# CARSTENS HOME FROM ENGLAND

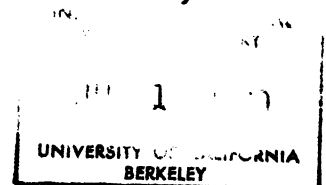

WORKSHOP IN GRIEVANCE PROCEDURES AND ARBITRATION  
OFFERED FOR ADVANCED CERTIFICATE

On June 21, a six-week course, Workshop in Grievance Procedures and Arbitration will begin at the James Monroe High School in the San Fernando Valley. This is one of the courses which can be credited toward the Advanced Certificate in Industrial Relations. Students will participate in mock grievance meetings of foremen and stewards through "role-playing" methods. The course will include the actual preparation of different types of cases for arbitration and the presentation of the cases to arbitration. Students will alternately take the parts of union representatives, company representatives, and the arbitrator. Highlights will include talks by representatives of labor and management, and by nationally known arbitrator, Benjamin Aaron.

Enrollment is open to all graduates of the present Certificate Program, students who have completed Grievances and Arbitration, and others gaining the consent of the instructor.
