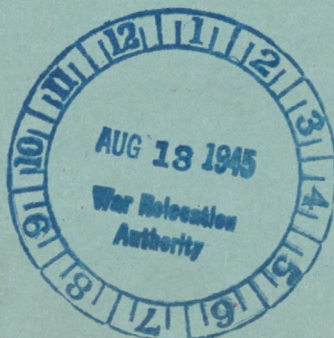

The transferees from Tule Lake in September consisted of many large families. This together with the fact that we received approximately 150 more persons than anticipated, made the assignment of apartments difficult.

A problem facing us today is the shortage of the 20x16 and 20x20 apartments. Families of sixes who are overcrowded in single 20x24 apartments desire additional 20x16 apartments. Single men and women dislike living in so-called "bachelor" and "single women's quarters", and request to be transferred to the small apartments in groups of two. This insufficient number of small rooms also makes the adjustment of overhoused families of twos and threes impossible.

All figures count slightly more than 600 persons on seasonal leaves for whom space is held.

Considerable adjustments will be necessary during the future to reduce the large number of over-housed apartments left because of relocation. Families of five become families of three; and the adjustments necessary to house these people in the proper amount of space, at the same time keeping the Topaz residents in a reasonably happy frame of mind will be a rather complicated problem.

In connection with consolidation of space, single people continue to be a major problem. These people, in many instances those living in "filled up" quarters, are continually requesting to be moved because of room-mate troubles. Their moving to other quarters does not help the housing situation as they leave overhoused apartments. Also, single people who happen to be living alone because of relocation of family members or room-mates, as the case may be, invariably refuse to team up with others in the same position, all of which makes uniform assignment of space throughout the project difficult.

Overhoused apartments resulting from parts of families relocating make it imperative that we obtain more 20x16 apartments for adjustments. Serious thought is being given to the possibility of re-partitioning into small apartments the twelve barracks currently used by the elementary schools. Such a program will make it possible for singles to live in pairs, thereby eliminating to a great degree the ever-present bachelor problem resulting from their living in larger groups.

On the other hand, a minimum of 2 persons, 3 persons, 4 persons, and 5 persons is required for each respective apartment size, (20x16, 20x20, 20x24, and 20x28) when adjustments or new assignments are made. Since singles are spread out rather thinly, we rarely grant vacant apartments to them, preferring to make all adjustments and assignments within already established "bachelor quarters".

Accomplishments for the month.

a. Finance Section

The budget estimates for the Fourth Quarter were compiled and transmitted to the Washington office on February 26, 1944. The various sections of the project cooperated fully in assisting the Finance Section and the budget as submitted was under the \$1.20 per month average.

Work has been going forward in reconciliation of inventory which was completed in January and since the reorganization by consolidation of warehouse offices, it is considered that the property control and warehouse records will cause little difficulty in the future.

Recently, auditors for the Union Pacific Railroad visited this project and gave us assistance in clearing up a number of old outstanding freight bills. These bills were carry-overs from prior to July 1, 1943. All current freight items are being cleared promptly.

The warehouse unit now has the burden of delivering coal from the stock pile to the blocks due to the fact that balance of our contract were cancelled during the month of February. It is estimated that there is a sufficient supply of coal in the stock piles to fill our needs through December, 1944.

b. Office Services Section

This section is operated efficiently and has its full staff of resident personnel. However, the appointed file clerk was recently transferred and every effort is being made to fill this position.

c. Personnel Section

The continual turn-over in appointed personnel creates considerable volume of work in processing personnel transactions, maintaining personnel records and preparing regular and special reports.

All sections have cooperated in bringing the resident employment within the ceiling set by the Washington office. A recent survey through the Block Managers indicates that there are a few unemployed in the center at this time.

d. Supply Section

In the Mess Management Unit, everything has been running smoothly during the past month and the supply of all foodstuffs have been ample and particularly favorable concerning fresh vegetables.

The tofu factory will be in operation sometime during March and it is considered that this will be a real asset to the food supply.

The preparation of diets in the dining hall kitchens continues to present difficulties due to the fact that we have never been able to employ a dietitian on the hospital staff. We are informed that a dietitian will probably be employed during the next month and plans are underway for establishing a diet kitchen in block 2, and if these plans develop, difficulties concerning diets should be overcome.

e. General Remarks

Discussions developing from the recent visit of Mr. Stevens of the Civil Service Commission and Mr. James of the W.R.A. Personnel Office, we feel certain will improve the communication problem in this project. It is apparent that all sections and units are interested and appreciate that in the past we have taken too much for granted as to the availability of necessary information for some of the unit heads and group workers throughout the project.

In general, we consider conditions throughout the Administrative Division to be very good and cooperation by the sections excellent.

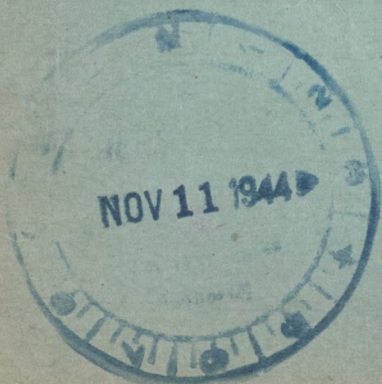
