I will greatly appreciate anything which you can do to get the maps of the other cities in your County in my hands at an early date.

I presume that there will probably be material changes in connection with the maps of your County which reflect the location of Japanese thereon. If, at any time, any changes seem sufficiently important, I would appreciate it very much if you would advise me of these changes so that I can make the proper notations on the maps which I have here in this office. If you should deem it advisable, I will be very glad to return to you all or a part of the maps which you previously sent in to me, and thus give you an opportunity to make any changes, corrections or additions which may be necessary.
