There has been no change in policy procedure in the last thirty (30) days. The personnel has increased to 27 firemen in the last thirty days which gives three good fire fighting crews. Some of the new men have been firemen before. There will be a change from the present 24 hr. shift to the 12 hr. shift when the personnel increases to where it will allow. This change will eliminate the extra hours the men have been working for the last sixty (60) days due to the shortage of help.

On November 4, 1943, at 7:45 A.M., received call from the town of Watson, eight miles north of center. Sent one truck and 4 men. Fire was under control on arrival. Used booster line to put out some smoldering spots. Returned to center 10:00 A.M.

SUBJECT: Rohwer Monthly Report for May, 1944

The following Washington Note has been added to the narrative of the Rohwer Relocation Center's May Fire Department Report, Form WRA-158:

"Washington Note: June 14, 1944.

"Fire Protection Adviser William E. Hoffman visited the center June 4 to 8, 1944. The manpower in the firefighting forces was very critical. Steps were taken to take advantage of Administrative Notice No. 75, which should relieve the situation considerably. The turnover was so rapid that few men on the fire department had any training. The Acting Fire Protection Officer was without an assistant and found himself nearly powerless to get any relief for the critical conditions that existed. Older men were being employed and it appears that there will be less turnover with this policy. See Fire Protection Adviser's Report on Rohwer, dated June 8, 1944.

"The Fire Protection Officer had been on the center for over two months without leaving the center and was desirous of resigning as soon as a relief could be found for him. Mr. James O. Riley, of North Little Rock, Arkansas was interviewed and given a temporary appointment as Assistant Fire Protection Officer, CAF-9, salary \$3,200 per annum, to EOD June 9, 1944, pending his indefinite appointment. The Acting Fire Protection Officer agreed to withdraw his resignation, which he did, with the new appointment and if given some annual leave to obtain necessary medical attention for his wife.

"The Fire Prevention Bureau had been functioning much better than the reports indicate. Administrative matters were discussed and considerable improvement can be expected in the future.

Inspection of this center was made by Mr. W. E. Hoffman, Fire Protection Advisor from the Washington office. Several recommendations in procedure and fire protection was made to all division heads by him, including safety installations in new auditorium, such as panic-bolts on exit doors, asbestos lining in projection booth and rewind room, escape hatch from booth to outside of building, issuance of tickets to only allocated number of seating capacity of building.

During fire Prevention Week, several demonstrations were made to school pupils by fire protection section, and talks were made on Fire Hazards--use of fire extinguishers by types, and talks on inflammable liquids, special dangers of electrical appliances that have defective cords, dangers of accumulating rubbish due to colder weather and fire being in stoves in units.

A large demonstration was given on high school auditorium ground attended by about 800 pupils from all schools. This demonstration included the building of small bon-fires of different materials such as waste, wood, oils, paint and the proper extinguishers were used to extinguish fires.

Fire prevention talks were made and class A, B, and C fires

Notices were put in center newspaper advertising this event and an explanation of proper way to report fires were made.

A fire inspector attends all block managers meeting and fire hazards and how to eliminate them are discussed at each meeting. The block managers have agreed to give full cooperation to the fire protection section in the removal of fire hazards.
