A G R E E M E N T

WHEREAS, Officers of the United States Government have announced that, due to the necessities of the present war, all persons of Japanese decent now living in the vicinity of Cortez, Cressey and Livingston, in Merced County, California, would be asked to leave their homes in the near future,

Therefore it has become necessary for said persons to make provision for the preservation, care, farming and management of any property, whether real or personal, which they or any of them may own or control, which is located in said county.

For this purpose persons of Japanese descent living in the vicinity of Cortez, Cressey and Livingston, in Merced County, have executed separate and general powers of attorney to the undersigned who are hereinafter referred to as the trustees.

In order that the property owned by the individuals who have executed these powers of attorney may be properly preserved, cared for, farmed and managed, it is necessary that the trustees employ a person skilled in the farming and management of agricultural land in Merced County. This person shall be referred to hereinafter as the operator.

The trustees hereby employ G. A. Momberg as operator, and G. A. Momberg hereby accepts such employment for the term of this agreement, provided however, that the respective rights, duties and compensation of each shall be as set out below.

The trustees hereby agree that it shall be the duty of the operator, and the sole right of the operator, to manage, control, care for, preserve and cause to be farmed any real property, and to care for and preserve any personal property belonging to any person who has executed any such power of attorney to

any one of the above named trustees, if such property be located in Merced County. The operator agrees that he will, to the best of his ability, and with reasonable diligence, do all the things last mentioned and cause all of said land to be farmed in a farmer-like manner, according to the practices of good farmers farming in the vicinity of said land. Acts of God and circumstances beyond the control of the operator, however, shall be proper excuse for the non-performance of this agreement by the operator.

Without limiting the generality of the foregoing language, the operator is specifically granted the power to borrow money necessary for the farming of said land, to mortgage any crop growing on any of said land as security for the repayment of the money so borrowed, to hire and discharge such employees as he shall deem best and to pay their wages when due, to purchase necessary personal property, to sell all crops produced on said land and collect the money for the same, or to market said crops in any other manner which may be for the best advantage and interest of the owners of said real property, to lease any of said real property and collect the rents for the same, to deposit any moneys he may receive in such banks as he shall desire, and to draw checks in his own name against such account, to pay all obligations incurred from the moneys so received, and to do all things incidental or necessary in carrying out the above powers.

It shall be the duty of the trustees to employ auditors to audit the books of the account to be kept under the direction of the operator, to make necessary inspection to determine whether the operator be complying substantially with the terms of this agreement, and to remove the operator and employ a successor, in the event it should be found he has willfully failed to do so in any material and substantial regard.

The parties to this agreement also understand and agree that on the date of this agreement the owners of the property herein referred to and dealt with, have appointed an advisory board consisting of five members, who are Joe Wolf, Dallas Bache, C. L. Stringer, G. H. Winton, and Claude H. Adams.

If any vacancy should occur, the remaining advisory committeemen shall select a successor. The parties to this agreement agree that at all times said advisory committee shall have the right to inspect the records kept under the direction of the operator and whenever the records shall be audited, a copy of the audit shall be sent to each member of the advisory committee. The trustees must cause said books to be audited at least once each year, as soon after November 30th as is possible. The parties to this agreement agree that they, and each of them, will at all time give the utmost consideration to any recommendation made by the majority vote of said advisory board. If any trustee shall for any reason be unable to perform the duties herein required of him through death or sickness, and in the further event that the owners of property who appointed such trustee in the first place shall have failed to name a successor, in such event the advisory board shall have the power and duty to select a successor to replace such trustee, and he shall have the same powers and duties as his predecessor. The advisory committee shall be entitled to receive from funds in the hands of the operator their actual expenses incurred in the discharge of their duties.

The trustees shall receive reasonable compensation for their services, approved by the advisory board. Each of the trustees shall have one vote in making decisions.

As compensation for his services, the operator shall receive, in addition to the monthly salary hereinafter provided, on December 31st of each year one per cent (1%) of the gross receipts from the income from all of said property, and three per cent (3%) of the net income. Gross income is defined as all income collected by the operator for the use of said property, or from the sale of crops produced upon said property less shipping, packing, loading, transportation and selling costs. Net income is defined as that part of the gross income remaining after deducting all costs of the current year's operation, but not the cost of permanent improvements placed on said properties, fire insurance, interest or principal payments which may now be secured by a lien of any nature on

said property, or by any contract at the date of this agreement or state, county or federal taxes or assessments, but not Merced Irrigation District taxes.

The operator shall also receive on the last day of each month a sum equal to one-twelfth of two dollars per acre for each acre of improved real estate under his control, which shall be planted to crops other than annual crops, ~~one-twelfth of~~ and one dollar per acre for all irrigated land planted to annual crops.

The operator will cause all farming implements to be stored in central locations on said properties, and when used the owner shall be credited with a reasonable sum for the use thereof on the books of record. Insofar as the same is practical, worn out or broken implements shall be saved and returned to the respective owners upon the termination of this agreement.

The term of this agreement shall end upon the next succeeding December 31st, after the owners of said land are permitted by the United States Government to return to said land, but in no event before the 31st day of December, 1943. In the event this agreement should terminate on December, 1943, the operator shall receive the sum of \$5000 only for services to be performed in 1944, but may not be required to perform any services after May 1st 1944. In the event that during the months of January, February, or March of any subsequent year, the land owners shall be permitted to return, then in that event this agreement may be terminated during any of those months, provided that reasonable compensation shall be paid to the operator for services performed during the portion of the year elapsed.

The operator will employ the owners of the respective properties to perform labor upon their respective properties until such time as evacuation shall be ordered by the United States Government, and during the time the owners may be permitted to return prior to the expiration of the agreement. They shall receive credit for such labor on the operator's books at the "usual wage" in such vicinity for similar labor. They shall receive reasonable credit on the books for work already done on said premises for the production of the 1942 crops.

On the books of record of the operator all costs of operation shall be charged to the accounts of the various land owners, insofar as this is practical. All operating costs which cannot be charged directly to the individual owner shall be prorated to the individual owner in the fraction that his total irrigated acreage bears to the total number of irrigated acres farmed by the operator under this agreement. Each individual owner shall receive credit on said books for all income collected by the operator from the use of said property, or from the sale of crops produced on said property.

Out of funds in his hands to the credit of any individual, the operator shall pay and charge to such individual all taxes on such property, fire insurance premiums due and interest and principal payments due on obligations secured by said land, or conditional sales contracts of farm machinery existing on the date of this instrument.

This agreement shall become effective on the date of its execution.

If any dispute should arise between any parties to this agreement or between any party to this agreement and any owner of any of the property above mentioned, or mentioned in said powers of attorney to the trustees, regarding any subject mentioned in the agreement, then each party to such dispute hereby agrees that such dispute shall be arbitrated by the advisory board, and the decision of a majority of them shall be made a judgment of a Court of competent jurisdiction.

Insofar as it is practical, the operator will cause all houses located on any of said farms to be occupied by persons who live in them, and are employed on said farms by the operator.

On November 30th of each year, or as soon thereafter as is possible, each individual owner's account shall be balanced, and a statement prepared, showing the gain or loss to the credit of such individual during the preceeding year. If possible, a copy of such statement shall be mailed to such owner.

It is understood and agreed that minor changes in this agreement may

become necessary in order to negotiate necessary loans of money or to do other necessary things at times when it may not be practical to consult the owners. On such event this agreement may be modified in such minor regards without the consent of any landowner and the validity of this agreement shall not be affected.

The trustees and each of them agree that they will not sell or convey any real property, but in the event any landowner shall desire to convey his property at any time, he shall have the right to do so, provided however if the land be sold by the operator he shall receive five per cent (5%) of the sale price and if it be sold by any other person, the operator shall receive two and half percent ($2\frac{1}{2}\%$) of the sale price. A deed executing such a conveyance may for the convenience of the owner and by his direction, be signed by the trustee holding such power of attorney.

"vacuation of the Japanese in Merced

1. Civil control station: Auditorium of the Veterans' Memorial Building downtown Merced. Six social workers collected the social registration data. Provost Marshall represented by a 2nd Lt., who seems quite lenient and understanding of the problems arising. The Manager served as a general information clerk. U.S. Health Service represented by a local Doctor and a nurse, both very capable from what I hear. Fed. Reserve Bank represented by Mr. Atkins who took care of personal property and bought rice for the govt. from the Japanese farmers. Farm Security with a staff of six took care of all farm transactions using the local FSA registration cards as a basis of determining what transactions were transpiring and what were completed. A capable and intelligent crew of workers. The Assistance Supervisor handled time of departure, transportation problems and other last questions. The Control Desk, as usual, handled the records and appointments, also with a staff of four typists.

2. Japanese at Stations: The very usual: somewhat confused, younger group smiling and cooperating with the authorities, the older group for the most part sober but extremely cooperative.

3. Departure: I was able to see but the first group leave on Sunday morning. This group consisted of professionals who were being taken to the Center to learn their duties before the arrival of the larger group. Departure was by bus. The girls leaving were dressed for Sunday--suits, hats, white shoes, gloves etc. The boys were for the most part dressed for farm work--which after seeing the Center to which they are going seems the wise thing.

Reception Center at Merced

The Center is the old County Fair ground on the outskirts of the city. It is reached by a small dirt road. At the gate is a guard who stops each person for a pass. Within that gate are the permanent fair buildings in which the army and staff are quartered. Further down the road is a second gate. Within this area are about eight large store houses for food, equipment etc. There is also a fire dept. as yet without a fire truck. At the next gate is a tall lookout with a soldier stationed on top. Written in large letters on all of these lookout posts (I saw four of them) are the words "Fire Lookout". I asked the Manager, Mr. Miller, who was showing us through the place the reason for the label. He said it had been Gen. DeWitt's orders, so that people coming in would not take the guards to be concentration camp guards. As you go in the third gate the wards start. On one side of the dirt, rough road are Wards A and B with about 20 or more units (houses) apiece. On the other side are Wards C and D with other Wards and the hospital behind these Wards. We went into Ward B. Mr. Miller explained that the Center could hold 5000 and the whole thing was built in 11 days (and it looked it). We first went into the Mess Hall for Ward B (each ward has its own kitchen and dining room). The kitchen consisted of huge refrigerators, four huge coal burning stoves (coal was laying on the ground at the side of the mess hall). We passed from the kitchen into the dining room. There is an open topped wall between the two so that it is possible to see a person cooking in the kitchen from the dining room. The dining room had two rows of plank topped tables with benches on both sides. On each table was chinaware (white crockery) for the no. to be seated at that table. I asked the Manager why the WCCA requested the J. to bring their own eating equipment when they furnished it here. He said it was just a mixup and that they couldn't possibly use individual ware since they would have to replace broken, keep it straight etc. The dining room had screen doors and screens on all of the windows.

The buildings on the outside were squat, tar-papared and tough wood.

We then went to the shower room (men and women have separate ones in each ward but they are both alike). The floor is concrete (slightly mud packed) and the place is divided into two rooms. One is plain with benches built around the walls and hooks for clothes above. The shower room proper is four rows of six showers--very close together and absolutely no division between them---just one large room ~~is~~ with shower sprinklers overhead. The floor concrete, but mud packed.

Then we inspected the Toilets. The men and women each have a separate one. I only saw the womens but Mr. Møller said there were 3 laterines for men. The womens was a longish building with on one side of the room a continuous row of benches with seats carved in them about a foot apart---very rough wood. There is a cover for each individual seat. It looks like a privy but there is a flush system. We were showed how it works. Automatically about every 20 minutes a pump supplies water which flushes all ~~off~~ the individual toilets out at once into a sewer. On the other side of the room are three tin, very narrow wash basins (They are long but not over one foot wide).

We then went to the public wash buldings. This was equipped with about tem large double sided tubs (the regular kind found in apartments) Plugs were going to be put into the walls next to each tub and an ironing board is also going to be build into each wall space beside each tub, so that washing and ironing may be done in the same room.

We were told then about the houses. There are two types of apartments in each of the little buildings---a room for four and a room for six. If there are less than four in the family another person or persons will share the apartment with that family. Two couples of two will be put into one room. We went first into a six person apartment. The door is wood with no screen, on it is printed the Ward, street and apartment no. (Streets are numbered 1, 2 etc.) In the apartment the floors are again concrete--very roughly done(not smoothed out) and mud packed (very dirty so that if one swept, the dust would be terrible since the whole floor is caked with dried mud) There are six windows (rather square, small but Housing regulation windows). The only thing in the room are six cots (singles) with good mattresses. There is no other furniture. I was told they could build what they wanted and with what lumber there was left. In each unit are about six to eight apartments (depending on whether they are fours or sixes) There is only a partition between each one--the top is not closed in so there is about four feet on top where the light from one room shows into the next. The manager admitted that this was unfortunate and said he would like to seem them boarded up but it would have taken too much time and lumber. The four ~~room~~ person room is just the same but has five windows and is smaller. The floor space per person fits Federal Housing Regulations. The electric light hangs down from the center of the room.

The Manager was holding a meeting with 16 Japanese professionals who had already arrived so he could not show us any more. There is no recreation hall or rooms yet, although one will be built. Meanwhile the Army quarters will be used for meetings and so on.

Said payment does not equal value of boxes or crates and payment of same does not pass title to boxes or crates. 8. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in this contract contained, in the event that any license or other governmental act or order be issued, done or made by any state or federal governmental authority, or should any agreement be made to which any state or federal governmental authority is a party and to which Seller may or may not be a party, but delivery of crops hereunder are affected thereby, or any industry agreement be made, or any of which pertains to the crop of which the product sold hereunder is a part, any provision contained in such licensed act, order or agreement which affects the Seller's operations by restricting, specifying or defining the product which seller may deliver, this contract shall be deemed modified in accordance thereof.

9. In the event the Buyer is to pick crops, Buyer agrees to pay Seller for any damages to trees, vines and any property on the realty caused by or done by the Buyer, or his agents or employees.

10. Buyer is an independent contractor hereunder, and agrees to carry workmen's compensation insurance for all labor employed by him and shall abide by all the labor laws of the State.

11. In the event the purchase price is not paid in full, Buyer shall carry cargo insurance on all crops taken from the property while in transit, for the benefit of Seller and Buyer as their interests may appear.

12. In the event any of said crops purchased hereunder are left on the property before Seller is paid in full, Buyer agrees to insure the same against loss by fire and/or theft for the benefit of Seller and Buyer as their interests may appear.

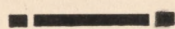
