SANITATION:

We have been making an effort to improve sanitation in the Project and have made some progress. Breeding places of flies have been eradicated and steps taken to wash and disinfect garbage cans. Recommendation for sanitary equipment in the Butcher Shop has been made, also for the construction of a sanitary slaughter house. Studies on water and milk supply reveal that these are both unsatisfactory. Measures are being taken to increase the chlorination of the water supply and we are making intensive studies of the milk supply in an endeavor to ascertain the reason for its unfitness.

MALARIAL CONTROL:

We have made good progress in malarial control as indicated by the absence of larvae of malaria bearing mosquitoes in the Project. Outside the Project they are reported by the State Officials to be very much decreased and in this connection I will point out that to date we have had only one case of proven malaria on the Area this year. We are still backward in the matter of cleaning out ditches inside the Project. A great deal has been done by volunteer workers in the blocks which leaves us to feel encouraged to hope that much more will be accomplished in the future.

We are recommending that the tofu-miso factory be removed from Block 36 and combined with a canning plant which is projected for erection in the neighborhood of the Hospital Boiler House. We feel that this will enable us to remove another source of flies and place the activity in the best possible sanitary surroundings.
