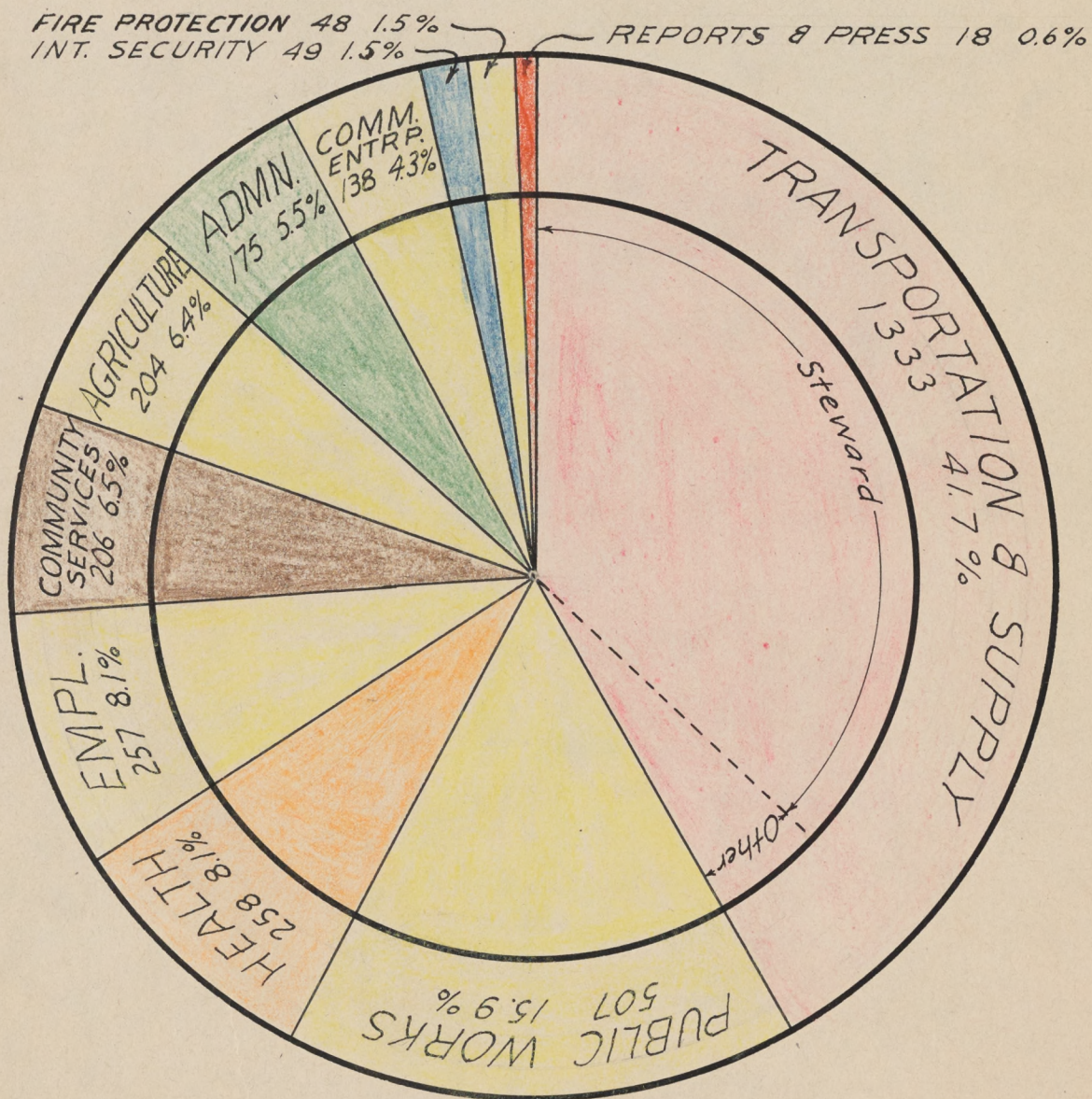

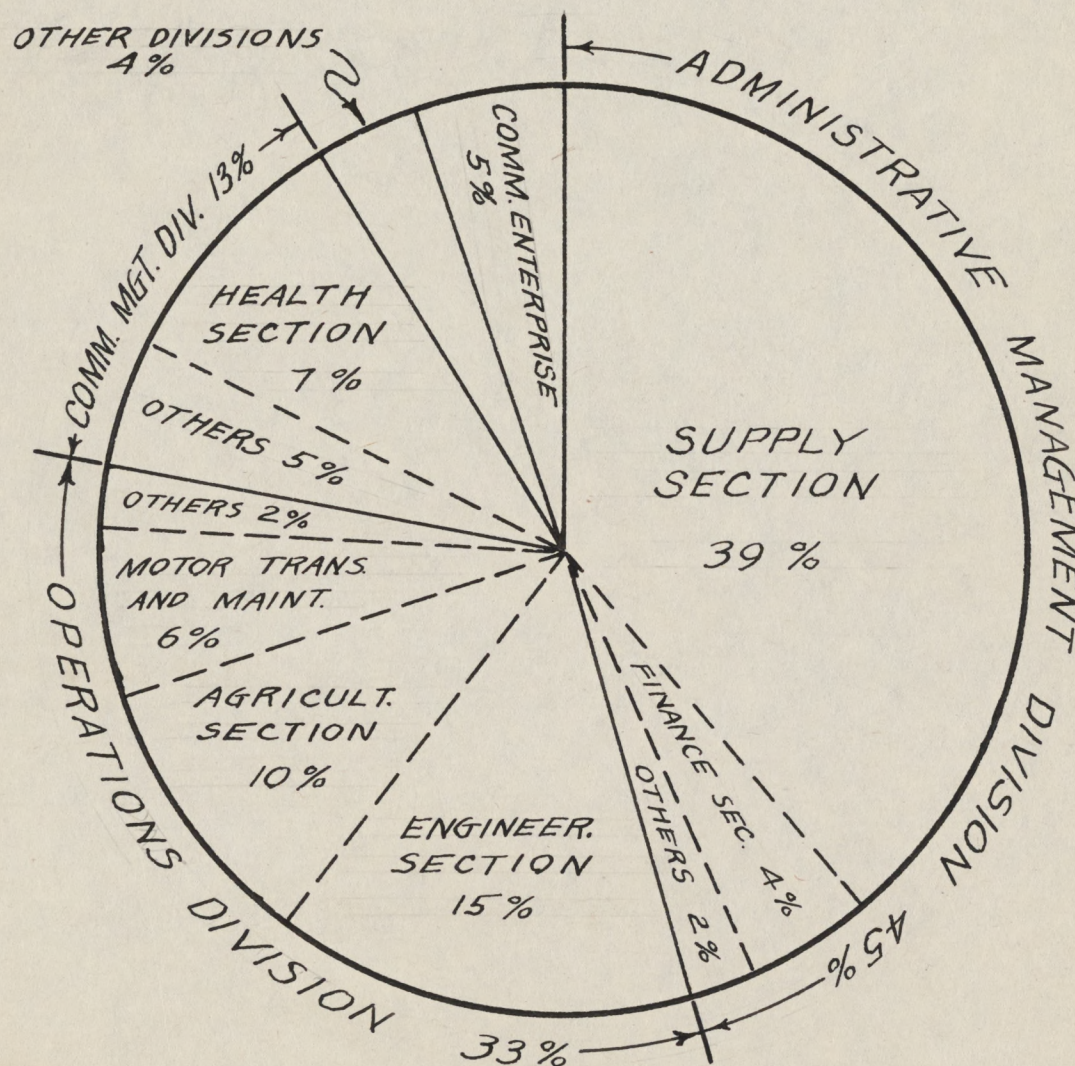

EVACUEE EMPLOYMENT BY DIVISIONS AND SECTIONS Minidoka Project July 31, 1944



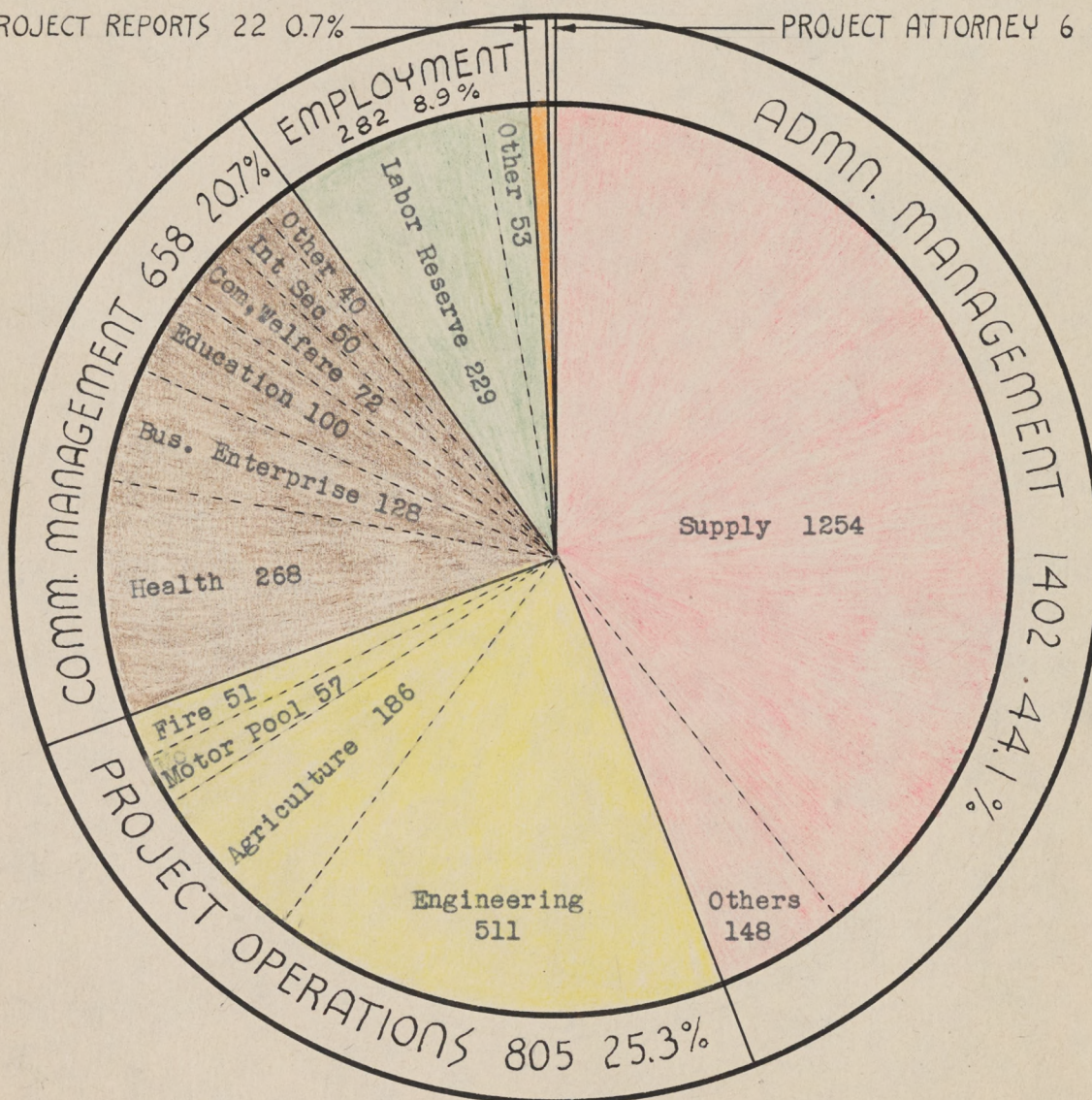

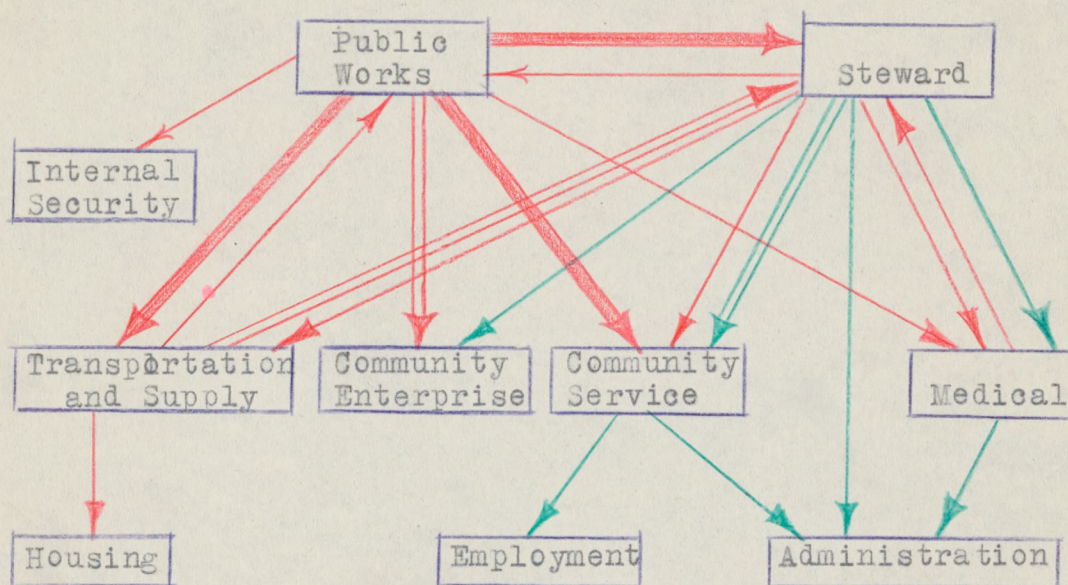
TERMINATIONS BY REASONS MINIDOKA PROJECT JULY 1944










MONTHLY LABOR TURNOVER RATE

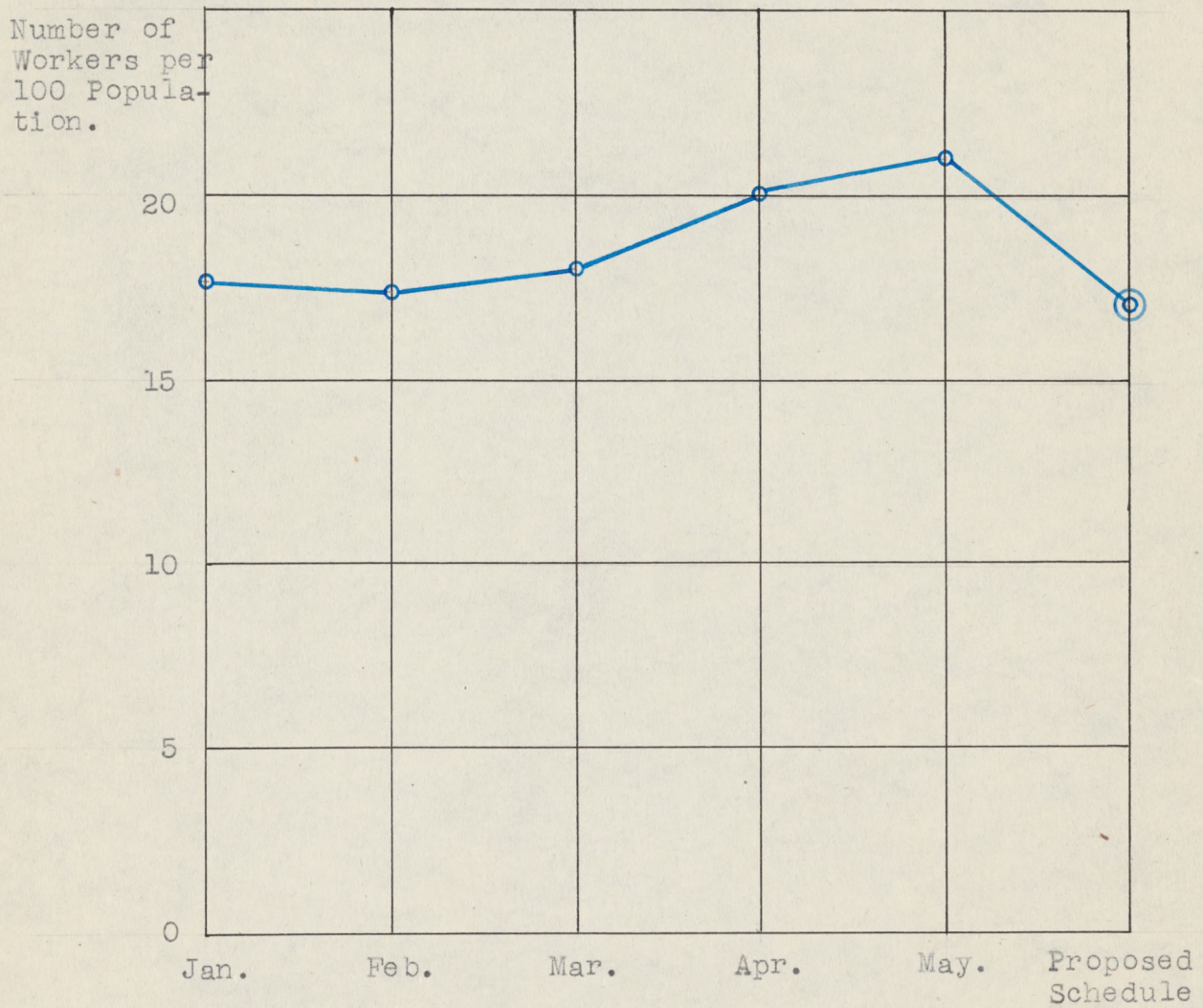
No. of Persons

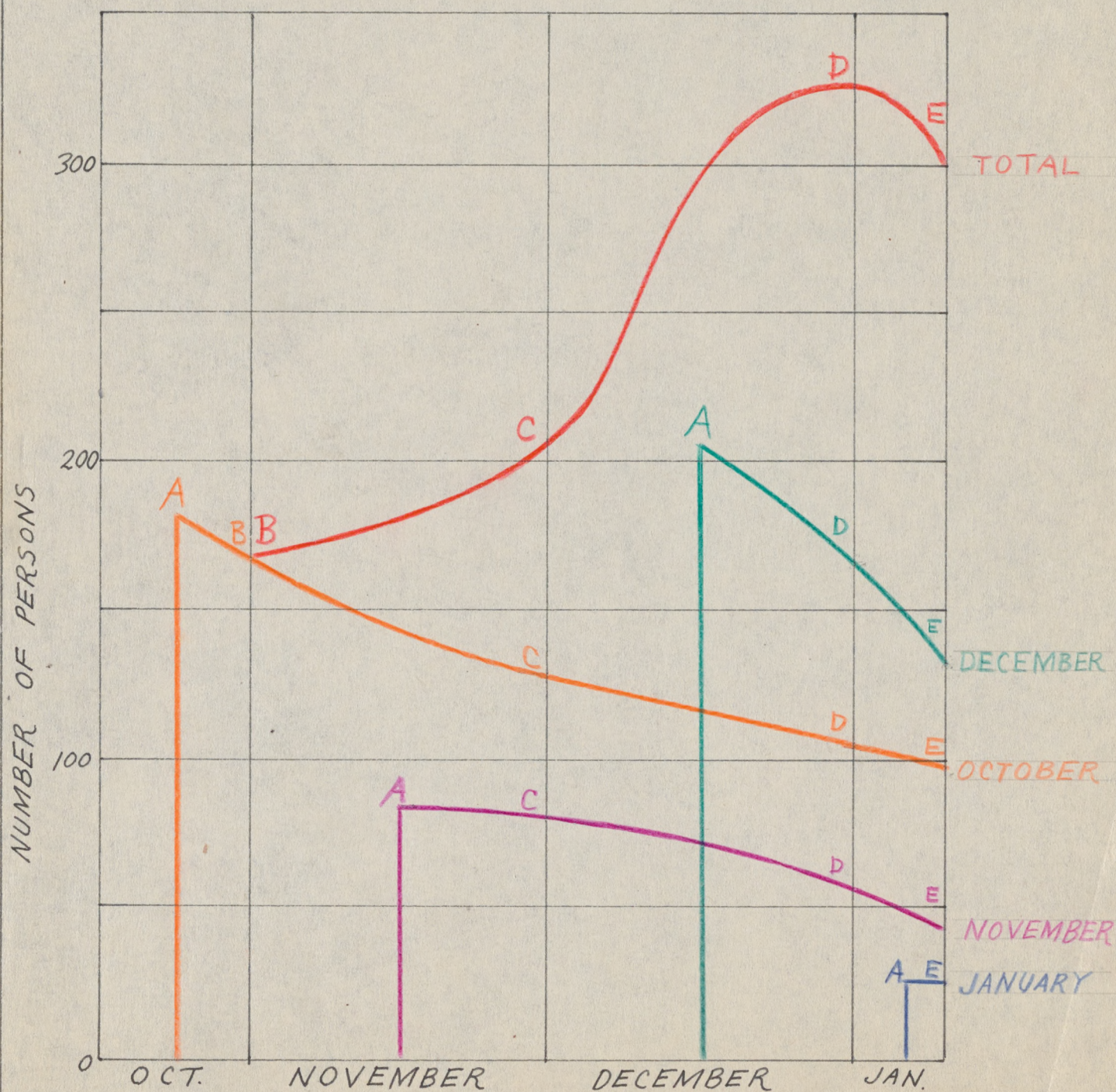

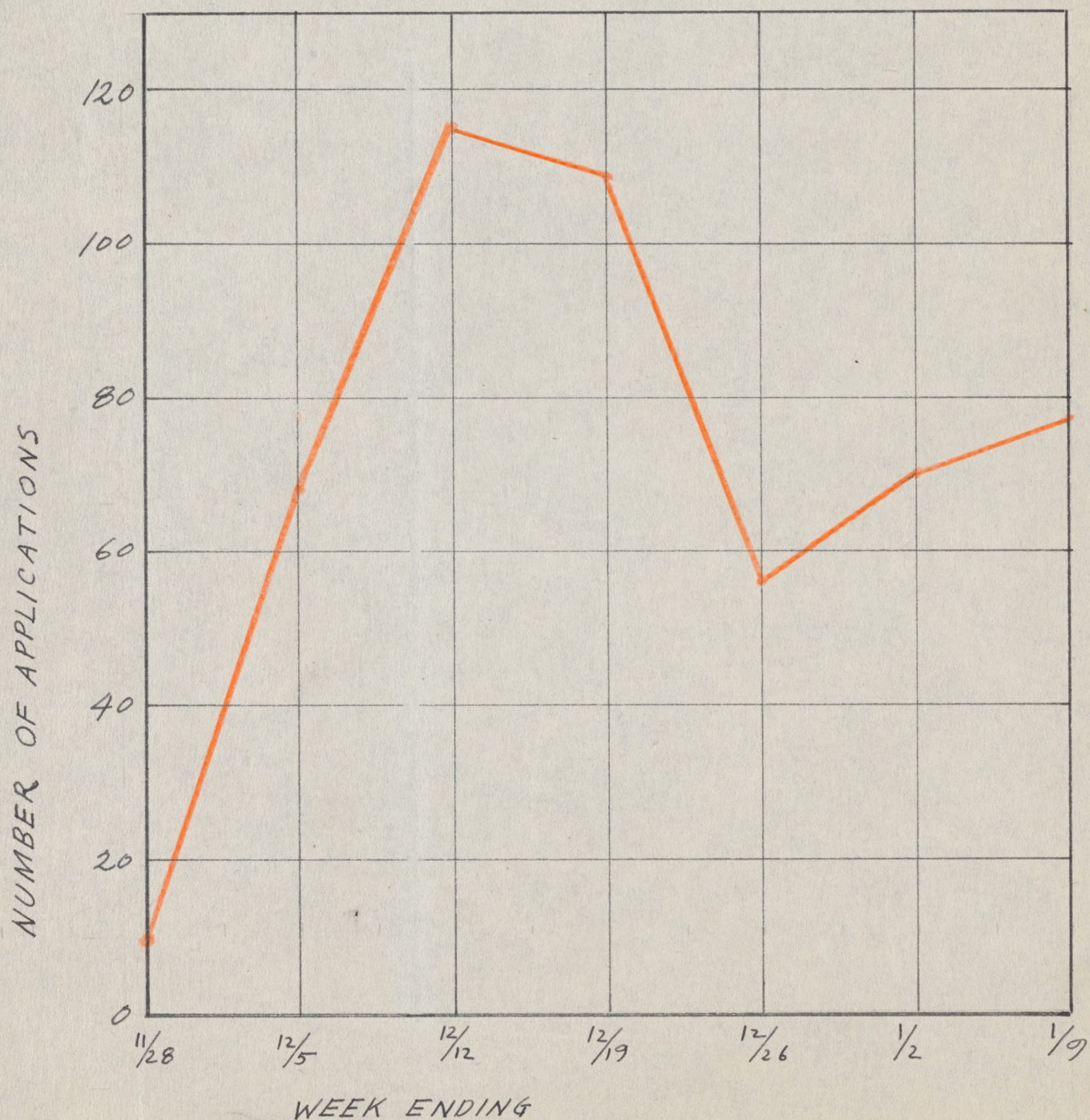

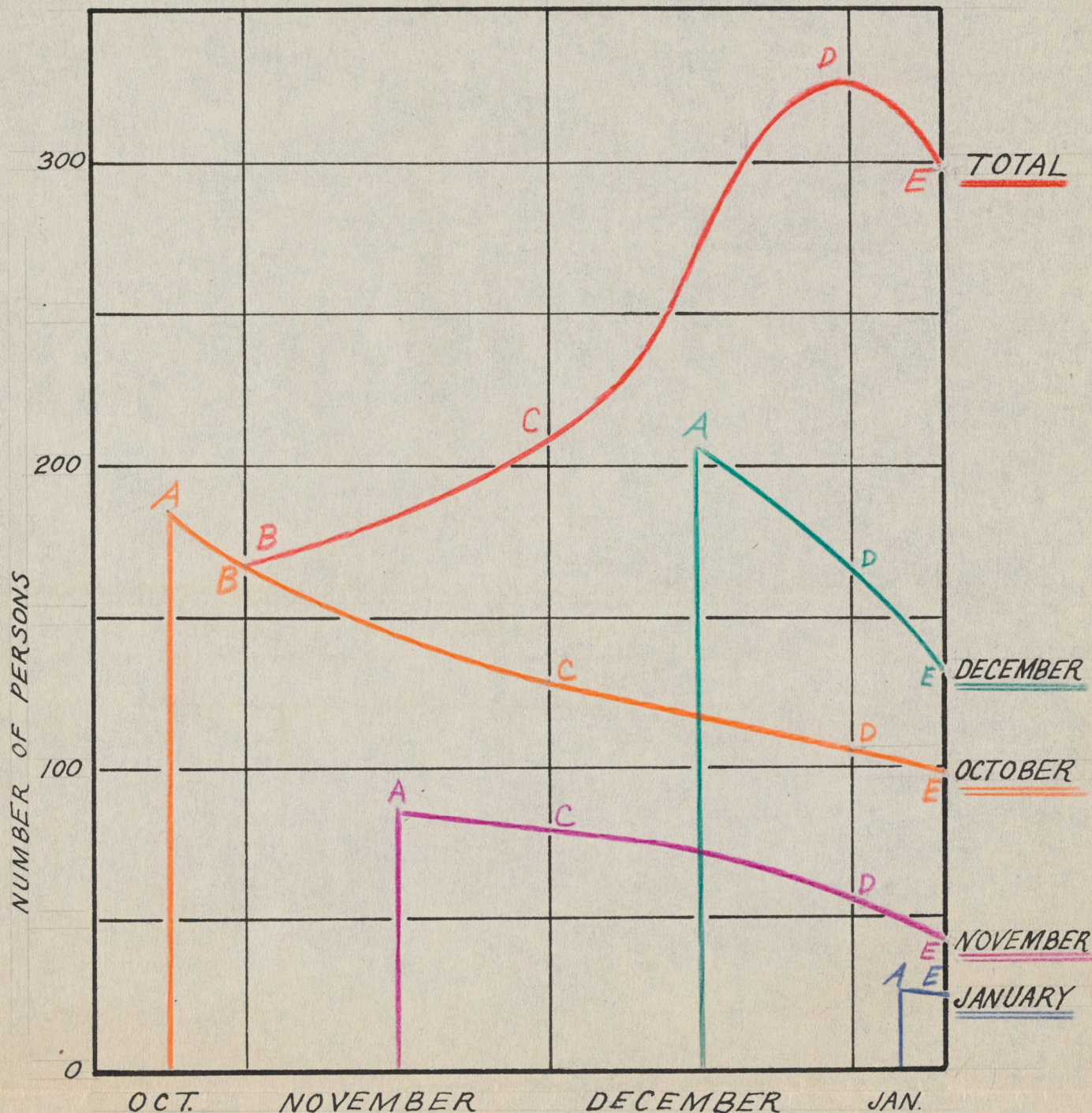

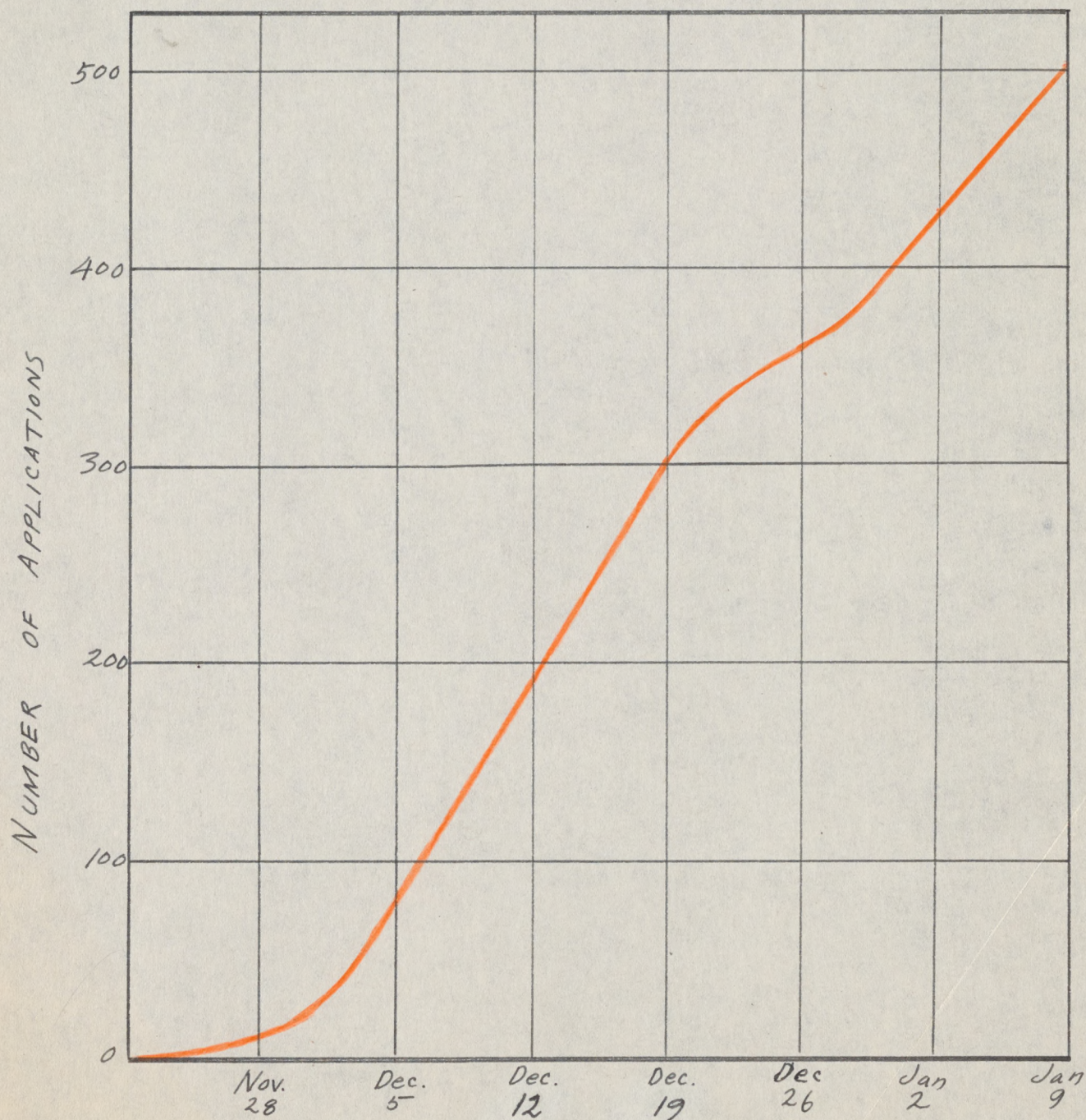

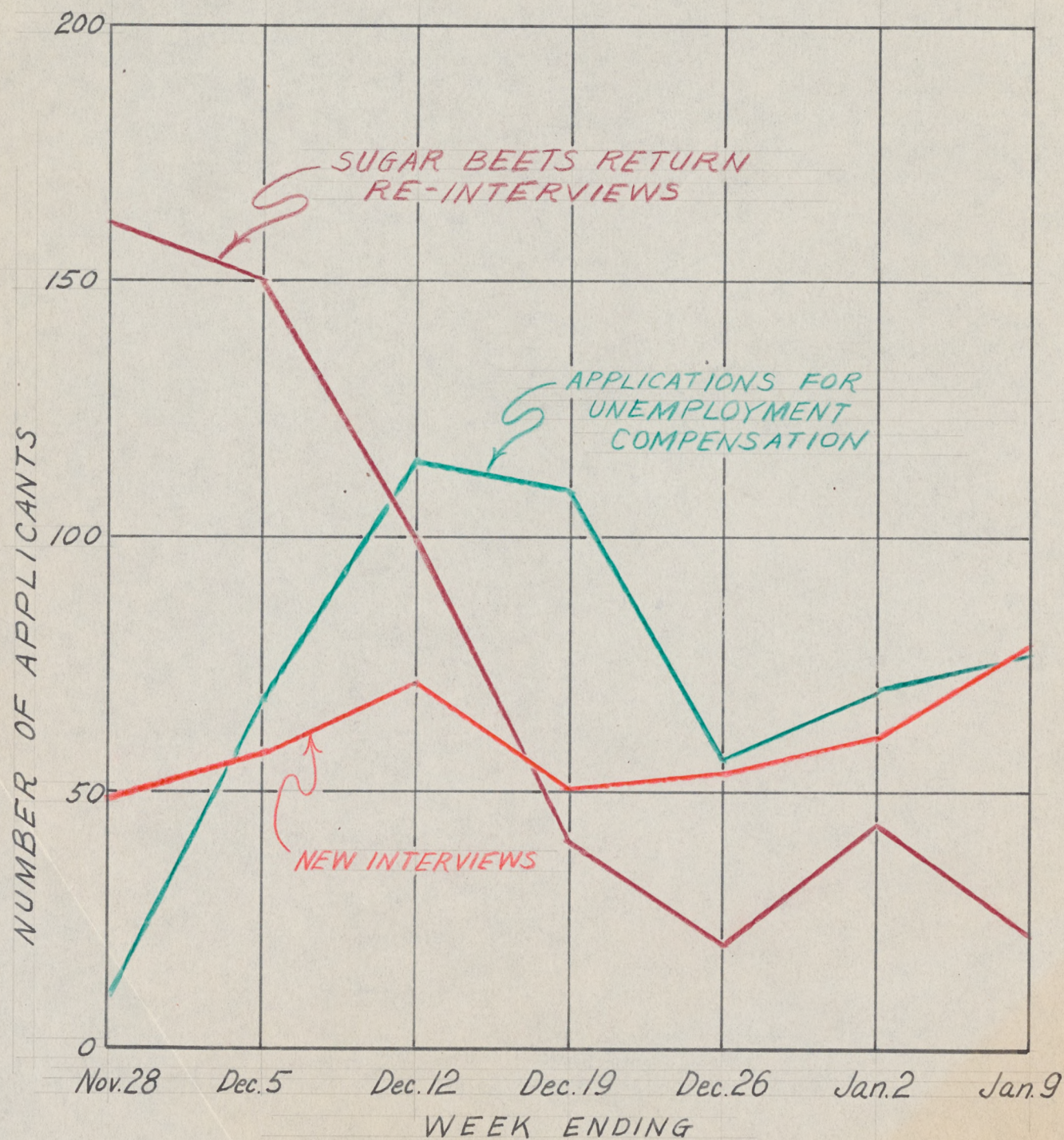
