BULLETIN TO STUDENTS AND TEACHERS - USE OF HIGH SCHOOL KITCHEN
School Year 1944-45

This year the kitchen is a classroom, reserved and equipped for teaching foods to regularly enrolled home economics students. For this reason, its use for the preparation of party refreshments can be granted only under certain conditions; namely:

- (1) Kitchen is not already scheduled for class use; if it is, permission cannot be given.
- (2) Request is properly made. Please notify Mrs. Corkill if plans are changed and function cancelled.
- (3) "Guest group" agrees to observe all the regulations necessary when class room and equipment are borrowed.
- (4) Requesting group have a good past record. Those who do not have can not be given use again.
- (5) There is to be no smoking at school functions.

The following regulations are based on 2½ years experience loaning the kitchen and are made in order to help the "guest group" take good care of borrowed property and save the Home Economics teachers and students as much time and work as possible. Countless hours have been spent in the past cleaning up after "guest groups". It is not possible, nor advisable, to use Home Economics classes to clean up after "guest groups."

I REQUEST

1. Make request at least one week in advance of Mrs. Corkill LEF, using request blank.
2. Get copies of request blank from high school principal's secretary. Fill out carefully and completely in order not to take any more time than necessary when getting request ok'd.
3. Take the copies to Mrs. Corkill before or after school or during periods 1 or 4: do not go during periods 2,3,5,6.
4. Request is to be made jointly by the student general chairman and the refreshment committee chairman.
5. Before making request, be sure to be thoroughly familiar with these regulations. Copies are available from all teachers, the office, Mrs. Corkill.

II COMMITTEES

1. General chairman who:
 - (1) makes initial request
 - (2) is responsible for all other chairmen and committee members knowing the regulations
 - (3) is responsible for all regulations being carried out
 - (4) after the function checks with Mrs. Corkill at a time agreed upon.

2. Refreshment Committee chairman who:
 - (1) accompanies general chairman to make initial request
 - (2) is responsible for kitchen regulations being carried out
 - (3) is responsible for seeing that committee members only are in kitchen
 - (4) checks kitchen portion of check sheet for general chairman
3. Two clean up committees - one for dining hall, one for kitchen. Cleaning of kitchen has been badly neglected probably because one committee has tried to do both dining hall and kitchen. Each chairman shall check his portion of the check sheet for the general chairman.
4. Decoration Committee chairman is responsible for decorations being taken down and properly disposed of and for checking his portion of check sheet for general chairman. Unless previous arrangements have been made to leave decorations for another group, they are to be taken down after the party as part of the general clean up. They are to be properly disposed of.

III. TO BE FURNISHED BY "GUEST GROUP"

Guest groups furnish their own soap, cleaning rags, dish cloths and towels. Satisfactory provision of the latter is necessary in order that dishes can be properly washed and dried. Too often in the past dishes have been put away both dirty and wet.

IV. BREAKAGE AND/OR LOSS

All breakage and /or loss is to be reported and either replaced or paid for.

V. CLEANING IN DINING HALL

1. Table benches should be washed after a party. Food and drink spilled on them means soiled clothes.
2. If benches have been moved outside, they should be examined for protruding nails when brought in again. Recently many benches have shown nails which are hazardous to clothes.
3. Dirt and trash should be taken up in a shovel and burned - not swept outside the door.

VI. KITCHEN

1. Committee members only are to be in kitchen and they are to respect their chairman's suggestions regarding use and care of kitchen.

In order to safeguard against breaking equipment, there shall be no fooling, "rough housing" etc. There must be no throwing of food. After recent parties egg has been found on the newly painted walls; partly eaten sandwiches in the dish cupboards.

- 2. No one, unless asked by a H.E. teacher, is to go in store room.
- 3. H.E. department books, aprons, towels, food etc. necessarily left in the kitchen are not to be used.
- 4. Coat rack is not to be moved but left where it is.
- 5. Electric stoves are not to be used. They must be kept in good condition for class use. Nothing is to be laid on them. No one should touch the switches. After almost every party they have had to be repaired. If this continues, it will be impossible to loan kitchen.
- 6. Light bulbs are not to be removed from socket. After a recent party, there was no lamp in a very newly installed socket.

7. Refrigerator

- (1) Cord should never be removed. During a recent party the cord to one of the refrigerators was pulled completely out of the socket leaving the refrigerator full of school food without any current all night.
- (2) School food left in refrigerator should not be touched.
- (3) If you have been loaned the use of a refrigerator and need to have it colder than 1, be very sure to turn the indicator back to 1 when through.
- (4) No hot food should be put in refrigerator. Either make jello with half cold water or allow it to cool before putting in refrigerator.
- (5) A loaned refrigerator must be cleaned inside and out; also floor around it.

8. Sink

- (1) If scrub water is poured down one of the sinks, sand, dirt, etc. must all be cleaned out.
- (2) Everything put in sink should go through a sink strainer; contents of strainer emptied as often as necessary.
- (3) Fat must not be put in sinks since drainage is very poor and sink becomes clogged up easily. Too, a greasy sink is very hard to clean.
- (4) When all through, clean thoroughly; be sure there are no particles of food in the drain. Pour a pitcher or kettle of hot water down the drain.
- (5) Wooden racks should be brushed clean; then left on end to drain and dry.
- (6) Scrub brushes should be washed in hot suds, rinsed well, put bristles down to drain and dry.

9. Be very careful when working near the towel rods. The dowels used are not heavy enough to stand any pressure.
10. Bread Boards are to be used only when necessary for cutting. They should be clean and dry before being put back in table. Be sure to put back correctly--with finger hold underneath.

Do not, as was done recently, use as a heat screen near the stove. The board so used was badly burned.

11. Knives have recently been sharpened. Use carefully to preserve the sharp edge; also not to cut a finger.
12. Anything spilled should be wiped up immediately. If not, it is usually forgotten and if sticky or greasy collects much dirt. Too, it may cause some one to fall.
13. While working - peelings, leaves, etc. may be put in pails or boxes, but when through, all garbage is to be emptied into the outside garbage cans.
14. Absolutely nothing is to be put in the coal box.
15. All waste paper should be burned.
16. Sort dishes carefully putting all of a kind together. Put back in proper place. Be sure they are clean and dry.
17. Do not stack cups. Many have been broken because they slip off and onto the cement floor.
18. Be sure that all utensils are dry--anything of iron or steel rusts if left wet.
19. Keep cogs of dover egg beaters out of water.
20. All top surfaces--tables, ledges, counter, etc. should be clean and dry.
21. Clean top of army stoves with newspaper.
22. Entire floor must be carefully swept - particularly the toe spaces by counter; under eat walks; then scrubbed clean by using clean water.
23. Brooms are to be hung in broom closet; mops rinsed in clean and hung to dry. Mop pails are to be emptied, rinsed, put in broom closet (small narrow closet near dining room)
24. If permission was given to move anything from dining hall to kitchen, it must be moved back again.
25. Everything not belonging in kitchen such as coke bottles, insignias, etc., must be taken away. Left over food in jars such as salad dressing, pickles, etc. may be left for use by other groups.
26. The grounds outside the building must be left clean--there should be no paper napkins, plates, apple cores, orange peelings, partly eaten sandwiches etc.
