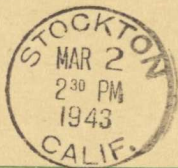

Dear Mr. Fisher,

On next Tuesday, the Twenty-third, we meet for the third time this month. We hope to then complete plans for the enlargement of our group. At to-day's meeting I was instructed to ask your personal opinion on a few matters hoping time will permit a reply for Tuesday.

The first question was, "Are we to affiliate with or become a chapter of the Committee on American Principles and Fair Play?" This came up when we considered a name for our enlarging group. We have built considerable good will in the minds of the evacuees so there is some advantage in retaining the name, Pasadena Committee for Fair Play. However, our name and yours, too, may not be as specific as we desire so a third handle may suit us better locally. But if we become the Pasadena Chapter of the Committee on American Principles and Fair Play we should add the strength of increased numbers to your parent organization while we take of its prestige.

If we become a chapter, we shall want to be free to express and to act ourselves as problems and questions arise, without waiting for headquarters clearance. This brought up the question of names for the chapter letterhead. Should they include headquarters officials and committeemen?

Some of us feel that to be effective locally we must build here a consciousness of the implications of the evacuation and should have with us all who choose "to do something about it". Thus we plan a large group. High dues would be an impediment. Most of us hope that two dollars will cover all including local expenses. How would it suit you if in place of fixed dues per member we as a chapter have a quota for headquarters expenses? If so, knowing time will not permit a commitment from the northern meeting, we ask what quota do you personally suggest for a city of this size?

If now chosen, who are your officers and committeemen?

This afternoon fifteen earnest folks met. We wish to work with you to awake others "to do justice to the East gracefully and during the period of grace".




Dear Mr. Lundberg:


Dear Ruth:
