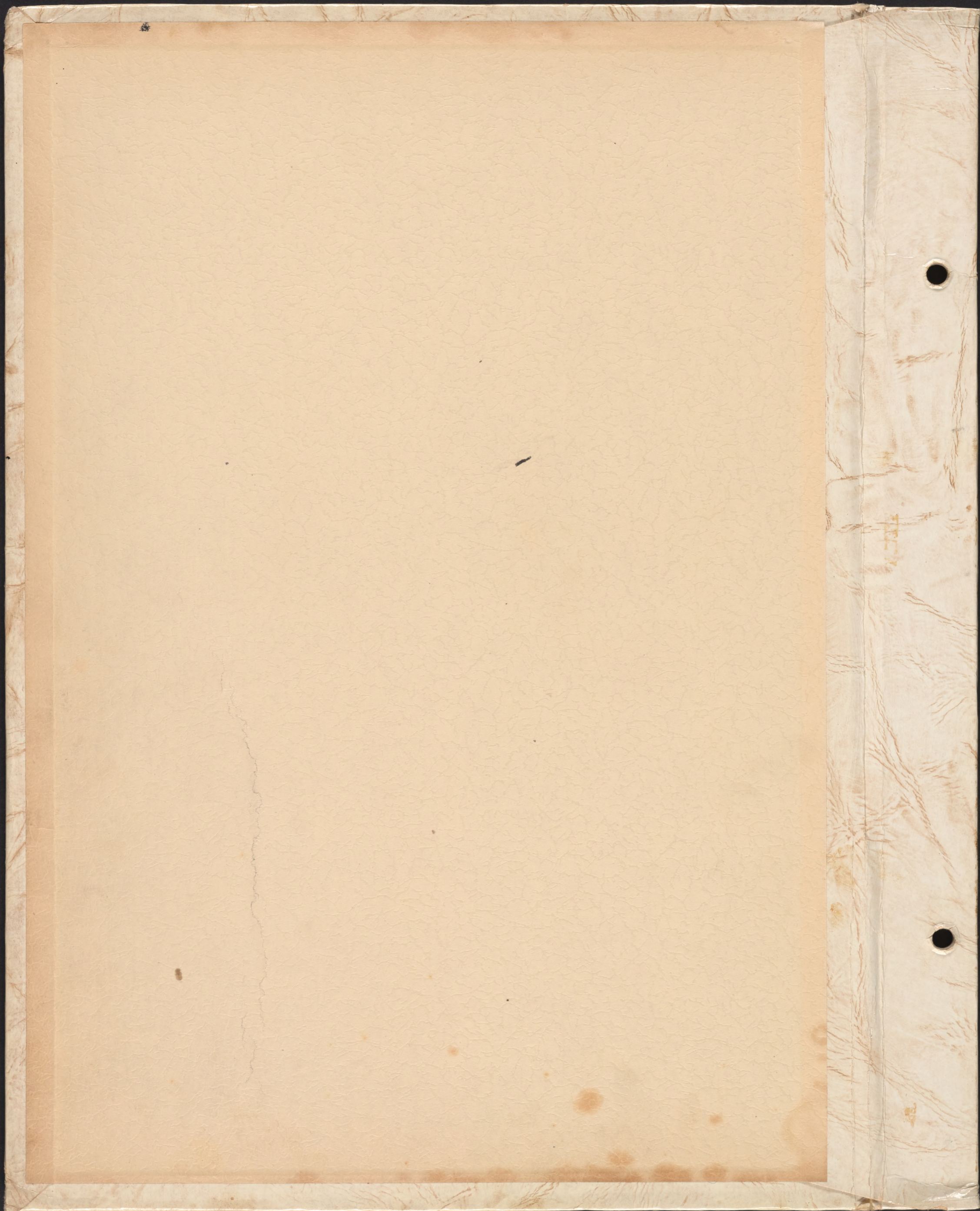

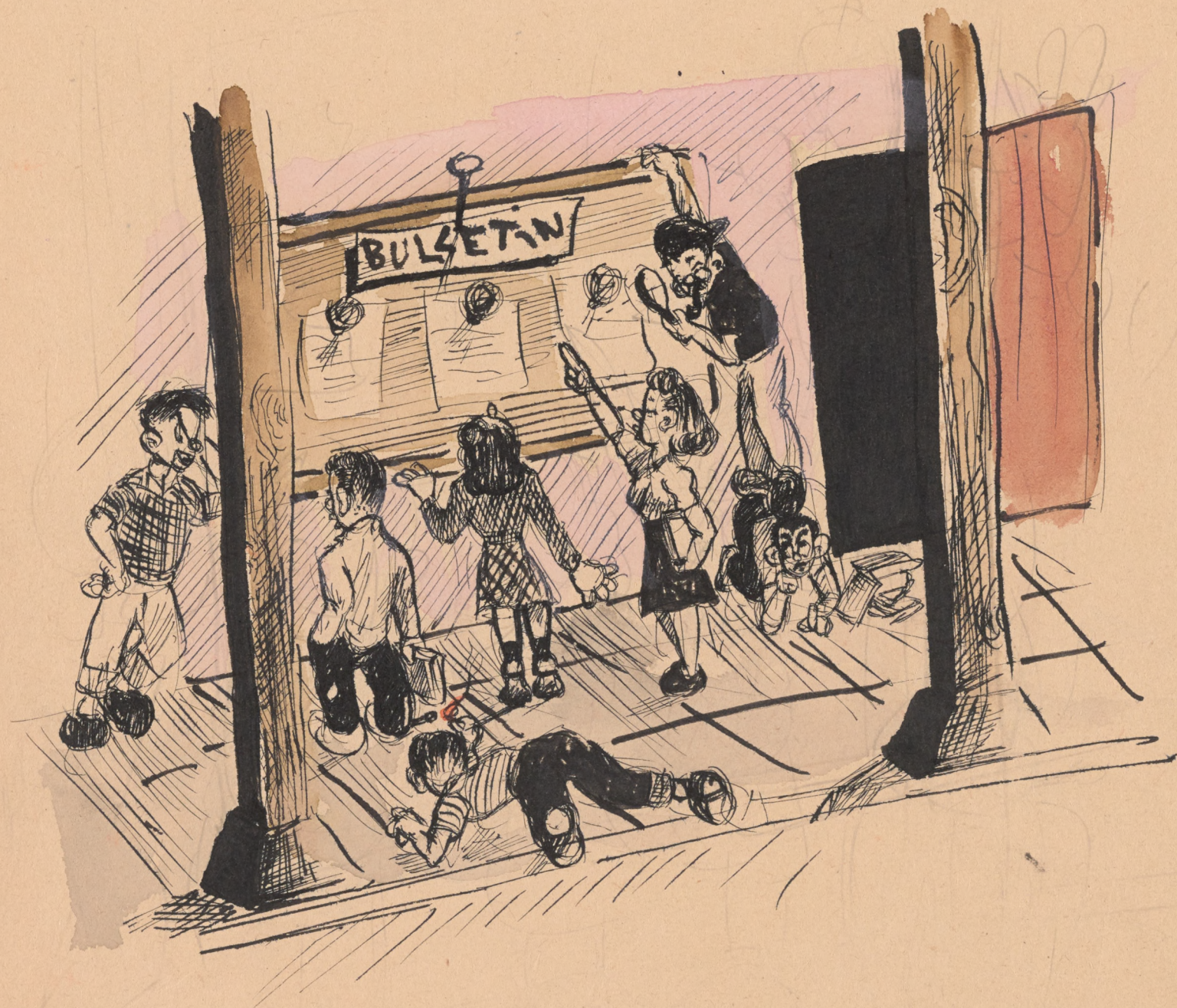

CONSTITUTION

ARTICLE I -- Name

The name of the organization shall be

ARTICLE II -- Members

- Sec. 1 Anyone may be a member of this organization who is in any way connected with the school.

ARTICLE III -- Offices and Duties

- Sec. 1 The officers of this organization shall be composed of: President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer, Historian Reporter & Publicity Manager, Sargeant-At-Arms, and a Faculty Advisor.
- Sec. 2 The President shall preside at all meetings, make all appointments except those which are otherwise provided for, and assume all implied powers associated with his office.
- Sec. 3 The Vice-President shall preside at meetings in the absence of the President. He shall also assume all other presidential duties in the absence of the president. He shall be chairman for all social function of this organization.
- Sec. 4 The Secretary shall keep an accurate record of all meetings. He shall attend to all of the correspondences of this organization. Upon the close of his term he shall file all records with the Principal.
- Sec. 5. The Treasurer shall conduct all financial transaction of this organization with approval of the members of the organization. All checks being approved by the organization must be counter signed by the faculty advisor. All money obtained by activities of this organization shall be in charge of the treasurer before any bills are paid. The treasurer shall make a treasury report when requested to do so by the President.
- Sec. 6 The Historian shall maintain a record of all events in which this organization participates. Upon the close of his term, he shall file records with the Principal.
- Sec. 7 The Reporter and Publicity Manager shall be in charge of all publicity of this organization. If news of this organization shall be needed by the school paper, he shall do all the reporting.
- Sec. 8 The Sargeant-at-Arms shall see that all members adhere to the request of the President. If the tranquility of a meeting be broken, he shall have the right to order peaceful conduct.

- Sec. 9 The faculty advisor shall serve in the capacity of advisor in all affairs of this organization. He shall name this organization.

ARTICLE IV -- Elections

- Sec. 1 The term of office shall be one school year.
- Sec. 2 Election shall be held at the meeting at the beginning of the school year.
- Sec. 3 Offices shall be elected by majority vote.
- Sec. 4 The faculty advisor of this organization shall be the Art Director of Poston II High

ARTICLE V -- Qualification for Offices.

- Sec. 1 All candidates must be regular members of Poston II High and must be enrolled in the Arts & Crafts Class.
- Sec. 2 Post Graduates shall not be considered as candidates.

ARTICLE VI -- Meetings

- Sec. 1 Meetings of this organization shall be called on every other Tuesday.
- Sec. 2 Special meeting may be called by the president with the approval of the faculty advisor.

ARTICLE VII -- Amendments

- Se This constitution may be ammended by two-third vote off votes of this organization.

ARTICLE VIII -- Recall

All offices of this organization may be removed by recall. A petition shall be signed by 2/3 of the members of this organization. At the following meeting this petition shall be brought before the members.

The office in question shall have opportunity to answer charges made in the petition.

The members shall decide a date for the recall election which shall be be by ballot in regular form.

ARTICLE IX -- Ratifications

The ratification of 2/3 of the members of the organization shall be sufficient for the establishment of the constitution.

BY-LAWS

Article I

- Sec. 1 Robert's Rules of order shall govern all matters of this organization not covered by this Constitution and By-Laws.

for the boys.

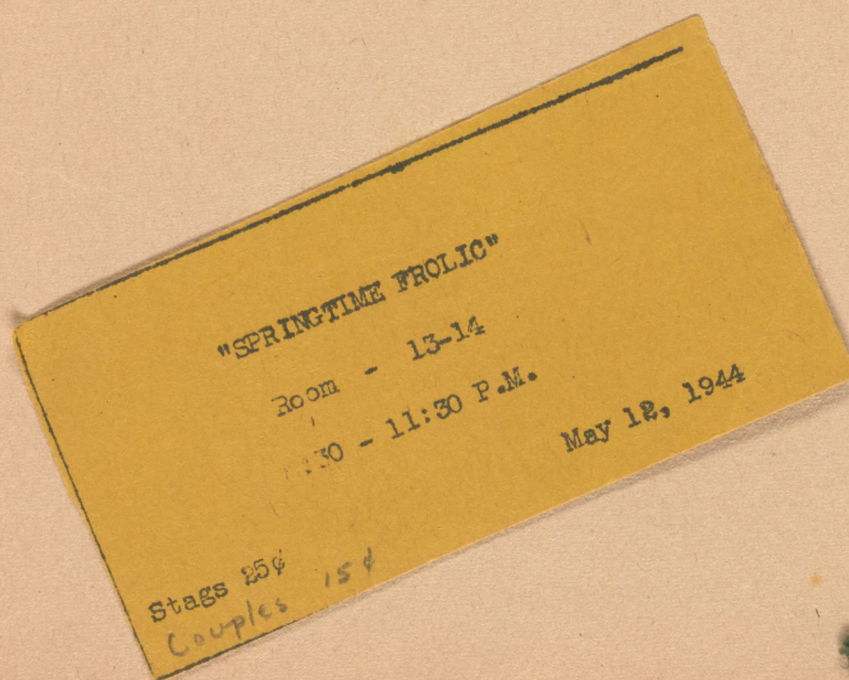
All three were given attractive
