

GENERAL INFORMATION ABOUT THE LOUISIANA DIVISION

The Louisiana Division is located on the third floor of the Central Library. The Division collects through purchase and gift all types of printed, manuscript, graphic, and oral resources relating to the study of Louisiana and its citizens. Other areas of interest include the Mississippi River, the Gulf of Mexico, and the South. Included are books by or about Louisianians; city, regional, and state documents; manuscripts, maps, newspapers, periodicals, microfilms, photographs, slides, motion pictures, sound recordings, video tapes, postcards, and ephemera of every sort. The Genealogy Collection contains books, periodicals and microfilms, with emphasis on the Southeast United States, Nova Scotia, France, and Spain.

The Louisiana Division is the official City Archives of New Orleans and is also the official repository for the pre-1928 records of the Civil Courts and the pre-1932 records of the Criminal Courts of Orleans Parish. Other Special Collections maintained by the Division are the Rare Vertical File, the Carnival Collection, the Louisiana and New Orleans Photograph Collection, the Map Collection, the Menu Collection, the Postcard Collection, the Manuscript Collection, and the Rare Book Collection.

A comprehensive guide to the Collection has been published as chapter 21 in Light T. Cummins, A Guide to the History of Louisiana, published by Greenwood Press in 1982. Two descriptive guides to specific subject areas have also been published and are available for purchase within the Division or by mail from the Friends of the New Orleans Public Library. They are Genealogical Materials in the New Orleans Public Library, 2nd ed. (1984) by Collin B. Hamer, Jr. and Researching the History of your House (or other Building) in New Orleans, 2nd ed. (1986) by Wayne Everard.

Most books, state and city documents and microfilms may be used without restrictions within the reading room. **Louisiana Division materials do not circulate.** Special Collections can be used only after completion of a registration form and the presentation of proper identification and credentials. Researchers who require access to such materials are advised to make an appointment to meet with the archivist or librarian in charge of an individual collection.

The Louisiana Division is open for use during regular Central Library hours (10:00 AM - 6:00 PM Monday through Thursday and 10:00 AM - 5:00 PM Saturday). Patrons interested in using Special Collections material after 5:00 PM during the week, or at any time on Saturdays, should contact the Division ahead of time to confirm availability and to arrange for items to be held.


Dear Librarian:







INSTRUCTIONS FOR REVIEW AND OBTAINING COPIES OF COURT RECORDS  
AT THE FEDERAL RECORDS CENTER

The Fort Worth Federal Records Center stores inactive and semi-inactive records for most Federal agencies in the Southwest Region. Included are closed civil and criminal case files from the US District Courts from the following states: Arkansas, Louisiana, Oklahoma, and Texas.

LOCATION: The Fort Worth Federal Records Center is located within the Fort Worth Federal Center at 501 W. Felix. We are approximately a half mile west of I 35W and north of I20/820, and approximately seven miles south of downtown Fort Worth.

From I35W. Take Felix Street exit. West bound on Felix for a half mile and then turn left into the Fort Worth Federal Center at the guard gate. You must stop and get a visitors pass. The FRC is located in Building 1.

From I20/820. Take I35W N. exit. Go north bound on I35W, exit at Felix. Turn left on Felix west bound on Felix for a half mile and then turn left into the Fort Worth Federal Center at the guard gate. You must stop and get a visitors pass. The FRC is located in Building 1.

To review and/or copy a case file at the FRC, you must follow the procedures below:

STEP 1. Obtain the following information from the US District Court or the US Bankruptcy Court where your case was filed and closed. Without ALL the information listed below, our staff cannot locate your records.

STEP 2. Telephone the FRC at (817) 334-55<sup>2</sup>5 to set up an appointment to view the file. We must have at least 24 hours notice before you wish to view the file, and then we will set you up with the FIRST AVAILABLE appointment at your convenience. When you call the FRC, we will need the following information:

- The information you obtained in Step 1.
- The city in which the court was located.
- The name of the person coming to view the file and a



daytime telephone number.

The appointments are set up in 30 minutes intervals. When making your appointment, please indicate how much time you will need to review the case or cases. This does not include the amount of time it takes to photocopy the documents. If you are unable to finish reviewing the case or cases when your appointment time is up, you may reschedule an appointment for another time.

STEP 3. When you set up an appointment, you will be given a "call back time" to confirm your appointment. This is done for your convenience, to insure that there are no problems with the file before you make the trip to the FRC. PLEASE be sure you call to confirm your appointment at the specified time because the space available for review at the FRC is very limited. If the case file is not at the FRC, or the numbers provided in STEP 1 were incorrect, you will have to recontact the court for the current status of your file or the correct information and begin STEP 1 again.

STEP 4. Once at our facility, you can review and identify the pages you wish to be photocopied. FRC staff members are not trained court clerks, therefore, they will not generally provide information regarding file content or court actions. YOU will need to know what you are looking for and if you wish to have your photocopies certified. In addition, you must be prepared to pay for copying and/or certification after having the copies made.

We will accept preprinted personal checks, business checks, or exact change ONLY. ~~In the near future~~ Payments will be also accepted by a valid credit card. Personal checks require one form of identification, i.e., a valid drivers license. Food, beverage, smoking, and children under 14 are not allowed so please make arrangements in this regard.

9am - 11:30am Appointments are available Monday thru Friday between the hours of ~~8:30 am~~ and ~~2:30 pm~~. You must have an appointment. Please call the FRC if you miss your appointment, because your record will be refiled if you fail to keep your appointment and you will have to begin again at STEP 2.

Please note that FRC personnel cannot provide you with legal advice or assistance in selecting specific documents for reproductions. If assistance is needed, you must contact your attorney or the appropriate court for further guidance.
