SEIZO FAMILY:

Aug 6-16 is Obon in this Kansai area.

July 13 = Obon around Tokyo

6 - 7: members of temple come for ohaka maeri, have to have water ready. Start coming at 6:00 a.m. and continue till evening. The priest reads sutra at the altar and at the grave, and gives them "na fuda" wooden slats (toba) which they take to put on their own home shrine till next year.
In hot summer, he has to wear robe and wear tabi - tho not too painful for him.
Aug. 7th hottest and busiest day is Oji's birthday.

Aug 13-14: Oji goes from house to house. This is after the spirit's return from the grave. Lotsof food - ohagi, etc. on specific days.

Aug. 15: Real Obon: put hasu no ha at obutsudan with tomato, egg plant, beans, or other summer vegetables. Mukke-bi to call the dead to life. For those who died during last year, a small step ladder to help them climb to obutsudan. Lotsof incense is burned 13th-16th, so the dead can come home on the scent trail. Some temples fly a long white flag to help the dead come back.

Most families belong to some temple. This dates back to the period of the persecution when Xnity was being stamped out of Japan. Priests used to go around and check to see if each family had a butsudun; everyone forced to belong to some temple; therefore, succeeding generations still belong, tho they are not active buddhists.

Oji's main temple (honzan) is Ao no Kyomyoji

If son were to become priest:

1. Must inform main temple. seki wo ireru
2. learn sutras
3. Kegyo: for about 2 weeks stay at honzan, do cleaning, read sutras, listen to lectures; group do this together. Get up at 5:00 a.m. till 10:00 P.
Oji went for his in the dead of winter; pitch black on rising; ice all over; wore one thin white robe, take water from oke, douse from head to foot while reciting the sutra.
4:00 a.m. - sutra and lecture - 10:00 A sutra and lecture, 4:00 P.
Purifying of soul?
4. Kurai: There are 15 grades (levels) to top post. Oji is only 3rd from bottom. Had to take certain teststo reach this level.
Top grade is red robe - head priest
Next ispurple: everyone wants to reach this level.
The way to get up to the15th rank is to give money to the temple; Oji refuses to do this. He is content with hisown rank; why struggle - he refuses to ~~go~~ buy his way to the top rankWhy should he try to get purple robe.
Below purple, can wear brown or green.
However, when he goes to themain temple for Otsutome, they sit in order of rank (kurai); after all these years, he is still near the bottom. Some ask him why. Isn't he embarrassed. He asks, why should I be? He's glad to be in lower rank.

Spring 3/19-23 and fall 9/19-25 all the members come to the temple; especially 9/21 ohigan. Oji gives lecture -

Once a month, he also gives lecture; the toban makes osushi, andold folkd like to come eat and chat; oji's talk is too hard, they nap while he talks.
The people are old, because from about 50 on, people are concerned with death - buddhism is concerned with after life-

Kyoko (20), Takao 18, Hiroko 16, Kazuo 14.

Kazuo loves any kind of insects; as a child, they would just put him in an empty room give him an insett of some sort and he would followit around or sit and watch it for hours; he didn't kill it, because they it would stop moving. Even now he loves fish, chicken, works in bgarden, does anything Takao does. Pals.
Is on school tennis team. Wanted tv until they all had to keep quiet hours so Takao would study, and then he stopped asking forit.
used to go watch neighbors.

Children these days don't do much reading or thinking - watch TV, are passive.

Grammar school child: Just likes to run around, climb trees; gang of 10 or so would play hide and seek, chased each other, run in bamboo forest till dark; worst that can happen then is to be disliked by others and left alone, when they are mad at you. Trips most looked forward to: 1 night in Ise.
2 daytime trips - like picnics.
undokai; gakugeikai - plays and program.

Hiroko: in 1st year of High School. likes ping pong; saving 400 yen ea month for Kyushu trip 3-4 days at end of 3rd year. For many, these are only trips they ever get. When she was small, she'd have temper tantrums, lie flat in street and scream. Now is quiet, good, helps around kitchen. Gets mad at older sister who works, and therefore doesn't do much housework, comes home tired, just in time to eat.

in Jr. High saved 220 per month for trip to Tokyo.

Kyoro studied typing in Jap. and Engl for 2 years to get job; now doesn't use it. Is studying yo-sai; getting ready for marriage. company officials liked her because she was tennis champ; they wanted her for company team.

Kokudo daini doro- is the busy road near their house. dump cars go by 2500 times each day; (roundtrips) 1 company only - 4 cars! Create terrible dust; young careless boys drive, knock down lamp post, utility post, lights out; cover big numbers on back (for reporting) them with dust.

Curve on Kokudo doro from Osaka so bad, innumerable accidents there; Seizo called to do otsutome there, recited sutra, because so many have died there. He jokingly says he told the spirits to stop calling any more people there. Some say it's because they knocked down and buried a jizo statue there to build the road; so many die there.

Closet sprung a huge leak during downpour beginning of tsuyu season; Mother tells child to check closet; "Oshire mite kure yutte haru yo..." tells father; "hmmmm" they finally look; rain pouring in- whammo whole family has to form a line to carry out foodstuffs, dishes, etc.

- June 10th - farmers are burning husks from wheat harvest in fields - the burning lights at night are pretty in the darkness. They will save the ash for fertilizer.
June 10-20 Rice planting; weeding until August - then farmers fairly free in Aug. for ohaka maeri.

Sept. plant seeds for vegetables.

Oct. harvest rice.

Farmers who own land are getting rich by selling; get 1,000,000 immediately, they buy big tractors, refrig, fix house, get tv. companys are buying land for factories. Around Kuze 1 tsubo (2 tatami mats) about 10,000 yen - cheap places 6000. (Shimo gamo about 40,000 per tsubo).

Companies like Takara Beer, Kansai Kogyo, Glass co. lots of elec. companies shooting up around Kuze. Lots of highways, building, activity.

Lots of people taking advantage of farmers who are making fast money; tell them to take money from bank and invest in some kind of poor security; they make a lot of money - then lost rest. (Idea: neighbor has to move out to make way for highway; sells land high invests in fake company; loses everything)

Hiroko: takes math, lang; Engl, soc. studies (econ); chemistry, biology, shukyo, music, sewing cooking (2 a week); manners - only in priv. school; learn how to open door, serve tea, etc.; Can also take ikebana and ocha once a week.


Parents all helped clear ground for undoba at Kazuo's school. Each child's parents come. while kids in class, parents take turns carrying off rocks; spend a whole day; and job done.

Mother; belonged to group studying food, diet, health; reported at Kyoto meeting; sent to attend National health instit. conf. in Tokyo; took huge posters (others who knew better took slides)- had to get new suit; spent 2 days sightseeing and came home.

Retirement income recipients get improved benefits

The program is now called "Tax Credit for the Elderly" since it now includes earned income as well as retirement income. Where the old limits on which the credit was based were \$1,524 and \$2,286 for single people and those filing married-joint respectively, the new amount is \$2,500 for a single person and \$3,750 for filing married-joint.

The maximum income is still reduced by exempt social security and exempt retirement income under a specific formula, *but the key* is that all types of income, including earned income, is eligible for the credit. It remains at 15% of the retirement income credit base as calculated.

Dear Friend:

Thank you for your message expressing concern over the Administration's request for supplemental military aid to Indochina.

The civil wars in Cambodia and South Vietnam continue to be a terrible tragedy for the people involved. I oppose spending money on U.S. military aid to Southeast Asia, which only prolongs the conflict without a constructive end in sight.

I will vote against the Fiscal Year '75 supplemental requests submitted to Congress by President Ford. Further, in my view, Congress should not vote military aid to Phnom Penh and Saigon in FY 1976.


In the case of South Vietnam, economic aid should also be cut off unless there is a demonstrated willingness by that government to negotiate with its adversaries--in line with the Paris accords--and to allow opposition parties to participate in a free electoral process. And economic aid must be used for humanitarian purposes. We must not permit it to be diverted to political use, or to increase the wealth of the wealthy.

In regard to Cambodia, the United States must help bring the war to an end--not continue to prolong it. Humanitarian assistance should be provided for those in need.

Finally, be assured that I intend to explore all legislative means of closing the loopholes the Administration has found in past legislation that was intended to end participation of U.S. military forces in combat-related activities in Southeast Asia. Present military actions by the U.S. violate the spirit--if not the letter--of the provisions Congress wrote into the law.

I appreciate your taking the time to share with me your views on ending military involvement in Southeast Asia.



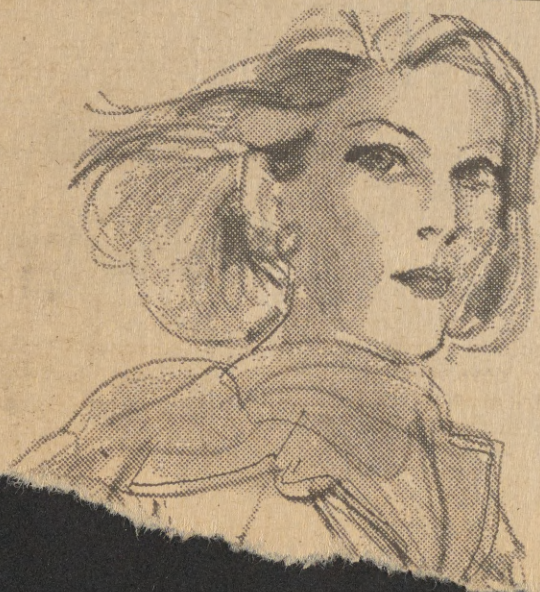

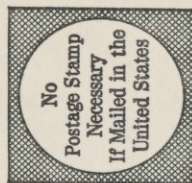

with civil liberties and human rights who believe that "We hold these Truths to be self-evident, that all Men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator, with certain unalienable Rights ... Life, Liberty, and the Pursuit of Happiness."

Wiser than many, those portrayed, whether Issei, Nisei, or Kibei did not ask for happiness; they asked for the right of its pursuit. The pursuit, not the attainment, is joined with life and liberty. No more should anyone seek.

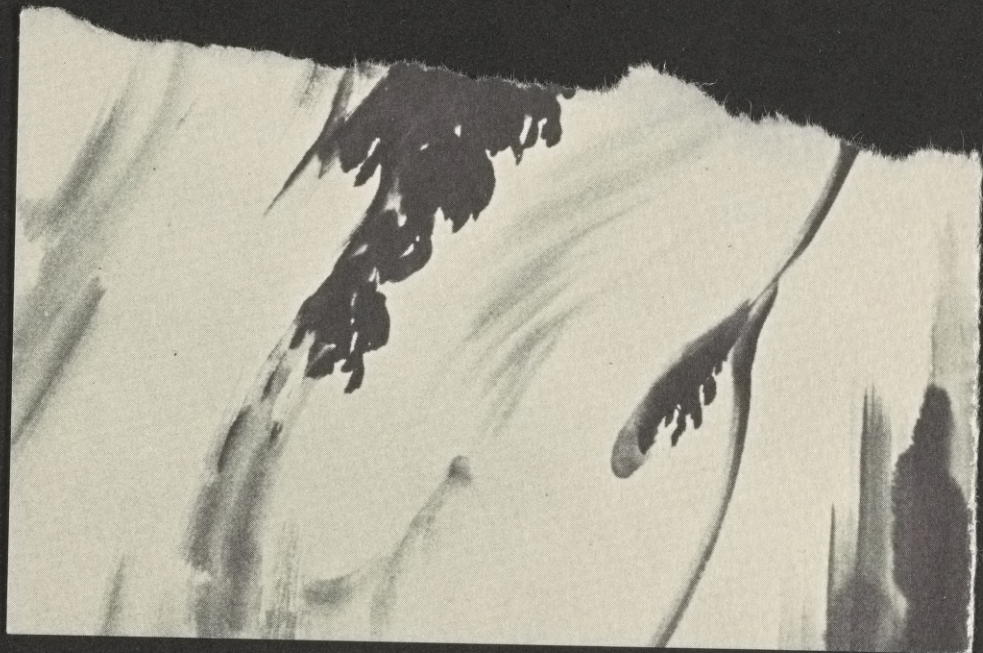

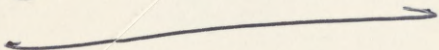

One day he sees a man with the trained bear. They're going from house to house! shop to shop. He's intrigued. follows him around. The man asks Koichi if he'd like to help him ~~take~~.
