Attached we are submitting a supplement WPB 617 for Serial No. 113340. As the additional lumber required for this project is now restricted by the Construction Limitations, we are requesting a waiver for its use. The original plan was to use scrap lumber for fencing but in view of the recent restrictions it has been determined that this scrap lumber should be laid aside for other uses and woven wire used in its place. This scrap lumber is not suitable for any building purpose other than repair work so it cannot be used to replace the lumber for which a waiver has been requested.

Question No.

- A. 1. The hog project was designed to provide a maximum of food, at a minimum of expense, for residents of the center. Feed for the hogs is obtained from garbage collected at the mess halls and supplement feed will be supplied from the farm, which is in operation adjacent to the center.
2. a. The War Relocation Authority was established by the Executive Office of the President of the United States under Executive Order, No. 9066, dated February 19, 1942, for the removal from designated areas of persons whose removal was necessary in the interest of national security.
- b. This project should not be deferred for the duration of the war, because the food produced, as a result of the successful completion of this project, will greatly assist in feeding the residents of the center.
- B. 1. War Production Board, Washington, D. C.
2. Approved October 20, 1943, Serial No. 113340.
- C. 1. There is no deviation in the construction as originally approved, but some change in the location of the original sleeping shed, hog pens, and the addition of five 8' x 16' feed storage houses is required. As requested on the original application the sleeping shed was to be constructed as one continuous unit, 12 x 400 feet. The Fire Protection Officer recommended that four separate units, 12 x 100 feet be built instead, with sufficient space between buildings, to prevent fire from destroying the entire unit. Exhibit A.

This change requires an additional 600 board feet of construction lumber to build three end walls of these buildings, 300 board feet of framing lumber and 300 board feet of sheathing lumber.

A large number of the removable panels together with some makeshift material are being used on feeding pens at this time. Considerable trouble is encountered in the hogs breaking through this material and it is proposed to use hog wire instead. An additional amount of 260 rods of Standard Design 726 hog wire will be required, releasing the removable panels to be used elsewhere for smaller hogs.

The concrete slab in front of concrete feeder troughs now only four feet wide is inadequate for feeding purposes and creates a very unsanitary condition so an additional 6 feet in width is proposed, requiring 56 cubic yards of concrete. Five new feed storage houses, 8' x 16', are required for the storing of ground feed on the lot, and to protect

feed from storms and mice. Only a minimum of framing material has been figured with fibre board for sheeting. Exhibit B. The feed storage houses will require 2175 board feet of framing lumber, 750 board feet of flooring, 2340 square feet of asphalt treated fibre board sheeting, 10 squares of roofing paper, hinges, nails and roofing asphalt.

In the application for the original project an error in the estimate for building material was made, item No. 97, construction lumber 2" thick and under, listed 67,750 board feet, but should have been 105,465 board feet.

This is an increase of 37,715 board feet and is to be used to complete 19-A type farrowing houses and 20 double shed type multiple use houses.

All this material is on hand, and may be transferred from the cancelled portion of W.F.B. approval Serial No. 35973.

2. This project application requests permission to use framing and sheeting lumber which is on hand, to complete the project as originally planned, together with the addition of five feed storage houses and 56 cubic yards of additional concrete slab in the feed lot.

a. See Exhibit A and B.

b. The structures are of one story frame construction with wood sheeting except portable feed storage houses, which will be fibre board sheeted.

c. Wood frame.

- D. 1. A waiver is requested for permission to use framing and sheeting lumber.

2. a. 300 board feet 2" x 4" framing and walls of sleeping sheds.

b. 300 board feet 1" sheeting and walls of sleeping sheds.

c. 4845 board feet 2" x 4" framing Type A Farrowing houses.

d. 4750 board feet 1" sheeting Type A Farrowing houses.

e. 15,640 board feet 2" x 4" framing double shed type multiple use houses.

f. 12,480 board feet 1" sheeting double shed type multiple use houses.

g. 2175 board feet 2" x 4" framing feed storage houses.

h. 750 board feet 1" flooring feed storage houses.

3. This material will be used to frame (1) 3 and walls of sleeping sheds, (2) 19-A type farrowing houses, (3) 20 double shed type multiple use houses, and (4) five portable feed storage houses.

All of the framing and sheeting lumber is necessary for the type of building as described and substitutes cannot be used.

4. The completion of this project is essential to the war, in that it will be possible to produce more food on the center, thereby making it unnecessary to purchase as much on the open market.

The lumber on which a waiver is requested is available from the cancelled portion of WPH Serial No. 35973.

GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS

Attach separate sheets same size as this form and list numerically the answers to applicable questions. Also add continuation sheets as necessary.

WPB-617 is the application form used for most projects. Other types of applications are used for housing (except farm houses, hotels, and the larger apartment houses which use the WPB-617). Other forms are also used for water, gas, steam heating, electric power, telephone and telegraph facilities for use by the public; for petroleum facilities; and for certain other specialized kinds of authorizations which are provided for under blanket orders of the WPB or by special authorization forms. If tax amortization privileges are requested, the application for tax amortization should be filed simultaneously with the WPB-617 application.

The applicant will prepare four copies of this form, retain one and file the original and two copies, with supporting papers, as directed in "Where to File". If the application is accompanied by request for tax amortization, the original and three copies of WPB-617 must be filed. 
FLOOR PLAN
