STUDENT COUNCIL MEETING

January 28, 1943

Present at the meeting were: Tots Ishida, ^{Johnny} ~~William~~ Hayakawa, Tak Shirokawa, Miyoko Mikasa, Masato Asakawa, Kazuko Nakamichi, Grace Kushino, Dorothy Kushino, Terry Nishida, Yo Takehara, Mr. Taniguchi, Mr. Yoshimine, Mr. Urata, and Mr. Taniguchi.

The meeting was called to order by Tots Ishida, Chairman, who handed over the Chairmanship to faculty adviser, Mr. Taniguchi to lead the discussion in regards to better management of high school socials.

Mr. James Urata, faculty adviser of the Junior class, reported that because of the faulty management and the rowdyism at the Sophomore Dance of January 27, the Steward's Department disapproved of future high school socials in the Mess Halls. The Principal declared in a notice to all students that until the student council enforced a workable plan for better management of socials, all major social events were cancelled.

To get different views on the Sophomore affair of January 27, Mr. Taniguchi asked for comments from those who attended the dance. Some of the points brought out were:

1. There was difference in opinion between the Faculty adviser and the Dance Committee as to whether or not the lights should be lowered in the Hall. The Sophomores being inexperienced in sponsoring dances did not know how ~~the~~ to manage the dance.
2. There were very few Sophomore boys at the dance. Most of the fellows were "outsiders", who were not properly dressed. Because of the rainy condition outside, the floor became very muddy as they boys tramped in with heavy boots. The disturbance was caused by groups of non-students. It was suggested that Mr. Take Taniguchi approach these groups and appeal to them for cooperation in future high school socials.
3. It was brought out that sophomores and freshmen are too young for dances and their socials should be few and limited to get-togethers and parties.

The student council drafted up the following plan to ~~remedy poor outcomes of~~ ^{prevent future mishaps at} high school socials:

1. School socials are to be limited to students only. In the event that an outside guest may be brought by a student, that student will be responsible for his guest.
2. Two or more Policemen will patrol the Hall. One will be at the gate to keep out "crashers".
3. The sponsor of the social will be held responsible for the good management of the affair and the damages done, if any.
4. The Student Council will appoint or form a Committee on Management of High School Socials. All High School socials must be approved by and meet the requirements set up by this Committee.

Faculty advisers, Mr. Take Taniguchi and Mr. James Urata, will ask the Police Department for cooperation at future high school socials. If Mr. Potts approved of the work of Student Council in regard to policies for socials, a letter will be written by the Secretary and sent to Mr. Burdick asking for reconsideration in the matter of not letting the school use the mess halls for it's socials.

The meeting was adjourned.

Tots Ishida read the minutes of January 28, 1943. There were no additions or corrections to the minutes.

Mr. Taniguchi and Mr. Urata commented that to have the Police in a too prominent light at the school socials might tend to agitate the outsiders more than ever, consequently, the high school students will try to handle most situations and if and when the situation gets out of their hands, the police can come into the picture.

When the Advisers went to see Mr. Burdick about using the Mess Hall for the Junior Prom, Mr. Burdick explained that the rule ~~applied~~ of no socials in mess halls applied to the rest of the Recreation Dept. of the Camp, also. He approved of the Junior Prom and said that if the Mess Hall said o.k., the Juniors may have their Prom. Mess Hall 316 o.k.'d the request. The result of the Junior Prom will probably determine whether or not future high school socials will be allowed in Mess Halls.

The Council discussed the problem of the suspension ~~from school~~ of Minoru Koide. Everyone agreed that Minoru Koide was a fine student and that his suspension was undeserved. Miss Kazuko Nakamichi suggested that ~~members of~~ 4 or more members of Miss Rosenberry's Core Class meet with the Principal, tomorrow, during 4th period, and tell him the students' viewpoint on the problem.

Nomination petitions are to be handed in this week and the Student Council will take the responsibility to see that the offices of President and Vice-President have more than one candidates.
