Part-Time Employment:

Students who expect to secure part-time employment must first of all secure Offer of Employment at the school office counter and have it filled by the prospective employer. A Work Permit may then be issued by the school provided the request meets with the conditions outlined under Administrative Instruction 27, Revised, August 4, 1943 as follows:

Section 7, A-1-c, d:

- C. "Children 14 to 18 may be employed in non-factory employment, but only outside school hours."
- D. "Children attending school shall not be employed during school hours except as such employment is performed as an authorized part of vocational education within the school program."

Section 7-A-3:

- A. "Maximum hours of work for persons under 18 shall be 8 hours a day and 40 hours a week. The work week shall not exceed 6 days."
- B. "Ad equate provision shall be made for lunch period."
- C. "Combined hours of work and school for persons under 18 years of age shall not exceed 8 hours a day."
- D. "Each employed person under 18 shall have time off for an uninterrupted period of at least 12 hours nightly, starting no later than 9:00 p.m. and no earlier than 6:00 a.m."

Section A-d

- 4. "An examination by a physician to determine physical fitness shall be given persons under 18 before they are placed in any employment or vocational training requiring physical exertion."
- 5. "The project employment division shall not require a person under 18 years of age to work until his age has been determined by a birth certificate..."

Please note under A-1D above that "children attending school shall not be employed during school hours..." This means that students should not expect to be granted work permits for work between the hours of 7:40-2:40 according to our present time schedule.

Requests Regarding Changes of Program Cards:

Neither students nor teachers should make changes on program cards. Requests for changes in student program cards will be handled only by the principal, vice-principal or registrar beginning Tuesday, Sept. 21. Students should not expect changes unless their requests fall into one of the following categories and are supported by exceptionally good reasons:

1. Changes may be made in case of error in scheduling or in case the student did not get either his elective or alternate choice of subject.
2. In case there has been a radical change in educational plans following high school graduation, a student may make request, provided his request is well supported.
3. Exceptionally able students who wish to take an extra elective subject may be permitted to do so.

The foregoing indicates changes will be only for very good reasons. The advance registration sheet of last June has been followed by registration teachers and it is expected there will be very few changes.

Registration Cards:

All mimeographed sheets entitled Registration Cards must be turned in to the office. These sheets are the only records available at present. Students may make copies but they must return the mimeographed sheet to the registration teachers who will collect and forward them to Mr. Aihara.

Class Lists:

All teachers are requested to admit only students whose names appear on their class lists, unless they present an approved request for change of program signed by the principal or vice-principal.

Proposed Change in School Hours:

For the following reasons it seems desirable to consider change in school hours:

- (1) On account of early rising and consequent loss of sleep for young people
- (2) Hurried breakfast and probable poor digestion
- (3) Mess hall chiefs and kitchen workers are somewhat overtaxed with feeding students during early hours.
- (4) Class rooms are generally too dark during early morning hours thus contributing to eye strain and lastly,
- (5) Some mess halls have need of student part-time workers during breakfast hours. This is difficult when school starts at 7:40 a.m.

The majority of teachers favor the opening of school at 8:30 a.m. for both the elementary and secondary school divisions at earliest possible date. The teachers wish to have the combined opinion of students before final decision is made. Therefore, all core studies classes are asked to consider the problem and to report to principal's office Wednesday morning, October 6. The students are requested to consider all factors involved and not to think in terms of personal convenience.

Study Room Students' Use of the Library:

The special committee consisting of the principal, the vice-principal, the librarian and a classroom teacher met recently and recommended the following procedure in regard to the use of the school library:

- (1) Library hours will be as follows:

7:40 to 12:00 and 1:00 to 4:30 until the school day is changed to a later opening hour. Saturday hours from 8:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon.

- (2) Library permits will be required of all students who wish to use the library during study or class period. Permits will not be required before or after school hours nor on Saturdays. Class room and study room teachers will be provided with library permits. In order to save paper there will be space for several names on each permit.

- (3) Limit per Study Room:

On account of limited seating space in the library not more than the following number of students will be given permits in each study room daily.

A few seats will be reserved for students who may be sent from a class for special reference work during class time. The limit of students varies according to the total number of students at a given study period.

Time Schedule Change Beginning Monday.

Emergency Voluntary Work on New School Building

Announcements have already been made of the need for students voluntary work to be done on the new school buildings in order to finish them at the earliest possible date. Fire Prevention Regulations

All teachers are requested to study anew the fire prevention regulations issued last year in Administrative Circular #70. Please re-read section 7 especially, regarding Fire Prevention and Safety.

All students and teachers are reminded that where 50 or more persons are gathered together, a special permit must be obtained from the Fire Protection Officer, Mr. Raymond Peterson, whose office is at the Fire Station.

Fire Alarm and Procedure

Fire Alarm: The regular school bell will be used for a fire alarm.

Fire Signal: A series of rapid and continuous blows upon the fire alarm gong will be the signal for immediately observing the following procedure:

- (1) All pupils will quickly and quietly rise from their work. They will not attempt to carry anything with them.
- (2) Pupils will walk, not run, to the classroom door in single file, and walk to assembly points as directed by the teacher.
- (3) Assembly Points will be ordinarily as follows:
 - A and B room pupils will assemble along the street side.
 - C and D room pupils will assemble in the interior space of the block, well out of range of all buildings.
- (4) All pupils and teachers must remain at these room assembly points until the "all clear" signal is given. This will be the class call bell signal of three (3) strokes, repeated slowly. Do not re-enter any building at any time after the alarm until the "all clear" signal is heard.
- (5) All pupils and teachers must observe all the foregoing rules promptly and intelligently. If unforeseen circumstances arise coincident with a fire alarm, the situation must be met with judgment and decision.
- (6) A final word: Respect all fire alarm signals. There may be a fire or it may only be a drill. In either case please cooperate, for safety's sake.

SPECIAL BULLETIN

To all secondary division teachers and students:

Please give your immediate attention to the following announcements:

Moving Day, Wednesday, November 10, Time: 1:00-5:00:

In a conference last evening the school principal and the Building Construction foreman and Mr. Crawford agreed that it was possible and highly desirable to begin moving into the new building at the earliest possible moment in order that the school will be better situated. It is expected that the State of Arizona High School Visiting Committee will arrive sometime this week or possibly next.

Therefore a decision has been made to begin actual moving Wednesday afternoon at 1:00 p.m. There is much cleaning and preliminary work to be done as well as actual moving of furniture. All students and teachers are therefore requested to cooperate fully in all of the following plans:

- 1) Students and teachers should familiarize themselves with the attached schedule and room assignment on the new campus. Room labels will be posted today on the new campus.
- 2) All 7th period teachers and students are requested to make an excursion to the new assigned room and to begin cleaning today and to make careful plans for moving of furniture tomorrow at 1:00. All students are urged to bring cloths to dust and clean windows, desks, etc. There are no cloths available within the school.
- 3) 7th period students will report to the 7th period teachers Wednesday at 1:00 in the regular Block 210 classroom. At that time all students will be expected to cooperate fully in the actual moving of tables and chairs from the present rooms to the new rooms. Trucks will be available only for moving of heavy articles such as teachers' desks, typewriters, machinery, sewing machines, etc. It is hoped that photographs can be taken of this historical occasion showing students carrying tables and chairs down the road to the new school. (El Chapparal staff please note.)

It is likely that 2 or more trips will need to be made in order to complete the job of moving light furniture. Teachers will be responsible for supervising the moving of all furniture and equipment now assigned to their classroom. Teacher's desk, globes, maps, etc. should be assembled and labeled with the new room number. The school business manager will assign available trucks to pick up these articles during the afternoon.

- 4) There will be a meeting of all secondary division teachers and assistant teachers in the school library at 4:00 this afternoon (Tuesday). Your attendance is required. Please be prompt.

- 5) In view of the chief objective of moving this week, which is securing accreditation by the State of Arizona, it seems necessary to expect that there be no conflicting activities such as social events, picnic, etc.

- 6) Reminder regarding moving into and use and care of new building.

Teachers are asked to carefully re-read and explain to the students the contents of Dr. Harris' circular letter on use and care of new adobe buildings, especially the detail on the third paragraph. In short, advice on the care of the school may be summed in two words "hands off", unless absolutely necessary. Students should be careful that their shoes are clean before entering the room. There will be a real dust problem both inside and outside of classroom unless we are all very careful and cooperative.

7) The classes in science, shorthand, agriculture, mechanical drawing, and autoshop taught by Miss Nevil, Miss Tsumura, Mr. Nishimura, Mr. Ikeda and Mr. Hatakeda will have to occupy other than their permanent rooms until the last building is finished, which should be early next week. This is the reason for the word "temporarily" on the attached schedule of room numbers.

8) Room Cleaning

The cleaning of classrooms will be a greater problem than ever before. Rooms must be swept and dusted daily. Efforts are being made to secure sweeping compound and adequate room cleaning supplies. It is impossible to expect the present staff of janitors to be able to clean all classroom, and it is unlikely to be enough persons to do a complete job of cleaning. To date we have not been able to secure even a few full time or part time janitors. Therefore, it seems absolutely necessary for all 7th pd. students to cooperate in daily cleaning of classrooms immediately after 7th period classes. A committee of classroom cleaners should be chosen to serve each week, in cleaning 7th period rooms.

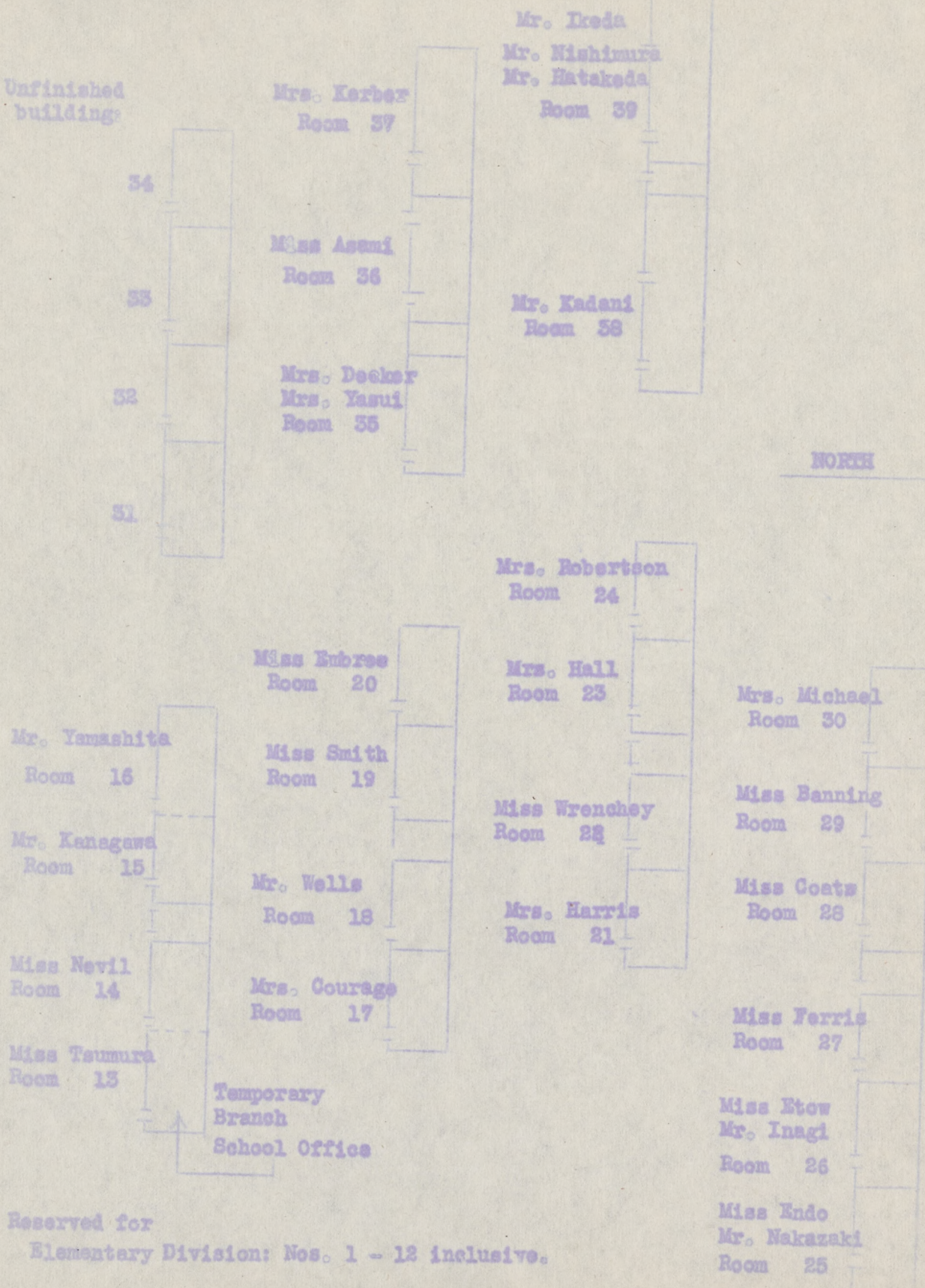
9) All teachers are asked to keep records of students who do exceptionally good work in moving, cleaning and "settling down" in the new buildings.

"Little Man, You've Had a Busy Day"

This could have been said of every boy and girl of our school last evening! Such hard work and such splendid cooperation from so many persons in such a cheerful and enthusiastic manner! Truly, "many hands make light work"! At least this is the impression gained when considering the size of the job undertaken. Over 1000 man-hours of work done!

The sincere thanks of everyone are due every single boy and girl and teacher. We should all appreciate each other's efforts today and everyday. Let us all strive to also appreciate our new campus and to make it ever worthier of our greater appreciation.

Missing Keys:

The only thing that tends to mar our general satisfaction with Wednesday's moving day is the discovery that six pairs of keys are missing to classroom and toilet doors. All keys were placed in the doors yesterday afternoon for the teachers and business manager to collect. It seems likely that some one or more students removed the keys from the doors and forgot to turn them in to the teacher, business manager or principal. These keys are urgently needed. It is hoped therefore, that the person or persons responsible will turn these keys in today to Mr. Aihara, Registrar, room 13, new campus. There will be no penalty or scolding following the return of the keys. We assume that the keys are missing on account of excitement or thoughtlessness, not maliciousness.

Window-Opening and Closing:

Inasmuch as there are no window locks, the woodshop teacher, Mr. Kadani, has been asked to make two props for each window and to install channel stops for the top sash to rest upon when open. This will take a little time to complete. In the meantime all teachers and students are urged to be especially careful about the personal and school property and to report promptly all missing items.

Window Cleaning:

Window cleaning will become a much simpler process if rags coated with turpentine or linseed oil are used on the window panes. Most of the discoloration is not paint but dried linseed oil left from application of putty. After this has been removed, razor blades may be used to scrap off small spots of paint.

Daily Attendance Report:

These should be sent daily to Mr. Aihara in the temporary branch school office in room 13.

Teachers' Daily Register:

Teachers will sign "in" and "out" daily in the branch school office, room 13, instead of reporting to the main school office. After a few days it is hoped that ^{the} mail box will be installed.

Use of telephone:

A telephone will be installed in the branch office soon. This will be used for school business or emergency only as is the case in the school office.

Heating Stoves:

It is reported that heating stoves are in or near Poston and that they will be installed soon. In the meantime experience in Poston III High School indicates that by closing classroom windows in the late afternoon, warm air is retained, making the room fairly comfortable in the morning. As soon as window props are made, this procedure can be followed in our school.

Interior Decoration and Classroom Arrangements:

Our buildings are such a beautiful contrast to our former location that we want to enjoy them and keep them always looking neat and clean and attractive. It seems that some plans and some rules should probably be made governing the matter of interior decoration. Until such a plan is developed it is urged that teachers and students be extremely careful to avoid driving nails and screws into woodwork unless this is necessary and according to a permanent plan. We want our classrooms to look attractive so whatever we do in them should be with that thought in mind.

Bonfires:

As a matter of extra precaution, students and teachers are requested not to build bonfires on the new campus. We do not wish to be responsible for ~~all~~ possible damage nor to mar the appearance of our campus with black, smudgy ash heaps.

Student Parties and Pastries:

Information has just been received that student groups, without authorization from any source, have requested cakes, doughnuts, and pastries be baked by the chef in the 210 mess hall for the various parties in the past few weeks. All requests for special baking must be directed to Unit II Project Steward, Mr. E. L. Maxcy, who will decide whether the request comes within the project regulations. It is not proper for these requests to go to Block 210 mess hall chef who, in trying to be helpful and cooperative, may be making matters difficult for himself.

In regard to student parties, a form is being prepared to regulate and systemize the planning and reporting of such an event.

Accreditation Process Begins Next Week:

Word has just been received that the High School Visitor, Mr. O. K. Garretson, will arrive in Poston early next week for the purpose of rating Poston high schools. Now that we are settled in our new plant, it would seem wise to call attention to certain matters both from the standpoint of high school rating and also from the standpoint of building a good school regardless of whether we are rated A, B or X by other agencies. After all, our chief aim is to build a good school and not simply to secure a rating based on one week's behavior. Let us therefore note carefully the following:

- 1) All students are to attend all classes and study rooms regularly. No classes are to be dismissed for any reason, not even 5 minutes early, especially afternoon. If any student has an unassigned period, this is an error and should be corrected at once. Students should come to the office and teachers should report the names of those who are not assigned to a class or study room for every period of the day. A very bad impression is created when students are seen roving about the campus during class hours.
- 2) In passing between class periods, students are requested to avoid disturbing double period classes in session and to keep reasonably quiet at all times when passing near any building or along the verandas. Also students are urged to be careful about creating unnecessary dust clouds while crossing between buildings. It is planned to sprinkle the ground soon during the weekend.
- 3) It should be understood by now that it is not appropriate for students to smoke on the high school campus or while attending high school events of any kind. Such practice does not contribute to the good reputation of the school.
- 4) It seems unbelievable, but nevertheless a report has been made that certain students yesterday carried away part of the shelves of the new science cabinets that are to be installed in the Science Building. It is hard to believe that students would be so willing to take away anything from the new buildings that have been provided at such a great expense of money and labor. The report is very discouraging. All teachers and students are urged to report all instances of removed property of any kind and of all missing and broken items without delay.
- 5) Physical education students are requested to play at some distance from other classroom in order not to disturb.
- 6) Classroom seating and lighting should conform to recognized educational standards. Briefly these are:
 - a) No child should face glare from any source if at all possible.
 - b) In general natural light should come from the left, especially when one is writing, in order to avoid working in one's own shadow.
 - c) Aisle space should be approximately 30" from the student table to the nearest walls and not less than 18" between tables.
 - d) The teacher's desk should not be located near the window. It should be located in the front of the classroom, approximately half way between the door and middle of the room. In this location students are less likely to face glare even though the classroom door is opened.

Deviation from the foregoing will be considered only in case of special classrooms and special conditions, provide always that we observe the recognized principles of sight conservation.

7) Monday Will Be Check Day

In order that we may have at least one day to check on the procedure and all the reminders mentioned in the foregoing paragraphs, Monday is hereby declared as Check Day. By Saturday noon we should have all classrooms thoroughly cleaned, including windows, and everything in shipshape order to run under full steam all day Monday and thereafter. Monday will be a dress rehearsal for the remainder of the year. Let us therefore make it a good one and practice what we know is right and proper. Psychology teaches us that we are and we become whatever we do and practice. A right start and a determination to continue in the right direction will make our school life pleasant and profitable throughout the year.

Change in Project Working Hours:

Word has been received indirectly that project working hours are changing beginning Monday, November 15, so that working day runs from 8:30-12:00 a.m. and 1:00-5:30 p.m. Monday through Friday, and 8:30 a.m. -12:30 p.m. on Saturday, except for appointed personnel who will be on duty from 1:30-5:30 on Saturday afternoon. Breakfast is scheduled for 7:30, lunch for 12:15 and dinner at 6:00. Lunch on Saturday will be at 12:45.

Because there is no change in lunch hour on school days, there will be no change in the secondary division time schedule as published October 14, 1943. Classes will begin

at 8:30 a.m. as usual in order that we may continue to have four periods before lunch. This means that all teachers will be expected to report for duty before 8:30 a.m. and that all students will report promptly at 8:30 a.m. as usual. Note that the lunch hour remains the same, 12:00-1:00. All students and teachers will be expected to be in class at 1:00 as usual.

This schedule will continue in effect until further notice. Suggestions or improvements are in order.

School Library Hours:

In order to accommodate students who wish to use the school library, the librarian, Miss Sue Kobayashi, has arranged to keep the library opened from 7:00-9:00 p.m. on Mondays and Thursdays until further notice.

To all teachers and students:

The State High School Visitor, Mr. Garretson and a representative from the Department of Public Instruction of State of Arizona, Mr. Asten, spent an hour with us yesterday morning just before lunch, and even in that short time made a friendly and careful inspection of our school. It is expected that they will make a report later.

This school was in almost perfect working order in spite of the unfinished nature of some of our buildings. Everyone was perfectly natural in manner and in attitude that all students and teachers could "feel" the difference, could sense the improved atmosphere of the school, partly because of the new buildings themselves and partly because of interest in the accreditation and rating process. I am sure all agree that lately we have been having more of a real school than ever before. Recently we have been operating as normal American public high school. I am sure that all of us are going to want to keep on feeling full of pride in our school buildings and in our conduct and school morale, then we may be proud to have other visitors, parents and patrons, from our own community as well as visitors from the "outside".

Assembly Friday Afternoon

Arrangements have just been made with Mr. Mayeda, Community Activities Director, for Mr. Masao Satow, Y.M.C.A. Secretary, formerly of Los Angeles, to speak in a secondary school assembly on Friday, Nov. 19 at 2:30 in the 210 Mess Hall.

All classes will be shortened to 40 minutes each with 5 periods before lunch and periods 6 & 7 after lunch. 8:30 - 9:50, 10:00 - 12:00 and 1:00-2:20. All students, boys and girls, of the Jr. and Sr. High School, grades 7-12, are expected to attend the assembly. The hour has been set at 2:30 in order not to interfere with athletic practice and other scheduled activities. Mr. Satow will probably speak about his travels over the country and of problems and conditions of living on the "outside."

Registration of Events:

A new form has been prepared for the use of all school organizations in the registering of all special events, both outside of class and during class hours, when the latter procedure has been agreed upon as a desirable school policy, such as Christmas parties during school hours, etc. A copy of this form is attached for posting and study by teachers and students. It is hoped that this form will help organization leaders to make more careful plans in advance and also to make worthwhile reports after the event.

School Calendar:

The school calendar is still in the process of being developed. As soon as it is completed the major events of the year will be published. The student School Calendar Committee composed of organization vice-principals should meet soon to make some final decision.

The School Calendar is a wartime calendar and therefore, makes no provision for any special holidays except Christmas which falls on Saturday, December 25. However, students may expect a week of vacation between Christmas and New Year, and another week immediately before Easter Sunday which falls on April 24, unless there is insistent demand for changes in the foregoing. Teachers will be on special duty during these two weeks unless they are planning to leave the project thus using their annual vacation time. The Poston High School principals and the Director of Education desire to have all schools close on the same date, June 10, 1944. Because Poston II School began on September 20 and other schools could not, the two weeks of vacation indicated above are possible for this school only this year. The other high schools are making up time lost by having Saturday classes for a few weeks.

Reports of Vandalism:

Reports are coming in that are quite discouraging. A very few individuals apparently have little respect for new school buildings. We may assume that they are students but hope that we are wrong. Someone has damaged a blackboard in room 22, and someone has thrown a bottle full of ink against the window of room 30. Some damage may result from carelessness as in the case of doors slamming or opening too wide, but vandalism is malicious and cannot be excused. It is hoped that students themselves can correct the few wayward ones before the damage becomes greater.

Mid-semester Report to Parents:

The faculty has discussed the matter of reports to parents at some length. In the last meeting it was decided that no formal written report will be required of teachers for all students at this time except for students who are doing failing or unsatisfactory work. This means that students may confer with teachers in case no written report is made and talk over problems and progress to date. Teachers may request students to confer with them this week and next. In other words, reports whether oral or written will be made to students depending upon the method used by teachers and written reports will be made to parents only in case of unsatisfactory student progress. Athletes who represent the school will be specially rated in order to determine whether they may continue to play during the second quarter of the year.

Building and Campus Cleaning:

Student's responsibilities and duties: As announced previously, it is expected that all students will share in the cleaning of 7th period classrooms every afternoon after school by means of weekly cleaning committee organized in the classrooms. It is also expected that these classroom cleaning committees will sweep lanais daily and pick up papers and rubbish between the classroom and adjacent building. It is expected that 7th period teachers will supervise and check up on the quality of daily cleaning done.

All 7th period students can assist the cleaners by carefully lifting chairs to the table tops immediately after dismissal. Classroom cleaners and teachers are requested to observe the following:

- 1) There must be no sweeping of classrooms while classes are in session. Rooms may be tidied during the day and dusted as often as necessary provided that dust in the air is not created unnecessarily. Dust cloths should be dampened with water or furniture polish. See your building janitor for supplies.
- 2) Use sweeping compound on floors as dust preventative. The present supply of saw dust compound is not wholly satisfactory. However, it is planned that a more satisfactory sweeping compound will be made soon.
- 3) Classroom cleaners are requested to refrain from dusting blackboard erasers against the buildings or lanai posts. Several unsightly spots have already appeared. These should be properly cleaned at once.
- 4) Classroom cleaners should occasionally wipe finger marks from doors, door frames, window frames, window sills, blackboard frames, etc., with dampened cloth, being careful not to use soap or abrasives on painted surfaces. Window sills should be waxed.

Janitor's responsibilities and duties: Both full-time and part-time secondary division janitors will work under the direct supervision of the vice-principal. They will be responsible for cleaning a few classrooms without 7th period students, all lavatories, office library and the auditorium (when this is completed). They will also light, check and fill class-room heating stoves and if time permits, work in assigned special maintenance jobs. Protecting Building Roofs:

There are too many instances of students on the roofs of certain school buildings. Walking on the roofing paper tends to crack it and also spoil the insulation placed there to keep out the heat of summer.

In order that there will be no excuse for climbing to the roofs of the buildings, all physical education activities will be moved to a farther distance, especially from Building 4. Thereafter, no students will not be permitted on the roof of any building without previous consent from the principal or the vice-principal.

Announcements Regarding Christmas Parties on the Closing Day:

The School Calendar Committee and the principal have agreed that Christmas parties may be organized to be conducted from 2:30 on Wednesday afternoon, December 22. All classes will be shortened to 40 minutes each on Wednesday.

It is understood that any group wishing to use a room must have the approval of the teacher of that room in advance, and follow whatever special rules are laid down.

New Attendance Regulations and Procedures:

New At attendance regulations and forms are being prepared and distributed to all classrooms this week for study prior to the effective date which will be Monday, January 3, 1944. The chief improvements in the procedures include:

- 1) The use of a Student Campus Pass for all students who leave classroom or study-room for any reason. This is intended to reduce the number of students who seem to wander aimlessly about the campus.
- 2) Clinic Appointment and Report form which will be required of all students who need to have medical and dental work done during school hours.
- 3) Rules and regulations tending to conserve instructional time such as 3 minutes tardy rule, and a rule against early dismissal of classes.
- 4) A requirement that all studies missed on account of absence must be made up to the satisfaction of teacher or teachers concerned.
- 5) A detention room will be established to take care of tardy and absent students who may be assigned to make up lost time.
- 6) Emphasis upon student's responsibilities and procedures following absence or tardiness.
- 7) Finally, an attempt has been made to indicate responsibilities of all persons: students, teachers attendance office staff; and to describe the nature of the forms being put into use.

It is sincerely hoped that this new procedure will be carefully studied and observed by all. This is a nice illustration of the need for cooperation in order that we may have good attendance habits and records of those habits.

School Library Moving to New Campus:

Now that the science building is completed, students and teachers will be very happy to know that school library will be moved to Room 14 on Monday, December 20. It will be ready for use within a short time after that. Please give the library staff time to get settled before making demands upon their time.

Use of the Term "Adobe":

The term "adobe" which refers to a kind of mud has already gained considerable headway with reference to the new high school plant. While we have justifiable pride in using school buildings made by the hands of our parents and friends out of the soil of this area, it seems possible that we might refer to the buildings in some other manner than in referring to their basic material of construction. It is suggested that the terminology be simply new school campus until such time as elementary division moves down.

X-Raying of High School Students:

The Poston Public Health Department has made plan for X-raying all senior high school students during the Christmas vacation. The exact schedule of dates cannot be announced today because of the effect of influenza on the X-ray staff. The plan calls for transporting 25 students each morning and 25 students each afternoon except for Christmas day and New Year's day. This X-raying is a part of the general health program for Poston. Mess Hall workers have been X-rayed and teachers are in the process of completion. It is hoped that every student will cooperate fully by reporting promptly on the day and hour that they may be assigned. Please watch for further notice either in the School Bulletin or through other channels such as mess hall announcement, bulletin board, etc.

Use of Franked Envelopes and Labels:

All students and teachers are requested to note that franked envelopes and labels are to be used for official approved correspondence only. Franked labels are available for mailing school newspaper to other schools. All other requests for use of franked envelopes or labels must be directed to the Principal's secretary. Copies of letters or communication must be submitted at the time of request for the approval of the principal.

Change in the Daily Class Schedule:

The change of Poston Time from Mountain War Time to Pacific War Time and the change in the working hours for the Poston will make no change in the daily class schedule. We shall continue to have 4 periods before lunch and 3 after lunch. At least until hot season descends upon us.

However, the attendance procedure now being distributed requires an additional 5 minutes of time for period 1 daily, and it is noted that lunch bells will ring hereafter at 12:10 instead of 12:15. It therefore seems necessary to announce that the following schedule will be effective Tuesday morning, December 21:

Infantile Paralysis Campaign

The following is quoted from a bulletin by Dr. Harris, Superintendent of Schools:

"During the past year, Poston was visited by a mild epidemic of Infantile Paralysis. Thus, the people of Poston know from first hand experience, the constant threat which this dreaded childhood disease constitutes for any community. Last January, the members of the Young Buddhist Association of Poston sponsored a "President's Ball" on January 29th, and donated the proceeds to the work done in Poston in combating Infantile Paralysis. This year, it is the desire of a number of people of the community to devote a great deal more time and attention to the educational, money raising, and preventive aspects of the fight against Infantile Paralysis."

A Unit II committee has been considering plans suggested by a committee representing Department of Public Health, Department of Education, and Y.B.A. Plans include an essay contest for senior high school students only, and a poster contest in each of the three levels of school: elementary division, junior high school division and senior high school division. Prizes will be awarded in each contest and in each division. It has been suggested that essays be not more than 500 words in length, and that posters be of uniform size, 16 x 22". It has also been suggested that emphasis on both essays and posters should be on Infantile Paralysis as both a community and a national problem. Completed posters and essays should be presented to the respective high school principal on Monday, January 17. They will be assembled in the office of the Superintendent of Schools for judging on Tuesday, January 18th. Selected essays will be published in the Poston Chronicle and posters will be exhibited in the various mess halls throughout the campaign which lasts from January 14 to January 19. Winners of the essay contest and poster contests will be announced, and prizes will be awarded on the eve of "President's Ball", January 29. Worthwhile prizes are being planned for the contest winners.

Although the time is very short, it is hoped that as large a number of Poston II School students will enter one or both of these contests. The Unit II committee plans for prizes for the winner of each classroom of the elementary school and of each core studies class in secondary division. This means that teachers and students concerned must make a selection of winning poster or essay, and submit the same to the principal's office before 3:30 Monday afternoon, January 17th. *

Loss of Woodshop Tools:

A recent check of woodshop inventory by the teacher, Mr. Otis Kadani, and the business manager reveals a loss of 22 different woodshop tools including 7 pliers; 2 wood chisels; 1 claw hammer, 12 oz.; 1 ballpein hammer, 3" head, $\frac{3}{4}$ " pein; 1 compass saw; 1 hack saw frame, metal handle; 5 carriage clamps-6" and 8"; and 4 wood mallets. The loss of these tools, whether through carelessness or maliciousness, means that the teacher, who is responsible for all government property under his supervision, is expected to pay for the loss, according to the official announcement dated January 3, 1944, and referred to in the Principal's Office Bulletin #11 dated February 21.

Payment for the 22 woodshop tools may prove to be something of a hardship to a teacher who is earning a cash allowance of \$16.00 a month. I therefore appeal to all teachers and students, woodshop students and others, to make a thorough search for the articles listed above and to assist Mr. Kadani in securing his release by locating and returning the tools directly to him at his home in Block 211.

It is not intended that anyone would be embarrassed or prosecuted for the return of the property to Mr. Kadani. It is my belief that these tools are missing largely on account of thoughtlessness. The important thing is to have these tools returned this week in order that Mr. Kadani may continue to plan on leaving Poston on March 28 with a clear record behind him.

It seems fair to state that probably most of the missing tools were either borrowed without a record or were taken from the shop. It is well known that Mr. Kadani was inclined to practice the "honor system" in loaning out the key and having students go into the woodshop at their convenience. This trust may have been violated by some students. The effect now is that Mr. Kadani will suffer from his kindness and generosity unless certain persons' consciences are stirred to the point of returning the missing tools. The cooperation of all persons will be appreciated in this matter.

National Honor Society Membership

The Poston II High School chapter of the National Honor Society wishes to announce that the following new members have been elected to membership by the faculty council. These persons will be inducted before the close of school.

In order to be elected to membership in accordance to the constitution of the chapter, students must have attained a B plus average in scholarship and the same standing in the following three factors: Leadership, Service and Character.

The following procedure was used in selecting members this year.

- 1st: The school records for the first semester were examined to determine all students of grades 10, 11, 12, who attained a B plus average.
- 2nd: The records of these students in one above were checked against 3rd quarter marks to determine whether there was any loss in standing. If the scholastic standing had declined the student was dropped from the list of candidates.
- 3rd: The student's class room teachers rated the student on, leadership, service and character.
- 4th: The National Honor Society faculty council reviewed all these records and made final selection.

It should be noted that there are some students whose records at the end of the first semester were not sufficiently outstanding, but who showed definite progress at the end of the 3rd quarter. If these or any other students attain B plus average at the end of the semester, they will be eligible for consideration next semester when the newschool term opens.

The attention of all students and teachers is directed to the following excerpt from the local chapter constitution.

ARTICLE II

MEMBERSHIP

Section 1. Membership of this chapter shall be known as active and graduate. The graduate members have no vote.

Section 2. Membership in this chapter shall be based on scholarship, service, leadership, and character.

Section 3. Candidates shall have spent at least one year in Poston II High School, and shall be members of the Junior or Senior class. Candidates eligible to election to the chapter shall have a scholarship average of B+ - A. This scholastic level of achievement shall remain fixed, and shall be for this chapter the required scholastic achievement for admission to candidacy for membership in this chapter, and all pupils who can rise in scholarship to or above such standard level shall be admitted to candidacy for election to membership. Their eligibility shall then be considered on their service, leadership, and character.

Section 4. Members of the Sophomore class may be chosen as probationary members of the chapter of the Senior Honor Society, if they satisfy all corresponding requirements placed upon candidates from the Junior and Senior class.

Section 5. Such probationary members shall have voice and vote in the chapter but may not hold office. If they maintain high standards and live up to the requirements of the chapter, they may be chosen to full membership in the chapter in their Junior or their Senior year.

Section 6. Any member of the faculty may propose to the council the names of pupils eligible for membership in the chapter.

Section 7. Any active member who falls below the standards which were the basis for his election to membership shall be dropped from the chapter by a majority vote of the faculty upon the recommendation of the council.

Section 8. If so dropped, his emblem shall be returned to the president of this chapter.

Use of 210 Mess Hall:

The Unit II Steward Department and the 210 Mess hall chef have been most kind and generous in permitting organizations within the school to use the 210 mess hall this year. The very frequent social affairs in the 210 mess hall conducted both by the school and by the various community organizations have caused an unusual amount of extra work and concern for the 210 mess hall chef. Almost without exception after a social affair the mess hall has been left in an unsatisfactory condition for Monday morning when the primary children's lunch must be prepared as usual. There has also been a deplorable tendency for students to disregard the instructions of the chef who is of course responsible for the condition of the mess hall and for the use of the equipment and food contained therein.

The chef has been more than generous with both his time and patience. He has stated to me that he would be willing for the students to have a party every night as far as he is concerned, provided that his instructions were followed and that the mess hall was placed in perfect order for the following day's work.

It is my understanding that community organizations are not now permitted to use the 210 mess hall. It therefore seems entirely proper that for this and other reasons indicated in the foregoing paragraphs the high school should not be given preference in this matter. Therefore, as the responsible head of this school, I wish to have it understood that I shall not approve any request for the use of 210 mess hall by any school activities with the exception of the Senior Banquet on June 6.
