A majority of the old applications on Form WRA-83 have been supplemented on Form WRA-156.

Complaints have been registered during the month by residents of this center on losing property in private storage, especially in the Nichiren Buddhist Temple and the Compton Mission.

Forms have been drafted to keep a daily record of all cases and a complete report will be made for the month of August.

NARRATIVE REPORT: (Use space below for comment on progress and developments of significance at center in connection with handling evacuee property matters; problems encountered; complaints received; suggestions and recommendations.)

A greater part of the month was spent in interviewing and instructing repatriates who are leaving for Japan on September 1st, on the S. S. Gripsholm, on crating and shipping of their personal effects.

The crating for shipment to Tule Lake of household effects belonging to segregees leaving around the middle of September is approximately 60% complete.

Special attention was given to those evacuees having properties stored at the Nichiren Temple, Tenrikyo Temple, and the Compton Mission in Los Angeles. Reports were received and confirmed concerning alleged pilfering and vandalisms committed on these premises. Adequate protective measures have been taken, and negotiations are being made to send representatives from certain projects to Los Angeles to check up on the Nichiren Temple.

There has been a considerable increase in the movement of Evacuee Property to relocation points during the month.

NARRATIVE REPORT: (Use space below for comment on progress and developments of significance at center in connection with handling evacuee property matters; problems encountered; complaints received; suggestions and recommendations.)

A greater part of the month was spent on the segregation program. Approximately 300,000 pounds of freight and baggage, consisting of 8 freight cars and 4 baggage cars, was handled. These shipments consisted of furniture, clothing and other household effects. Also two carloads of freight belonging to segregants who left on September 16 were crated and shipped to the Tule Lake Center.

A decided increase of real estate and commercial cases was received during the month. This includes 20 cases transferred from the Tule Lake Center.

Shipments consisting of approximately 17 families from the project to relocation points was made. There was also 5 direct shipments from points in California to families who have relocated.

To save time and expedite shipments of small lots of household effects and to receive L.C.L. shipments, it is recommended that the Evacuee Property Office be assigned a pickup or cargo truck to take care of these shipments.

Two carloads of household effects and personal property were received at the project. One of these cars came from Los Angeles and the other from Sacramento. These two cars completed one hundred and forty pending "Requests for Transportation."

One sale of real estate was completed during the month totaling \$12000. Two or three other sales of real estate have been started and are in the process of consummation. One sale of commercial property was consummated, consisting of floral refrigeration equipment.

In the latter part of this month 10 shipments of radios and cameras were received and delivered to the owners.

Evacuee Property matters during November were handled through the Project Property Office with the assistance of the Project Attorney.

During the month, there was a decided increase in requests for storage of property, due to the fact that several notices were received from private storage places, requesting removal of all evacuee property. Storage places requesting removal of property most concerned with this Project are the following:

Nishi Hongwanji Temple, Koyasan Betsuin Temple and the Maryknoll School in Los Angeles, and the Livingston Fruit Exchange in Livingston.


Pending cases on real estate and commercial property have been increasing during the month. Sale of a poultry ranch of nineteen acres from last month is still in transaction. Sale of another automobile will be completed in the near future.

Other cases during the month include assistance to two parties in transporting their commercial property, consisting of farm machinery, to relocation points. We have referred letters to the Project Attorney's office for attention and reply concerning collection of the sum of \$600.00 for certain farm implement sold to Shinichi Shojiguchi of this Center. Also, a pending case regarding settlement of loan by Mrs. Taka Yamamoto of this Center from the Sumitomo Bank of California in which she pledged a Yen Certificate as security. There has been a consummation of sale of two automobiles, amounting to \$115.00 this month. Also, a collection on one year's lease on a ranch in the amount of \$416.61.

Many L. C. L. shipments of household goods of evacuees transferring from Tule Lake were received at the Project. Also, a whole carload of goods was received near the end of the month from the Tule Lake Center.

A number of complaints have been received from evacuees, regarding the severe handling of their property in shipments from private storage to the project or Government storage. Apparently, some property from private homes is not being crated by WRA for shipment as called for in Administrative Instruction No. 78.



During December, evacuee property matters were still being temporarily handled through the Project Property Office. During the month, a decrease in the number of requests for storage and transportation of evacuee property was noted except applications for cameras which increased.

A lease on an orchard for the price of \$350.00 is in transaction. A negotiation for a sale of an automobile is in process. Also, another sale of an automobile for the amount of \$1550.00 is in transaction. A sale of a gas stove regulator and two Butane tanks for \$125.00 cash has been completed. A sale of a lot at the price of \$350.00 is being processed. Pending case on a sale of a poultry ranch involving \$15,000 is still being processed.

An investigation regarding damage done by windstorm to a garage and other buildings for George Okamoto is being made and also to secure bids for repairs from a reliable contractor. Upon the approval of the project, arrangements have been made for transporting an automobile to this project for George Kikuchi. A payment for a truck, belonging to Henry Hirose, requisitioned by the War Department is in process.

Evacuee property matters handled during December were generally fewer than during November. Discussions were held during the month with several evacuees regarding fairly large property cases, and we are looking forward to January with an expectation of an increase in evacuee property cases.

During the month of January, there has been an increase of 156s for direct shipments to relocation points. Also, LCL shipments have been coming in quite steadily.

The problem of segregating and removing personal property of several evacuee families of this Project stored at Shogatsu Tei, Los Angeles, which has been ransacked has been brought to our attention, and action is being taken regarding the matter. Another case similar to the Shogatsu Tei has *been reported* ~~been brought to our attention~~. At the request of Reverend Kubose, custodian of the Higashi Hongwanji Temple, Los Angeles, evacuees concerned have filed applications for the removal of their property to Govt. storage.

Requests for the release of contraband which was impounded at the Santa Anita Assembly Center and held under the jurisdiction of the Civil Affairs Division of the Western Defense Command have been returned. At the same time, however, a new procedure is now being worked out to allow release of this property. Expected release of impounded contraband in the Sacramento Police Dept., held under the jurisdiction of the United States Marshall for Northern California has been brought to our attention.

Cases concerning various commercial properties are still in transaction. Pending case from last month in transporting commercial property, consisting of farm machinery, to relocation point is being processed. Another request for the transportation of carload of farm machinery to relocation point is being processed. Five pending cases regarding payment for automobiles and a truck requisitioned by the War Department are near completion. A new case requesting assistance in obtaining sufficient gas ration coupons to bring a pick-up belonging to Yoshio Oda from California to Colorado for the use of agricultural work is in transaction.

Collections in the amount of \$1190.00 have been received from the War Department for six trucks requisitioned some time ago. A letter from the Alien Property Custodian Office in San Francisco, requesting the current status of Fujii Ten Cent Store has been referred to this office for reply.

The month of February has been an active one with reference to requests for assistance in locating misplaced or lost items of household effects. Every effort is being made to satisfy evacuees in this respect. Requests for shipments to relocation points continue to come in. These are met and handled with good results.

One large shipment of commercial property (farm machinery) is now in transit being shipped from Woodland, California to Grand Junction, Colorado. This was handled to the complete satisfaction of the evacuee relocating near Grand Junction.

A number of requests for assistance in obtaining gas ration coupons to bring cars and trucks from California to Colorado have been received from evacuees now ready to relocate. We have been successful in securing such assistance through the O.P.A. Office at Lamar, Colorado.


Requests for the release of contraband impounded at the Tule Lake Segregation Center have been quite general. Most of the requests relate to cameras and radios. Tule Lake reports that contraband impounded was shipped, as one large lot without being segregated, to the Warehouse in San Francisco. A number of losses and missing articles have been reported to us by evacuees stating, in most cases, that cameras and radios cannot be located or accounted for.

A request for assistance in refinancing a mortgage covering a chicken ranch near Petaluma was received. This is being referred to a local banker for attention. Suggestions and recommendations to the evacuee in the refinancing of said mortgage were gratefully accepted.

Recommendations in the matter of a qualified guardian for the J. Kikuchi family was referred to our Project Attorney for attention.

Distribution of checks issued by U. S. Treasurer for cars and trucks requisitioned by War Department, U. S. Army, will be completed during the coming month.

Progress made in the handling of requests for assistance for Project Evacuees is satisfactory.







The Third Segregation Program completed in May 1944, of the evacuees transferred from the Granada Relocation Center to the Tule Segregation Center reduced our population by ninety-three; representing thirty-five family units. The Evacuee Property Office shipped 335 individual pieces of freight to the Tule Lake Center for segregees.

Arrangements are now underway to receive the transferees from the Jerome Center which will be completed during the month of June.

This Office handled 194 miscellaneous services for evacuees on this Project during the month of May. Many interviews are requested daily by evacuees which pertain to property matters, real and personal, which we have been able to handle effectively and satisfactorily.

Many inquiries and requests are received with reference to the shipping of trucks, tractors, cars, and commercial property since the WRA will ship up to 5,000 pounds at WRA expense. This lift or boost for evacuees has a very desirable and satisfactory effect as it induces and encourages relocation and stimulates the desires for evacuees to shift for themselves.

NARRATIVE REPORT: (Use space below for comment on progress and developments of significance at center in connection with handling evacuee property matters; problems encountered; complaints received; suggestions and recommendations.)

The month of June 1944 brought about an increase in the Center's population by receiving 549 Transferees from the Jerome Relocation Center which will be closed and liquidated. Nine carloads of evacuee property and four carloads of evacuee baggage were shipped into the Granada Relocation Center by Jeromites. All available housing and storage space was taxed to the limit. The Housing and Property Staffs handled the situation effectively and efficiently. This Office received many demands and requests from Jeromites relative to their property interest on the West Coast, together with transportation and storage problems. These requests are being met with satisfaction.

Reference is made to a recent trip through areas near Sacramento, Fresno, Bakersfield, and Needles, California, by Dr. John A. Rademaker, Community Analyst of the Granada Relocation Center. On June 28, 1944, Dr. Rademaker met with approximately 180 evacuees who were assembled in the school building at 7:30 p.m. where he gave a very interesting and informative talk relative to crop conditions, and also touching upon the general sentiment of Californians toward the return of the Japanese-Americans to the West Coast. The evacuees were very appreciative for the information and data submitted.

We find that evacuees are anxious and eager to receive information from the communities from whence they came. Many of them are looking forward to the day when they will be privileged to return to their homes and farms where they can again resume a normal life and be permitted to share the freedom and liberties as American citizens.

NARRATIVE REPORT

The totals shown on attached form WRA 312 has been modified as follows:

Item 2-A shows only those persons 17 years and under who are not working. There are 261 persons 17 years and under who are currently employed on the Center.

Item 2-B shows only those persons 65 and over who are not working. There are 208 people 65 years or over who are currently employed on the Center. Therefore, our total employed figure includes 469 persons who would be included in the "under 17" and "over 65" group. We have modified the population figures for items 2-A and 2-B in order that we will not include the persons in question in both the "employed" and "unemployable" group.

The total shown as registered but not employed include persons 17 years and under and 65 years and over. It also included 263 persons who recently transferred from the Jerome Center to Granada.

We are unable at this time to show the actual number available for open positions. However, we are initiating a program in cooperation with the Welfare Section to ascertain the actual number of people who are physically able and willing to accept assignment to certain types of Center employment.



The month of July 1944 indicates the lowest number of requests (Form WRA-155) for Storage of Property since the beginning of the year. Requests for (Form WRA-156) Transportation of Property continue to run fairly high, mostly from relocatees.

Inquiries answered and miscellaneous services performed for evacuees, totaling 326 for July, indicates that evacuees avail themselves of services offered through the Evacuee Property Office.

Considerable commercial property has been shipped from the West Coast, consisting principally of farm machinery and equipment, for evacuees locating in farming areas. We contribute this interest largely to the assistance given evacuees by the WRA in transporting 5,000 pounds at Government expense. We definitely feel that this "lift" has stimulated and encouraged the relocation of evacuees.

Many requests are handled for the return of contraband property, mostly cameras and radios. The servicing of these requests through our West Coast Offices is improving steadily, as Sheriffs' Offices and Police Departments are releasing such contraband with greater efficiency and less confusion.



I left Amache on October 28, 1944 for California, returning to Amache on November 18, 1944. During the above period, I visited San Francisco, Sacramento, and Los Angeles areas, inspecting all warehouses, taking field trips in all three areas with reference to Granada cases, and also held interviews - at the same time receiving instructions as to procedures from the following men: R. B. Cozzens, Russell T. Robinson, Edgar Bernhard, John W. Lawton, Harry R. Oakley, O. B. Wilt, H. W. Hendricks, Chester W. Hatch, Earl W. Barton, and others. Had a very interesting as well as instructive trip.

A number of cases which were commenced by the Project Attorney during my absence, he prefers to complete same. However, the Project Attorney is turning back some of the work which were started during my absence.

As per Malcolm E. Pitts' letter of November 24, 1944 (3rd and 4th paragraphs), we are not listing WRA-155 and 156 forms as new cases. Neither are we considering them as pending cases. We merely record them as requests received during the month.

Also, we are unable to give amounts involved in the cases handled by the Project Attorney, as we are informed by him that he keeps no record of amounts in the cases he handled. However, for the month of December, we will see to it that a record is kept.



During May, we shipped 164,029 pounds of evacuee property via freight and express.

Many evacuees are storing their household property in our Center warehouse for two reasons - until they are assured sufficient room for same at their relocation address; expect to later return to California (believe a majority of evacuees expect to eventually make their homes in California).

On account of shortage of help, we have talked to the Block Managers at their regular meeting and have their full support in arranging for residents in the block (where we have household goods to pick up) to assist our man in loading and unloading and weighing their personal properties.

Have two trucks - one for freight and one for express. An evacuee with "C" rating is in charge of each truck.

We expect June to be a banner month re relocation and will be governed accordingly.



Month of July, we shipped 269,636 pounds of household goods; this being 73,000 pounds less than we handled during the month of June. This coming month we expect to release one warehouse in Lamar and for sometime past have been handling WRA--223 here on the Center. You will note we issued 336 lumber requisitions for July. After the notice of the closing of the Center, given on July 13th; 187 lumber requisitions were made. We shipped, by WRA Truck to Denver and points in route, 38,365#; the same being over 6,000# made by the same method for the month of June. According to the prospects, looks as if we are going to have a busy August.

Mrs. Doris Hinman, Education Department, was transferred to this office, July 15th. I will now be able to spend more time out of the office to "keep things rolling"/the Evacuee Office.





We shipped out by freight, express and WRA trucks, 1,161,382 pounds of household goods. Included in the above were 33 carload lot shipments, each lot based on an average of 22,000 pounds. One car going to Chicago weighed 34,000 pounds.

Issued 641 GB/L's. Didn't keep track of interviews but safe in saying we had twice as many as August.

In our carload lot shipment we shipped by Universal Carloading and Distributing Co. Inc., going East, and in the Los Angeles area to Lyons Van and Storage Co., to the Sacramento and San Francisco area to Bekins Van and Storage Co. One car completely destroyed by fire at Canyon Diablo, Arizona, consigned to Lyons Van and Storage Co., Los Angeles.

Temporary housing on the west coast is quite a problem as they cannot accept shipment of freight to any F.P.H.A. project at Lomita, Rodeo, Hunter's Point and Los Ceñritos Trailer Court, Webster and Judsen Streets at Long Beach.
