July 15, 42 - Ford issued critical statement
to press, sent it to Los Angeles Times, Walt Paper

Criticize Personnel Change -
WRA for WPA. - ~~even~~ Japs don't like it!
since WRA - social program.
Committee preferred & insisted on also
among methods. No like college program
"How that we have the Japanese
in Camp 1, & now that they are satisfied

to stay there, we see no reason why this
certain group should initiate other ideas
which would take these people out of
the camps when we have just gotten
them in."

Comm. He also told for 1st time that
5 or 6,000 Japs allowed to go into
Utah. (Third lie, voluntary evacuation
was public!)


