We are enclosing copy of a letter dated February 15, 1946 from Mr. Charles T. Moon, Relocation Officer in the Washington, D. C. District Office.

Mrs. Ito is a resident at Camp Kohler and she recently asked us whether or not she could obtain railroad transportation to Washington, D. C. for self and two daughters ages 13 and 14. Since she had relocated to Sacramento from Tule Lake, thereby using her free move, we suggested she contact the Sacramento Welfare Department and ask for resettlement assistance under War Services Program. We also contacted the Welfare Department who will consider her application but must investigate her husband's resources before approving same. To date Mrs. Ito has not applied to the Welfare Department for this aid.

On February 14, 1946 Mrs. Ito called at our office and asked that we notify Mr. B. A. White, Traffic and Property Officer, San Francisco Warehouse, to hold shipment of her property pending new address and shipping instructions.

Please advise whether or not there is a recent policy wherein WRA could authorize transportation at Government expense in this case.

In discussing your letter of February 27, 1946 and Mr. Miller's letter to you of February 26, 1946, with Mr. Lee's office as suggested by Mr. Miller, the ruling is that no exceptions can be made via payment of transportation for more than the one occasion; Tule Lake to Sacramento, California. Our original letter of February 15, 1946 at the urgent request of Mr. Ito and based on the alleged "enforced movement" from Tule Lake to Sacramento temporarily until final relocation plans were consummated, therefore, does not stand.

Mr. Lee's office suggests that application be made at Sacramento for Resettlement Assistance Funds regarding which I knew you are familiar, and which would seem to be appropriate now under the circumstances.

Hoping that this can work out so that Mr. Tadanori Ito's family can join him here where he seems to have made a satisfactory connection, I am

Mr. Oizumi advises that he has received neither the goods nor any Government Bill of Lading covering the shipment of his thirteen pieces (including a gas range and 11 trunks) consigned to him, 8 Shima, 842 New Hampshire Avenue, N. W., Washington, D. C. The form 156 was executed on January 28, 1946 and he is particularly distressed at having received no Government Bill of Lading to indicate that the goods are enroute.

These household goods were originally with the Four Star Van and Storage Company, 701 East Jefferson St., Los Angeles. You delivered them to the War Relocation Authority warehouse, 836 Santee St., Los Angeles on May 24, 1943. On July 6, 1945 Mr. Oizumi executed a power of attorney authorizing Mineo Kataoka to separate Kataoka's goods from the one shipment handled by the Four Star Van and Storage Company which included the household goods of both families. Thirteen pieces belonging to K. Oizumi remained and were covered by WRA-156 of January 28, 1946 regarding which no Bill of Lading has as yet been received.
