

NEWS BRIEF  
ON SPEAKER  
FOR JUNE

David Ziskind, distinguished labor lawyer, author, and lecturer, will discuss "Legislation Governing Convict Labor." His eminent academic background includes a PhD degree in economics and the JD from the University of Chicago, an MA in sociology from the University of Southern California, and a PhD in economics from Johns Hopkins University. He devoted fourteen years to federal service in Washington, D.C., notably as principal attorney in the U.S. Department of Labor and as director of the Manpower Programming Division of the War Production Board and the Office of Civilian Production. Engaged in the practice of law in Los Angeles since 1948, Mr. Ziskind is a member of the Los Angeles, American, and Inter-American Bar Associations, The American Economics Association, the Industrial Relations Research Association, as well as the National Academy of Arbitrators. He lectured on labor law and economics at the American University in Washington, D.C., and in seminars at UCLA. His book on Strikes in Government Employment, published in 1942, has attained new popularity with the recent developments of unionism in public employment.



PAST PROGRAM

Ted Merrill, President of the Joint Council No. 42 of the Teamsters, spoke on the needs of young and vigorous leadership in organized labor. He told representatives of labor and management that "unless the passing leadership trains or has trained new leaders, organized labor will have serious problems at all leadership levels, as will management in negotiating and interpreting contracts." He praised the Teamsters efforts of cooperation with the Longshore and Retail Clerks unions, saying, "I have always believed that we can do more together than individually." He feels that we are living in a period of simultaneous inflation and deflation, and he stressed that organized labor must become more involved in national politics because "the same legislators who gave unions the right to organize and bargain collectively can take it away."
