Introduction

Most of the questions were answered by a group of Japanese students who were accustomed to group together at the tables in front of the swimming pool, next to the negroes. I would tag them now as mostly Socialites. Many of the Conservatives kept away, but a few were attempting to break into the ways of the social group, whose main preoccupations were dates, dances, movies, and sports. Within the group that answered the questionnaire were some who had "rowdy" tendencies. The few progressives, who did not mingle with the social group, were not reached. There were one or two Kibeis. If the answers are truthful, they should represent the sentiment of the social group as a whole, together with those of conservative and rowdy tendencies.

The answers are tabulated according to sex. For three questions in which there were significant differences, the answers were also divided according to the amount of knowledge of Japanese that was professed by those answering. Those who said that their speaking knowledge of Japanese was NONE or LITTLE were put in the AMERICAN group, and those whose speaking knowledge of Japanese is PASSING or ABOVE-AVERAGE were put in the JAPANESE group. In a few cases other criteria, such as personal acquaintance, were used when it was felt to be a truer index of conservative tendencies.
