## FOR FEBRUARY

Benjamin Aaron, Professor of Law and Director of the Institute of Industrial Relations at UCLA, is certainly no stranger to the Alumni Association. In addition to his teaching and research work at the University--he is the author or editor of several books on labor law and of numerous papers and articles on industrial relations issues. Mr. Aaron has devoted much time to working with the federal government: the National War Labor Board and the Wage Stabilization Board during and after World War II; the National Commission on Technology, Automation and Economic Progress and the Advisory Council of Employee Welfare and Pension Benefit Plans during the 1960's; and numerous governmental arbitration boards, boards of inquiry under the Labor Management Relations Act, emergency boards under the Railway Labor Act, and other ad hoc boards from 1947 to the present. His experience as private arbitrator since 1946, as well as his membership in leading professional organizations in that field, should make his presentation especially stimulating. Mr. Aaron, who received his law degree from Harvard University, was recently elected Vice Chairman of the Academic Senate at UCLA.
