GENERAL COMMENTS

The low average daily attendance in the High School is caused by a considerable number of boys leaving to accept employment outside the center as beet laborers. The lack of a sufficient teaching staff, together with difficulties in housing, has made it difficult to provide adequately for all those who originally enrolled in school.

School opened on October 12th for all grades from kindergarten to 12 High. The Adult Education Program began on October 26th with a large attendance. Considerable interest is being displayed in this activity. Equipment for the vocational shop is being gradually received. School desks and books are arriving a small amount at a time.

Plans are being completed for the formation of an advisory school board and an advisory committee of college age students. It is hoped that in the near future group activities can be started for a wide variety of interests.

The main fact of this month is that the new cooperative board began definitely to take its responsibility and appointed a general manager who began his work on April first. The agreement transferring the former Community Enterprises to the Amache Consumer Enterprises, Inc., has been properly signed, and the new capital raised by the members was poured into the business. The additional business of the month was the opening of a newspaper office to take subscriptions. Educational study groups have been added from the board to the employees and the new business committee.

GENERAL COMMENTS (continued)

The children in the elementary school have taken the responsibility for putting in a crop of rye in place of lawn to beautify the ground and to keep the dust from blowing about. Requests were made earlier in the month for trees to be planted on school ground, but this request was denied until it was too late to plant trees. Transplanting of yucca and other desert plants was similarly discouraged. Now there seems little hope of getting the school ground beautified.

Arrangements were made with hospital authorities to permit children from the Elementary School to visit the hospital for educational purposes.

Two parents meetings were held this month to discuss the way in which parents might supplement works for the school in education of the children.

In accordance with directives from Washington implemented at the project level, we have reduced our evacuee personnel 37 positions. We find it difficult to decrease our staff in the middle of our summer activity program. Our large decrease will occur at the end of August.

Approximately twelve girls of school age went to Vineland, Colorado, for a period of two weeks and participated in a work camp sponsored by the YWCA. Favorable reports have been received.

The State Superintendent of Public Instruction, Mrs. Inez Johnson Lewis, visited the center one day and was the guest of the faculty at a dinner that evening at the Maxwell House Hotel.

Father Raymond Newell, head of the parochial schools in Walsenburg, together with a group of three, visited the Amache Schools.

Mr. Dillon Myer and Mr. Robert Cozzens spent some time visiting the schools during their visit to the center.

Little planning could be done for the purchase of equipment and supplies during this period since the budget allocations have not been issued.

Because of the crowded schedule in the Public Works Division, the custodial staff of the Education Section has been proceeding with the remodeling of 8H block. Progress is fair.

Miss Grace G. Lewis has been appointed Vocational Advisor.

ELEMENTARY SCHOOL

During the past month the Elementary School has increased considerably in size due to the coming of one hundred children from Tule Lake. This increase in enrollment has necessitated the enlargement of three more rooms. We now have some classes as large as forty-three in number. Such large numbers reduce the efficiency of teaching in spite of reports to the contrary by some pseudo researchers.

The position of assistant elementary principal has not yet been filled, simply due to the fact that no eligible person has applied.

A number of vacancies are due to occur soon as a result of resignations on the part of appointed personnel teachers and relocation of several evacuee teachers and assistant teachers. Undoubtedly as replacements cannot be found, some of the school opportunities now provided for children have to be curtailed.

A safety patrol is being established to care for dangerous situations involved in traffic, fire, playground or other activities.

The Elementary Co-op Store is also operating.

A student council has been organized to enable the pupils to participate in self government.

The victory garden project was brought to a close and as one of the closing events, the elementary group participated in a local agricultural fair by setting up a display.

Landscaping of the school block has begun under the direction of an evacuee, who formerly operated a nursery.

A color-guard has been formed to take charge of flag ceremonies, including the raising and lowering of the flag each day.

The Elementary School parents' council has been established through the selecting of representative parents from each class group, from nursery to sixth grade, inclusive. This group meets on call by the principal, who acts as chairman. The purpose of the organizations is to provide an avenue by which information may be imparted to the parents. Discussions on school and home problems are also being held by the representative group.

ADULT EDUCATION CLASSES

Auto-motive apprenticeship program has been enlarged. The Commercial Program has been reopened. English classes are increasing; open forum program has been started. Relocation Library has been opened. Discussion groups have been started. Japanese-type activities have been reduced. Use of recreation halls for housing caused temporary closing of numerous activities. Guidance and counselling program for young adults for relocation purposes has been undertaken. Additional library material on relocation is needed.

Programs were sponsored in the elementary, junior high and senior high schools for students arriving from Tule Lake. A wholesome atmosphere was noted.

Relocation continues to cause considerable difficulty in personnel assignments, particularly among assistant teachers (evacuee).

Thirty-seven teachers (appointed personnel) participated in the census of the center taken on Sunday, September 5th.

Carey McWilliams addressed the high school assembly on September 24th.

Plans are being made for 100% enrollment in the Colorado Education Association. All teachers are planning to attend the Colorado Education Association annual conventions in Denver and Pueblo on October 28th to 30th.

November 4: Schick tests were given to ninety pre-school children. Five out of ninety tests were found positive.

Landscaping work about the elementary school buildings has progressed slowly but satisfactorily. Each Sunday ten to fifteen parents have volunteered to assist with the work, particularly that of digging bushes at the riverbank to be transplanted. It is hoped that this landscaping project will improve the appearance by preventing much of the dust from blowing into the class rooms.

November 18: The principal discussed children's literature and reviewed new books for children. A number of parents were present.

November 23: The elementary school presented an operetta, "The Palace of Carelessness." 813 tickets were sold. There were 200 children participating.

SECONDARY SCHOOLS

Realizing the need for additional experience in oral English on the part of pupils, the faculty has embarked on a program which will emphasize oral work including good recitation, speaking, debate, dramatics and extemporaneous speaking.

The high school cooperative store finished its membership drive by sponsoring a Social Hour. It now has 550 members.

The Student Council is managing the sale of student activity tickets.

We are continuing our emphasis on relocation. Several assemblies and meetings were held at which relocation officials spoke. Miss Sumi Yamaguchi from New York and Mr. Lafayette Noda from Baltimore spoke to all of the seniors.

A big welcome party and dance was held in honor of the incoming Tuleans.

Lieutenant Simony of the 335th Military Escort Guard spoke to the student body on Armistice Day.

The Future Homemakers' Club, the Boys' and Girls' Leagues, the Assembly Council and a Pep Club were organized.

All new teachers were taken on a complete tour of the Center.

Complete intramural programs of boys' and girls' athletics are now in progress.

The secondary schools faculty held a special meeting on the topic, "Federal Aid for Education," and a second meeting on the topic, "The Harper's Ferry Conference."

In accordance with directives from Washington implemented at the project level, we have reduced our evacuee personnel 37 positions. We find it difficult to decrease our staff in the middle of our summer activity program. Our large decrease will occur at the end of August.

Approximately twelve girls of school age went to Vineland, Colorado, for a period of two weeks and participated in a work camp sponsored by the YWCA. Favorable reports have been received.

The State Superintendent of Public Instruction, Mrs. Inez Johnson Lewis, visited the center one day and was the guest of the faculty at a dinner that evening at the Maxwell House Hotel.

Father Raymond Newell, head of the parochial schools in Walsenburg, together with a group of three, visited the Amaxhe Schools.

Mr. Dillon Myer and Mr. Robert Cozens spent some time visiting the schools during their visit to the center.

Little planning could be done for the purchase of equipment and supplies during this period since the budget allocations have not been issued.

Because of the crowded schedule in the Public Works Division, the custodial staff of the Education Section has been proceeding with the remodeling of 8H block. Progress is fair.

Miss Grace G. Lewis has been appointed Vocational Advisor.

One evacuee stenographer and 4 appointed personnel are working on records and transcripts that are being sent to various high schools throughout the country as former students send in requisitions for them. Two administrators, Mr. Lloyd A. Garrison, Superintendent, and Mr. H. K. Walther, High School Principal, are completing final reports.
