All kitchen employees, regardless of age, who have children, brothers or sisters at home with any infectious diseases ( refer to attached list ) are ordered to stay at home until such quarantine is lifted by the Public Health Officer.

Too many cases of Chickenpox have occurred in Camp 3 because the children were not isolated properly and many cases not reported. Several adults have contracted Chickenpox so that extra care must be observed in the future for the welfare of the entire community.

When the Doctor finds a communicable disease present in a family, the family will be informed by him of the nature of the disease and a quarantine enforced.

The cooperation of all kitchen employees is necessary as each contact is a potential carrier of all communicable diseases.

All kitchen stewards will please explain this memo to all Issei employees so that they will understand clearly what is desired.
