

This she refuses to do, vowing that she will stay at home and take care of her husband. A few minutes later Ethel Hopper, the Judge's secretary, enters and tells Judge Taggert that Jim, The Dandy, a notorious criminal whom he has sentenced to life imprisonment, has escaped jail and has vowed to have vengeance upon the Judge. The latter is beside himself with fear. Ethel suggests that he go away for a few days to a remote place where he can hide and that while he is gone she will spread the news of his death. In that way the criminal will be thrown off the track and will see the futility of seeking vengeance of a dead man. Judge Taggert departs and before Ethel can acquaint his wife with the real reason for his hasty exit, Earnest Taggert, the Judge's twin brother, appears upon the scene. He has come to visit his brother. Can't you just see everybody mistaking Earnest for his twin brother Elmo and the ludicrous situations that accrue? While he is there his sweetheart comes seeking him and unfortunately falls into the mistaken Judge's arms. Jim, The Dandy adds a laugh or two when he comes seeking the Judge for a surprising reason.

The "Messiah", composed by George Frederick Handel in 1741, is an oratorio of the most exquisite beauty. Handel was "inspired by the Bible prophesies of the coming of Jesus Christ who was to become the Messiah or "Anointed One".

The nation of the Israelites had looked forward to the fulfillment of this promise since God had given it to them, first through Moses and later through Isaiah and other prophets. The spiritual darkness that had overshadowed mankind from the time that sin and death had entered the world through the disobedience of Adam and Eve in the Garden of Eden, was to be dissolved by the coming of Christ, the "Light", into this world as a little child born of a Virgin. He was to be called Immanuel, meaning "God with Us".

Jesus' birth was heralded by angels which appeared to shepherds on the hills of Judea proclaiming the good tidings and saying, "Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace, good will toward men". He fulfilled the prophesy of centuries before as He lived among men and brought rest unto their souls,

and as He established His kingdom in the hearts of men.

The great climax of the oratio is the Hallelujah Chorus in which Jesus is proclaimed as the "King of Kings and Lord of Lords." The present day custom among audiences everywhere of standing during the performance of this chorus dates from the opening performance at which time the king of England was in attendance. He and others in the audience were deeply affected by the music in general. But when the notes of the great Hallelujah Chorus were struck, they arose spontaneously and stood to the end.



On the Deck of H.M.S. PINAFORE, the gallant crew, being rather pleased with itself, expresses this professional pride in the stirring strains

of WE SAIL THE OCEAN BLUE.
They are engaged in their
honest toil when of a sudden
Little Buttercup, the rosiest,
the roundest, and the reddest
of bumboat-women, comes aboard
to sell them ribbons and laces
for their sweethearts. She
points out that although I'm
CALLED LITTLE BUTTERCUP, and
in spite of her jolly appear-
ance, a mysterious secret
weighs heavy on her heart.
Ralph Rackstraw who though
a simple sailor, lowly born,
is yet the smartest lad in
all the fleet, comes up the
hatchway and confides to the
entire crew that he is in
love with a MAIDEN FAIR TO
SEE--who is, unfortunately,
the Captain's daughter.
A villainous sailor, Dick
Deadeye, dares to say

that captain's daughters are not in the habit of marrying humble seamen. He is roundly scolded by the sailors for this heresy, and saved from physical harm only by the entrance of an officer who makes it clear that I AM THE CAPTAIN OF THE PINAFORE.

Left alone with Little Buttercup, the Captain admits that he is worried because his daughter, Josephine, refuses to marry Sir Joseph Porter, K.C.B., First Lord of the Admiralty. Buttercup leaves and Josephine enters, mumbling sadly, SORRY HER LOT WHO LOVES too well. She tells her father that, while she esteems Sir Joseph, she loves a humble sailor aboard the PINAFORE. But after hearing her father's kindly but (class-conscious) arguments, she agrees to think

no more of one so far beneath her and to listen to the declarations of Sir Joseph, who is at this moment approaching on his barge, accompanied as always by his retinue of admiring sisters and cousins and aunts, led by Cousin Hebe.

The sailors huzzah, and the female relations twitter, while Sir Joseph, a dapper though elderly gentleman, announces that I AM THE MONARCH OF THE SEA and proceeds to tell how he attained this high station, outlining what happened WHEN I WAS A LAD. He admonished the Captain never to look down upon sailors, since they are as good as any one else, except, of course, Sir Joseph himself.

When the Captain and his exalted guest go below, Ralph

Rackstraw confesses his love to Josephine. Although she returns this happy passion, she pretends pride (not sarditorial interest) when ordering him to REFRAIN, AUDACIOUS TAR, your suit from pressing. But then Ralph takes matters (and also a pistol) into his own hands and threatens to shoot himself. Naturally this makes Josephine confess her love and they plan to elope--which delights all the sailors, except Dick Deadeye.

ACT II

Night has fallen, and the Captain paces the deck, audibly brooding over his sorrows (and also giving a pretty good synopsis of Act I as he does so). Little Buttercup comes and gazes at him sentimentally.

It develops that the Captain secretly loves Little Buttercup but, as he tells her, because of their difference in social standing, they can never be more than friends. Little Buttercup warns him not to be too sure, since THINGS ARE SELDOM WHAT THEY SEEM. Enter Sir Joseph with Josephine, to whom he offers his heart and exalted rank. Under the impression that her unresponsiveness is caused by his high station, Sir Joseph suggests she should NEVER MIND THE WAY AND WHEREFORE. This plea is only too effective, since Sir Joseph's democratic sentiments strengthen Josephine's determination to elope with Ralph Rackstraw.

But that villainous betrayer, Dick Deadeye, furtively whis-

pering KIND CAPTAIN, I'VE
IMPORTANT INFORMATION, tells
his master about the merry
maiden and the tar. His
paternal and social instincts
outraged, the Captain hides
as the elopement party comes
in, CAREFULLY ON TIPTOE STEAL-
ING. At the crucial moment he
leaps forward and forbids them
to proceed. Then Sir Joseph's
romantic female relations and
the equally romantic sailors
tell the Captain not to scorn
Ralph Ractstraw--HE IS AN
ENGLISHMAN.

To everyone's horror, in-
cluding his own, the Captain
is so furious that he allows
himself to say "Damme!" Sir
Joseph immediately comes aboard
and berates him for swearing
at a British sailor. Neverthe-
less, Sir Joseph's own fury on
learning of the elopement is

awful to behold. He inquires as to whether there is such a thing as a dungeon on board and, on finding that there is, orders Ralph to be dragged off to it in chains. The lovers make ready to part in the tearful strains of FAREWELL, MY OWN.




