




We Who Live







AMERICANISM AS BUDDHISM

During every war we hear so much of patriotism, that we wonder about the time not engaged in fighting. And for this period, in almost every country in the world, we find a kind of patriotism then too. We are informed by those looked to with respect and considerating that this condition is a most necessary one; indeed, is it not based upon the theory of life itself.

The child is born and everything is without regard for self or individualization. Then, almost immediately, one begins to take pride, to reconstruct in one's own likeness (with much reason), to impress all, including the infant, with the differences: that the baby is one's own, and that Mama and Papa are the child's own. Certainly these are natural behaviors and may well be thought of as a beginning of racial and national hatreds if left at this point, which they generally are.

It is "human nature" to prefer one's own and one's own kind to any "outside interest" and we find in America we have as many inhabitants thinking and living in the usual manner as exist in any country of any size. In America there are also "world gauged" men, or thinking people without special regard for one's own, but with thought foremost towards the welfare of all equally. And it is possible to elevate the former group of people into admitting such noble conditions and attempting to make them real; this is not so possible in almost all others. It is an unique condition to Americans. Here, in America, I have been privileged to enter with ease many thousands of homes and have heard prayers of children, words uttered like: "And bless the trees, and the animals, and the people and children all over the world." This is an extension we as Americans are especially aware of and have been for long times back. But this is not acting as Americans, but rather does it become possible to so behave, to so think, because we are of the liverality we know as America.

There is not the thought that we must establish for others our way of life, to force our conceptions as most desireable upon others, but rather is it that because we are Americans we want to make possible the right for all others to have or have not that which each one in each locality may deem as best for himself. It is this essential freedom in every respect that is becoming possible everywhere.

And you and I with our sacrifices during these transitory times are making this come true. We are willingly submitting to many conditions heretofore not necessary in order to have for our children and the children of the world and their children those qualities which we know we have lacked and thus now are now engaged in creating.

And now has come upon us the golden opportunity to truly think with purity, to truly act without petty discriminations, to truly be the noble human being we ascribe secretly within ourselves. When we do these things we become these qualities and these qualities become the qualities of the community and the character of the community reflects itself in our government and our government subtly by its wisdom and altruism is used as an example amongst other governments and thus betterment in the world-of living come into being.

The more we search in our genuine patriotism, the more we come to the definition of Americanism and at once, Buddhism. A real American is in a political and human manner a real Buddhist. We have no use for such words as obedience, command, tolerance in our religion, but rather consider in their stead understanding, selflessness and compassion. Prejudice, anger, greed and hatred are signposts to us of degrees in ignorance.

Truly is our task an enormous one, but just as it is not necessary to be an American, nor to be a Buddhist, it is important that these qualities for the welfare of all forms of life be realized within us and expressed by our every alert, aware living movement.



MANZANAR BUDDHIST CHURCH



June 21, 1942, three months after the first volunteers had entered the Manzanar Relocation Center, the Buddhists held its opening day at 17-15. The congregation consisted of Buddhist followers principally from Southern California, Sacramento, and Bainbridge (Wash) areas. Mr. L. Mihara acted as chairman on this initial day, and sermons were delivered by the Rev. Junzo Izumida and Mr. Sangoro Mayeda while Mr. Eizo Masuyama participated as the ceremonial speaker.

In August, the Rev. Shinjo Nagatomi arrived from the Tanforan Assembly Center in reply to the invitation accepting the responsibilities over the Buddhist Church activities and duties in Manzanar. Simultaneously, the church was transferred to the 13-15 building as an official location. The "Nyubutsushiki" or the dedication of the church shrine was held on September 13, 1942 with Rev. S. Nagatomi as the dedicational speaker.

In November, Rev. J. Izumida resigned his post, due to ill health, and joined his son in Poston, Arizona.

The Buddhist church is divided into four sects. The Shinshu sect, officiated by the Rev. S. Nagatomi and assisted by Mr. S. Mayeda, holding its regular services at 13-15 church. The Nichiren sect, officiated by the Rev. J. Oda, holds its services at 27-15. The Daishi Ko (Shingonshu), which has no reverend at present, is officiated alternately by the different reverends at 13-15. The Kannon Ko (Zen-shu), formed by Rev. M. Tsuda who returned from the Santa Fe internment camp, also holds its services at the 13-15 church.

The first Sunday of each month is reserved for "Oshotsuki Service". "Succho Sekkyo" (religious-lectures) are held every second and fourth Thursday night of each month at one of the scheduled mess halls.

Besides the regular services, there are memorial services, funerals and weddings. All reverends take turn in conducting various church services.

The "Nokotsudo" or the Columbarium is installed behind the shrine. Ashes of the deceased Buddhist are kept in custody of the church.

The Sunday church service attendance has been constantly filled to more than the seating capacity of the hall. There are at the present time, four regular Sunday services at 13-15; namely: the Sunday School service from 9:00 a. m. with 650 attendance. The classes are divided into the following four groups: Class A: 6 years and under; Class B: 7 to 9 years; Class C: 10 to 12 years; Class D: 13 to 15 years. The Young People's Service is held from 10:00 a. m. with attendance of 700. Rev. Nagatomi delivers his regular sermons with Mr. Mayeda assisting. The Shingon service from 2:00 p. m. with 150 attendance; and the Adult service from 7:00 p. m. with 750 attendance.

There are three organizations affiliated with the church. The Buddhist Flock Representatives Council with 150 members; the Young Buddhist Association with 900 members and the Buddhist Fujin Kai with 1,100 members.

The Church Council meetings are held on the first Thursday of each month. Two or more representatives are appointed from each block. The Board of Directors controls the Buddhist Activities. Following are the personnel:

The pay of all reverends come under the Community Welfare payroll as Family Counselors. Nob Myose, Director of Church Activities; Yoshiko Hosoi Church Secretary; Toshiye Higashida, YBA Executive Secretary; and Mr. T. Nishikawa, Church caretaker; comes under the same payroll.

The success of the Manzanar Buddhist Church is due to the cooperation and effort of all Buddhist as well as the capable and efficient leadership of all reverends.
