MEMORANDUM TO: Reports Office

SUBJECT : Quarterly Report covering January 1 -
March 31, 1943.

A review of the past quarter shows two outstanding developments. During the first part of the quarter the Health Department, including hospital operation and public health facilities, was operating with considerable smoothness and efficiency. Although we had by no means reached the ideal, yet we had risen to that point where the various hospital departments were well coordinated, showing gradual but steady advancement, and were working smoothly together. The first part of the quarter, therefore, showed us operating at what might be called the peak of efficiency.

Following this period and roughly during the last quarter, there has been a gradual decline in the smoothness of operation and, in general, no further advancement. This has been due to the gradual loss of essential personnel through Army and Relocation programs. Unfortunately for us, the loss has in most instances affected our key personnel. Furthermore, due to the specialized training which is necessary for the filling of many of our hospital positions, replacements have so far been impossible, and the outlook from outside sources is not promising at this time. Due to the deficiency in our hospital personnel, especially graduate and student nurses, two wards in our hospital yet remain unopened.

About 70% of all our student nurses have already entered training schools. 25% of our registered nurses have also gone. 50% of our trained personnel in the laboratory have already left, and the other 50% are expecting to leave momentarily. No new replacements have as yet been found, and the outlook is not promising. The pharmacy department is suffering and is expected to suffer similar mortality. Our two trained dietitians have already been lost from the pay roll. 4/5 of our property department personnel have already been lost. The Chief Sanitation Officer is expected to leave momentarily for Army duty. Two doctors are expected to leave very shortly for Army duty and one for relocation.

The outlook for our whole health program as seen in the last part of the quarter compared to the first part is very discouraging. It appears, therefore, that the trend at present is towards a gradual but steady decline in our whole health organization. So far the general health of the evacuees has not suffered too much, and on the whole, the health standards are good. The sanitary conditions throughout the Project remain in fairly good condition, and no epidemics or serious illness have resulted. With the onset of warm summer weather, with the loss of our Chief Sanitation Officer, and with the difficulty which we are experiencing in obtaining certain items of construction necessary for improving sanitary conditions, the opinion for future sanitary conditions of the Project must remain guarded.

There has been a slight increase in the number of mental cases which have come to our attention, and the number institutionalized has shown an increase. We had 62 births during this quarter and 15 deaths. Aside from a small epidemic of chicken pox communicable disease cases reported were comparable to that of a city of this size and probably slightly below. The number of treatments given in the medical, surgical, dental, optometry and other outpatient departments is still averaging about 6,000 treatments per month.

There has been, as yet, no improvement in the difficulty which we have been experiencing in obtaining hospital materials and supplies. We anticipate with the new Army procurement program some improvement in this category.

Although most health departments have shown somewhat of a decline, we have made some progress in the field of public health education. A rather extensive education program is underway through the channels of the schools and the block managers. Barring loss of personnel now carrying on this work, we expect this program to go forward during the coming quarter.
