The criss cross affair in front is supposed to represent our fence, and on our doorstep are two cans of geraniums. We have quite a few glads. sweet peas and two tomato plants. rather small.

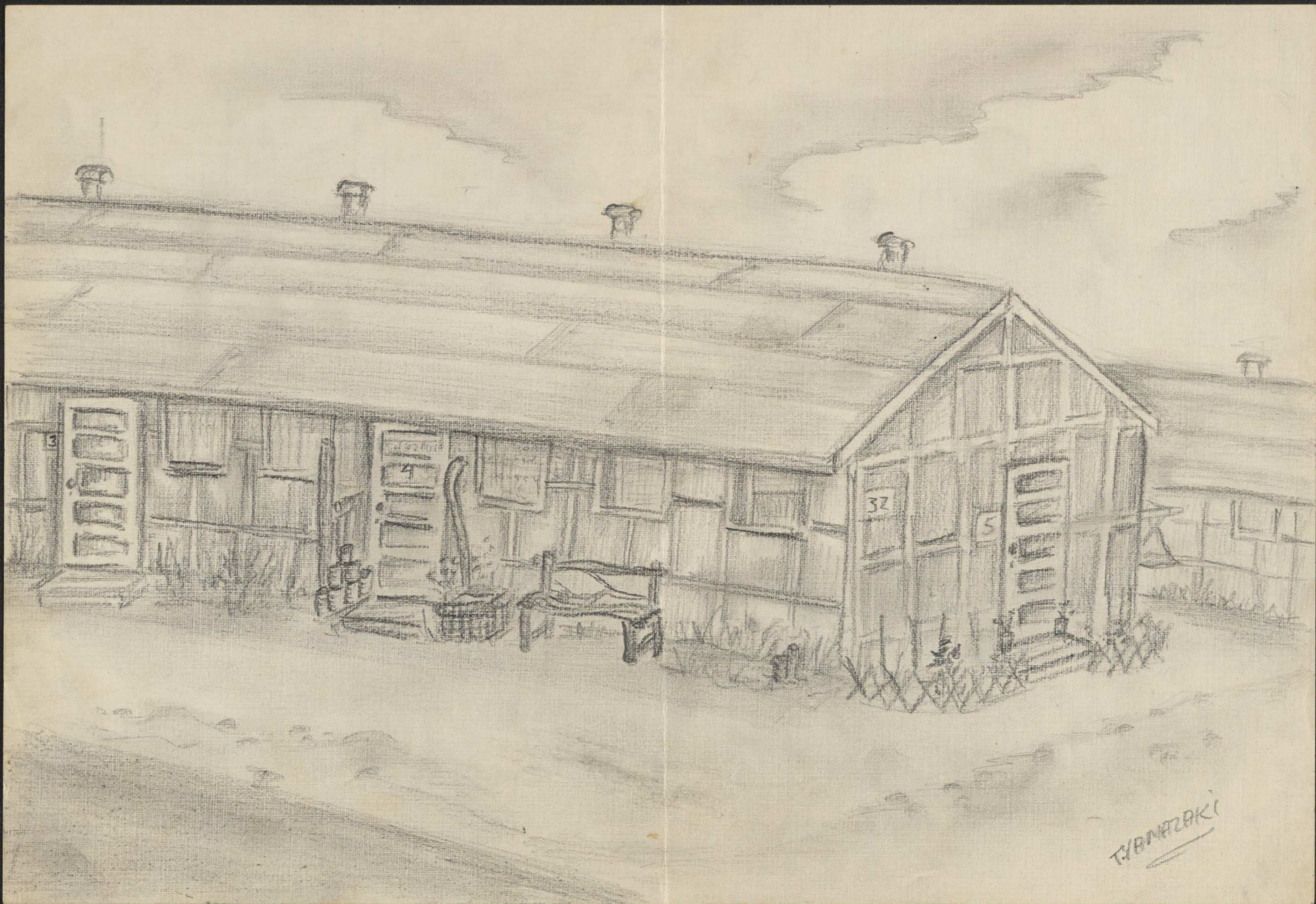
