COLONY TO COMMEMORATE MEIJI SETSU TOMORROW

Commemorating the birth of Meiji Tenno, a center holiday tomorrow will mark the second celebration of Meiji Setsu held in Tule Lake. Majority of the residents will observe the holiday with only workers engaged in essential services being required to report for duty.

As the promulgator of constitutional government, Meiji Tenno is a symbolic figure in the birth and rise of modern Japan. It was during his 45 years of reign that the groundwork

WRA TAKES STEP TO CLOSE LEUPP CENTER

WRA representatives are now making a complete inventory of property at the Leupp Center as a preliminary step in the termination of the agreement between WRA and the Indian Service concerning its use, stated the Gila News-Courier recently.

Leupp was opened April, 1943, with the transfer of evacuees from the isolation center at Moab, Utah. It was closed Dec. 2, 1943, after its residents were transferred to Tule Lake and the relocation centers. Since that time it has been in the care of a WRA custodian.

CLEVELAND WRA REPORTS ON FIRE

A recent Cleveland gas explosion disaster in which 112 dead and 104 missing have been listed was reported this week in the Time Magazine. Today the Cleveland WRA Office said that no evacuees were injured in the fire and explosion at the East Ohio Gas Co.

The disaster which took place in Cleveland's east side resulted from ignition of several tanks containing liquid natural gas.

REVEAL 2 TULEANS WOUNDED IN ITALY

A War Department announcement in October listed two nisei soldiers with next of kin residing in this center as wounded in action in the Mediterranean area.

Pvt. Ichiro R. Kato, son of Unmitsu and Hatsu Kato, 1907-AB, was reported wounded July 22 in Italy. He formerly resided in Broderick, Yolo County, Calif.

1st. Sgt. William K. Ishida, son of Jisanda Ishida, was reported wounded in Italy. (According to the Statistics Section, his family transferred to Topaz Center last year--Ed. Note). He is formerly from Sacramento, Calif.

3 JAPANESE CAPTIVES SHOT BY DENVER HOSPITAL GUARD

DENVER, Colo.---Three Japanese naval prisoners were shot and killed at Fitzsimons General Hospital Monday night when they rushed the guards in a mutiny, reported the Associated Press.

The three Japanese, who were captured in the South Pacific, sought to commit suicide last Aug. 11. This attempt was foiled by guards who discovered them in time, and they were treated by physicians.

The Associated Press said no official statement was available from the Army; available information indicated that the prisoners refused a guard's order to clean up after a bottle of milk was broken by them on the floor. The guard struck one of the prisoners

Information regarding former residents of U. S. who returned to Japan on the last exchange of nationals between the two countries was picked up by monitors of the Federal Communications Commission from an English broadcast by Radio Tokyo on Oct. 14, according to the Minidoka Irrigator.

The broadcast follows:

"Former residents of the U. S. who returned to Japan aboard the steamship Teia Maru will (one word missing) a village in Manchukuo. The government authorities in Manchukuo are making preparations to accord courtesy to the new settlers."
