Appended is a tabulation of estimated population by center for the period January 1 to July 1, 1945. These estimates revise those which were prepared for the same period on February 9, 1945.

The figures listed for January, February, and March are the actual population figures reported by the centers involved. Estimates for July 1 which were used in the previous estimates have been retained in this tabulation with the exception of Tule Lake. This figure has been reduced from 20,000 to 18,000. The main difference between the estimates previously made for April, May, and June and those appended lies in the fact that we have given a little more emphasis to relocation in June in the revised figures.

You will note that the estimates previously made for March 1 have been substantiated by the actual reports from the center with the exception of Tule Lake. This difference is explained by the large number who have been removed to internment camps. During the month Heart Mountain has recapitulated their figures and have found that they had previously included 500 more persons in their reports than were actually in residence. With this correction our estimates for March 1 and the reported figures are practically in agreement.

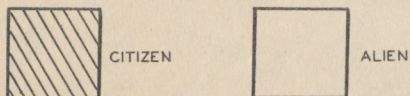
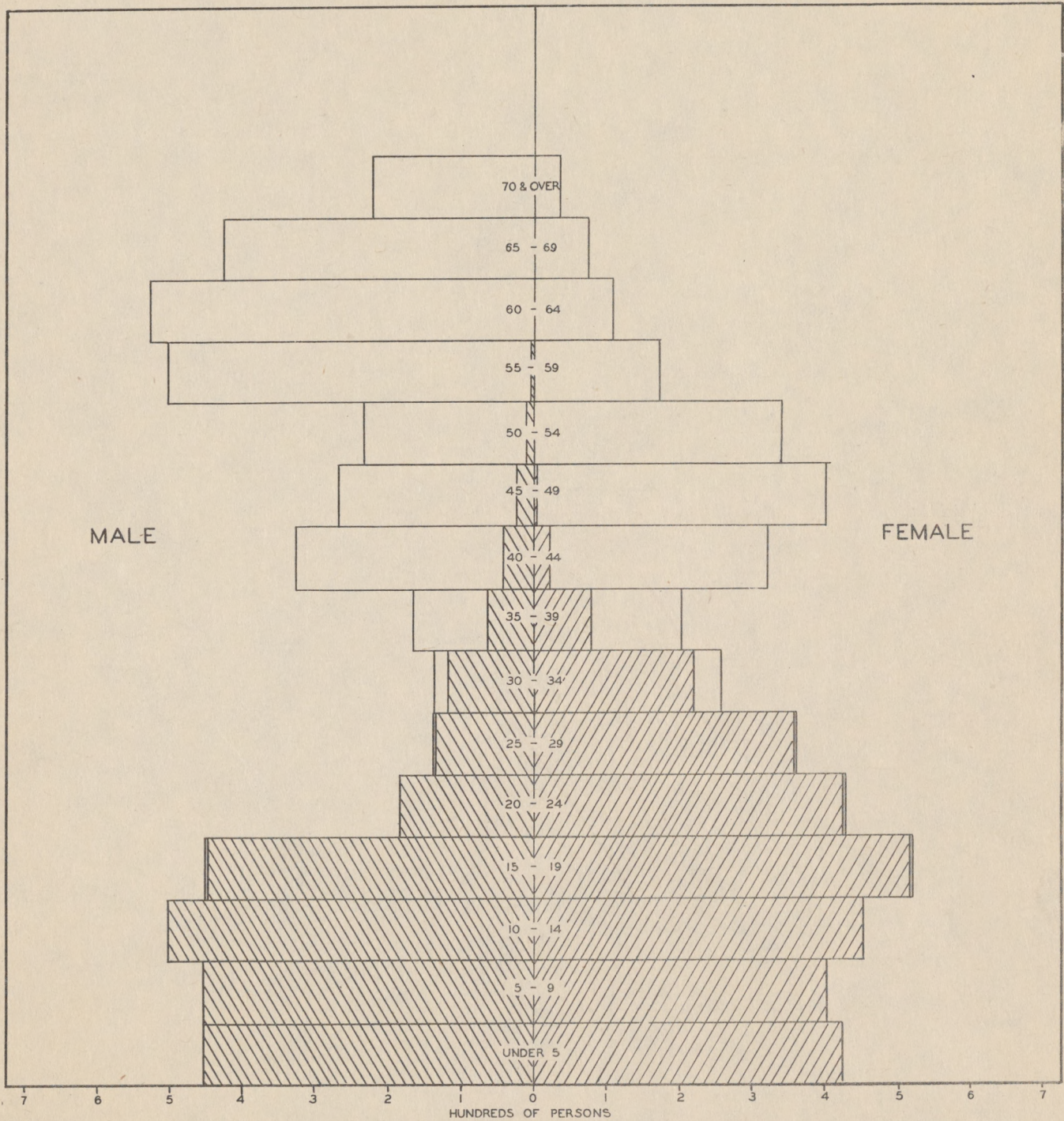

GILA RIVER - DECEMBER 31, 1944

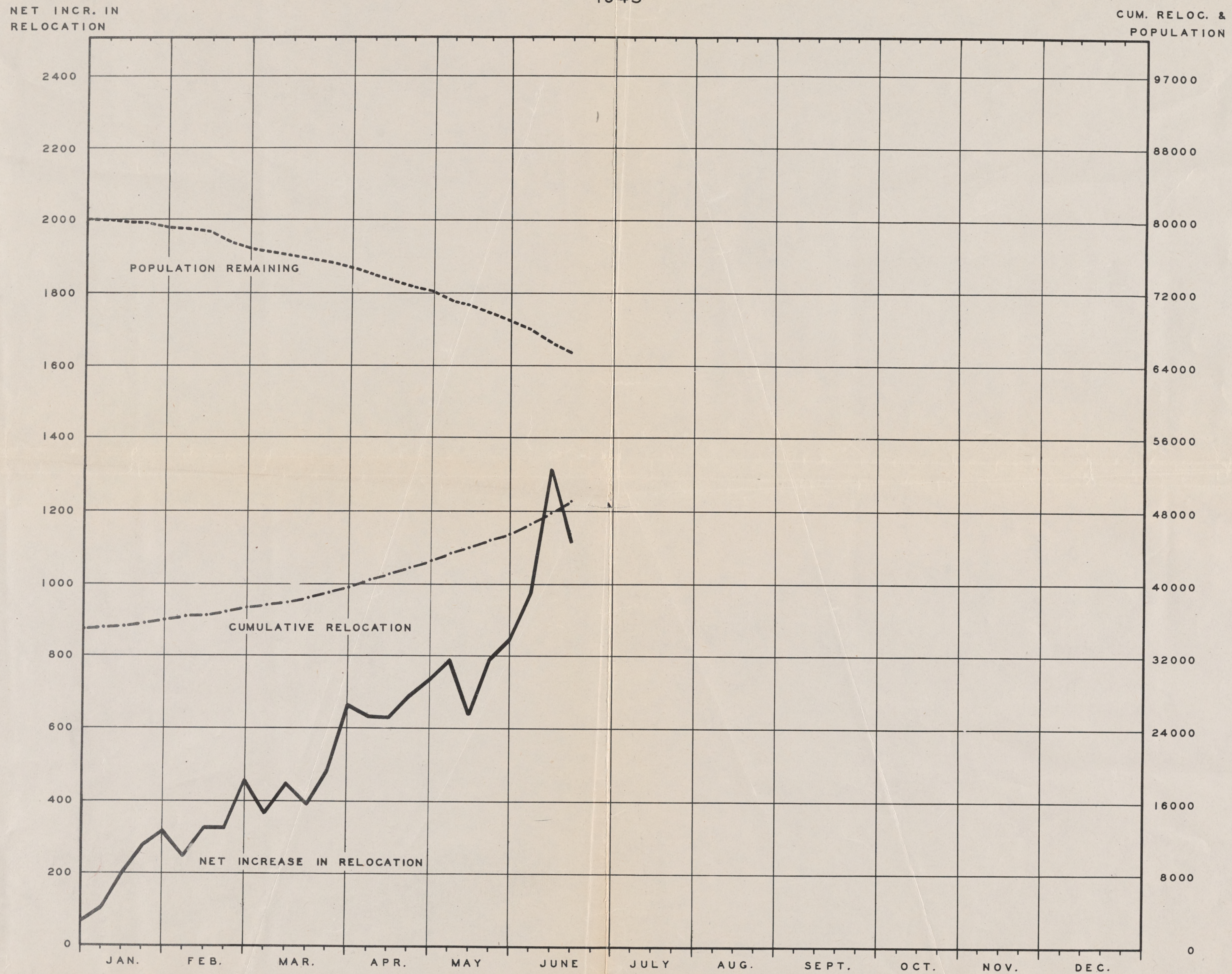

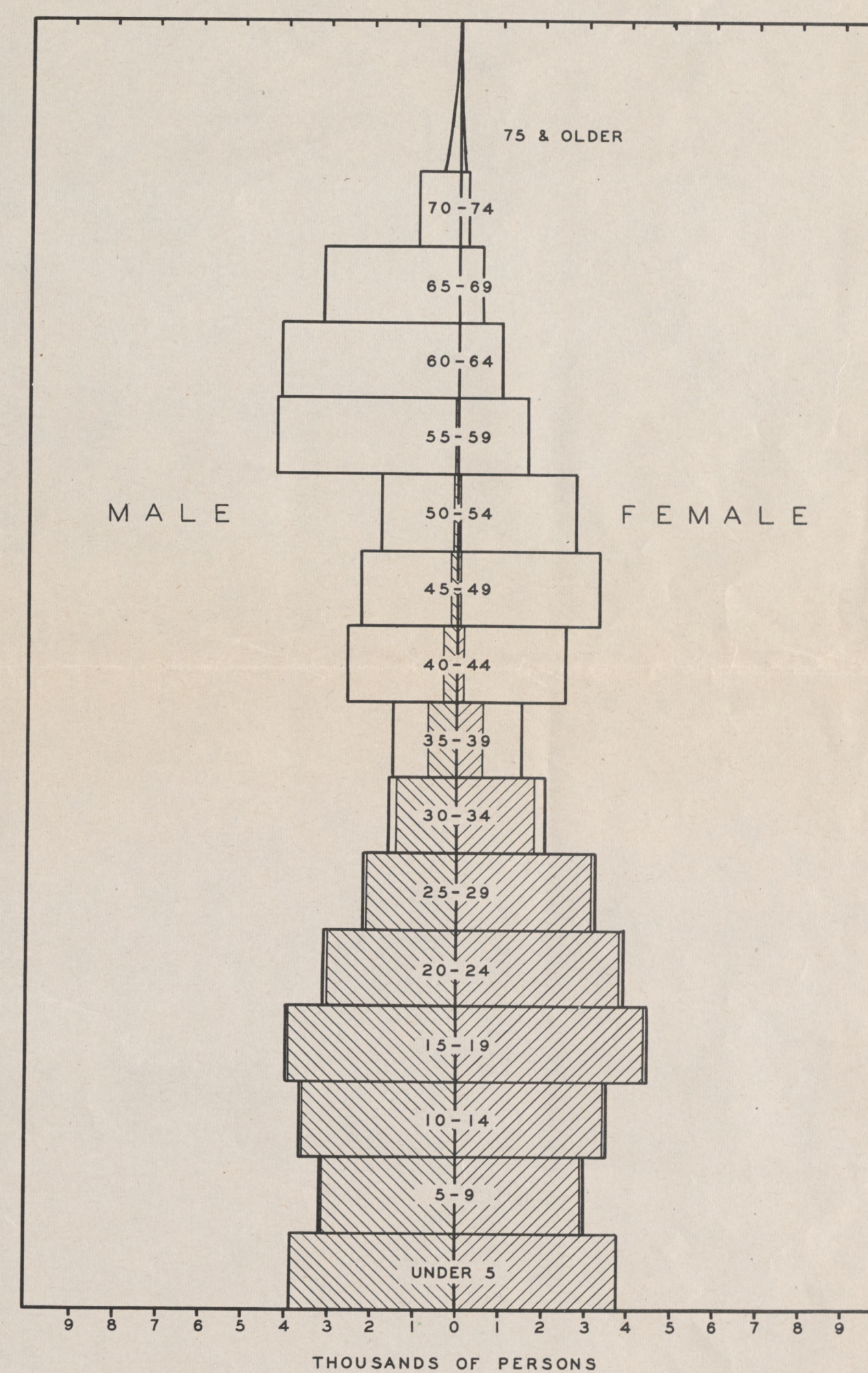
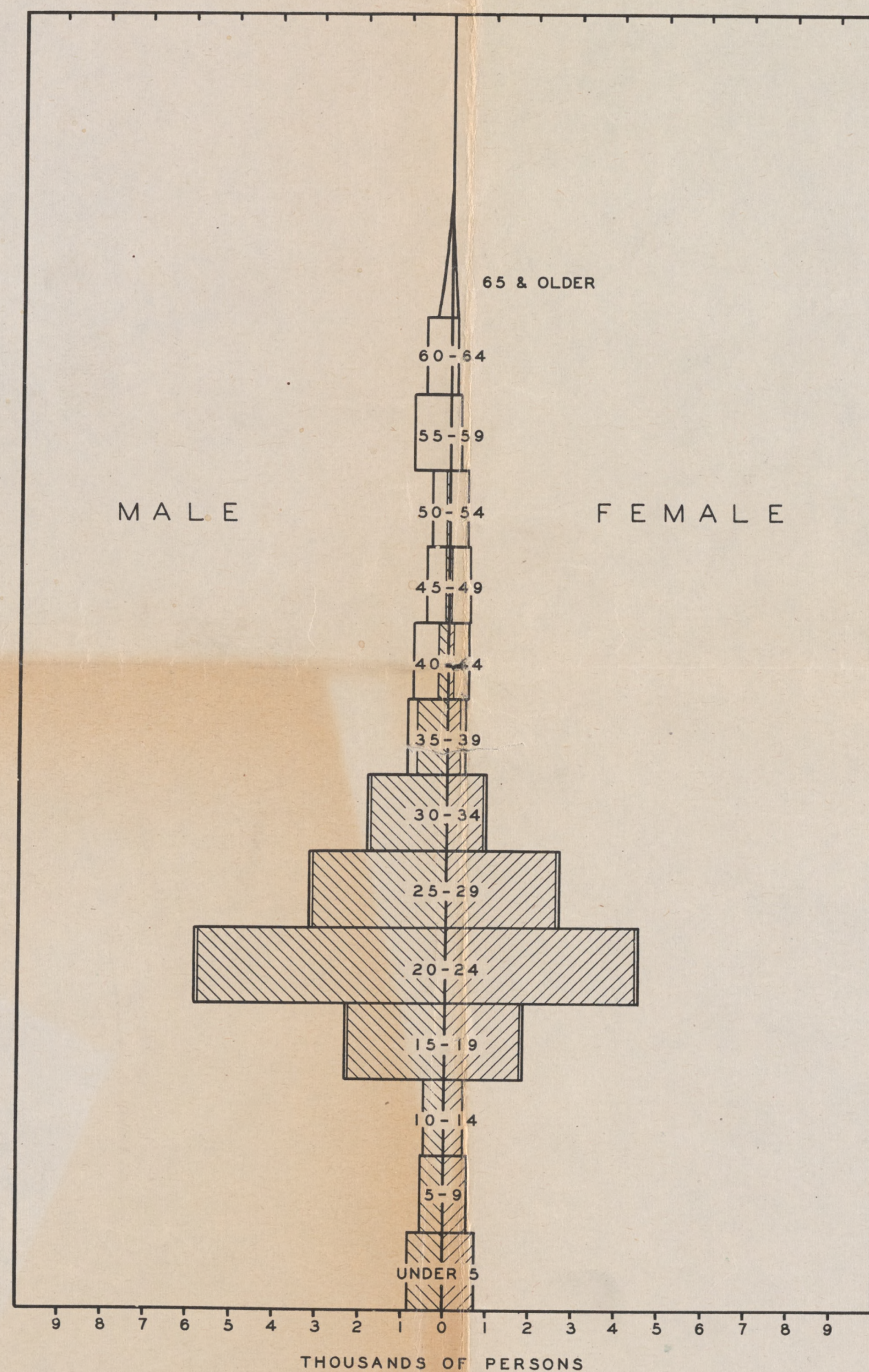
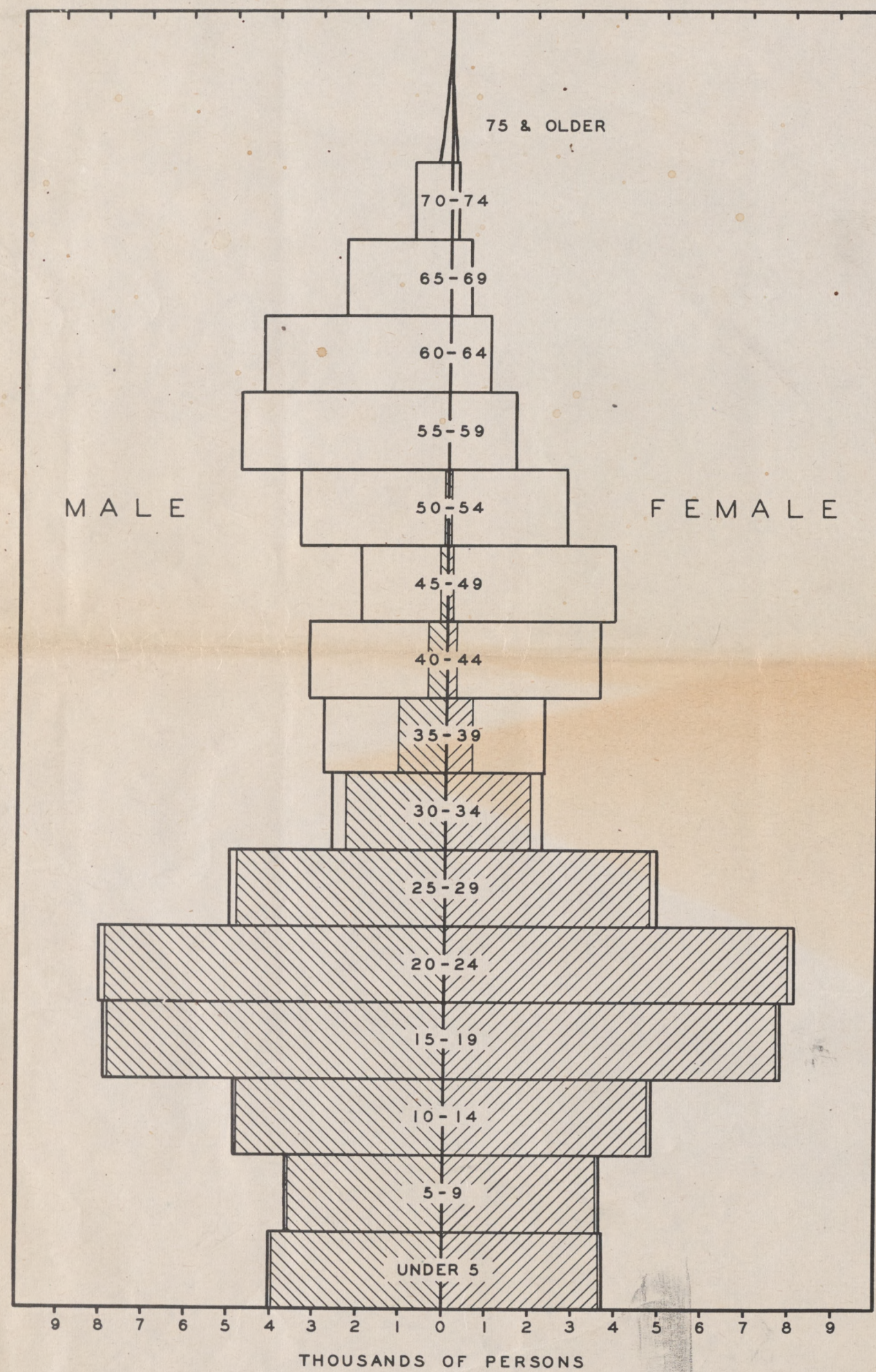


AGE BY SEX AND CITIZENSHIP  
FOR POPULATION OF JAPANESE ANCESTRY

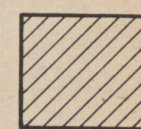
RESIDENTS - 1942

RELOCATED - DECEMBER 31, 1944

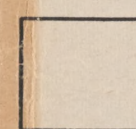

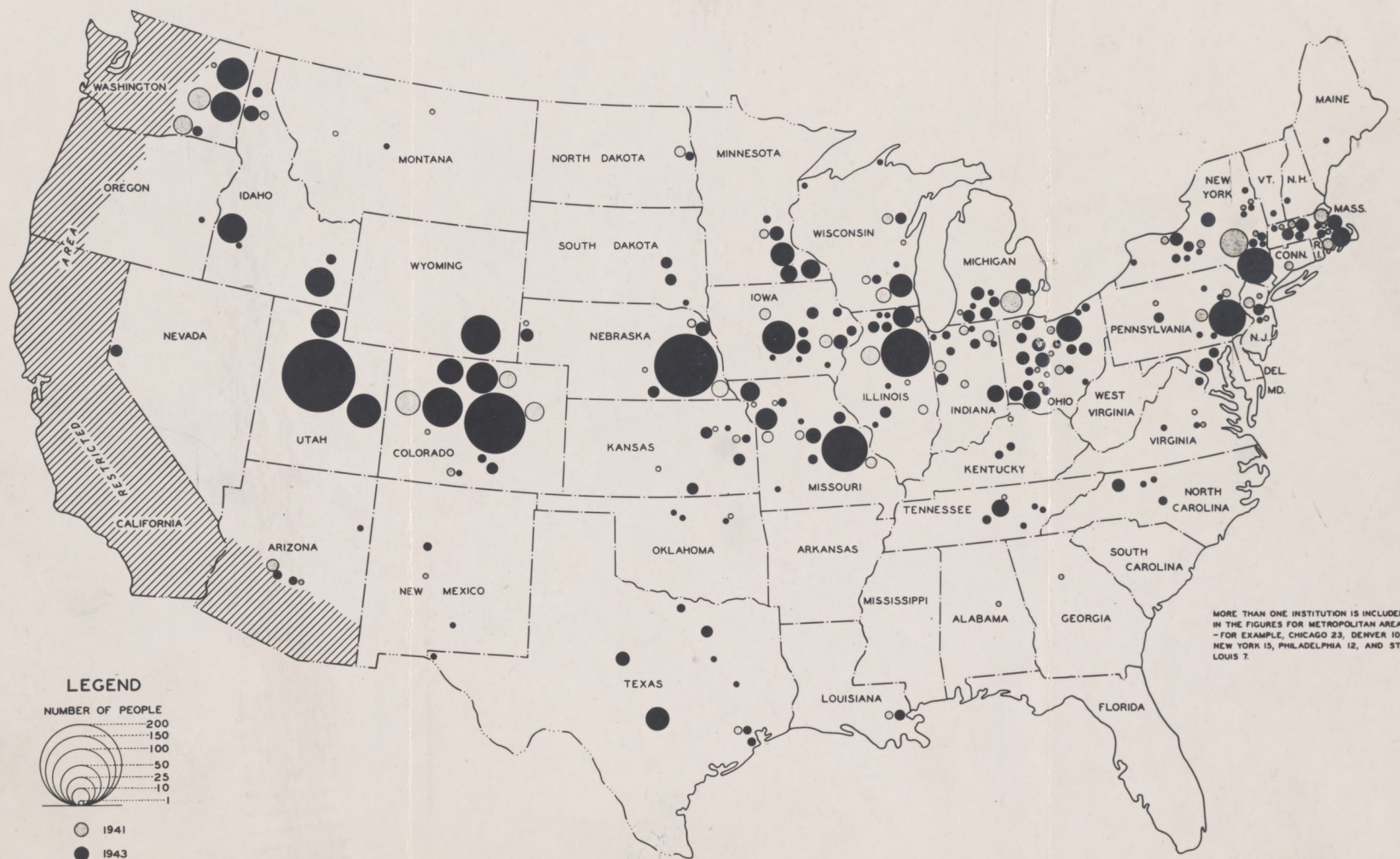
