After each member of the Panel made a presentation to the general body, there was a discussion from the floor. A second resolution was brought in from Alameda County, Peace & Freedom Party movement.

So this presented two resolutions on which to act. A pro & con discussion around the two resolutions was very heated and polarized. The discussion lasted many hours and resulted in no action being taken at the conclusion. All other resolutions submitted back to the floor from the other workshops were passed by the general body, only the Anti-klan/Anti-nazi resolution was not passed.

Despite the fact that the San Francisco Committee was forced to return to San Francisco, the debate was still being argued by the State Committee, with no suggestions being offered around how to resolve the debate.

After I heard the pro & con, I must report that the majority of the Committee was opposed to banning the Klan.

I feel it was an insult to the Black Community in this country. I feel glad that there was so few Black people at the meeting, so they did not have to hear this racist insult against banning the Klan. I want to say to those who were opposed to banning the Klan that they should look to the history of the Klan. The Klan is against every right, all human rights.

We must fight to abolish the Klan and all other organizations like the Klan, organizations based on the racist lie of white supremacy, that terrorize and attack citizens of the United States, and advocate violence, making it difficult for peace-loving people to live in peace. They stir hate. They are a hate group.

Not only Blacks, but other oppressed peoples must stand up and fight the Klan today. If we don't, they will be free to kill tomorrow.

I made a statement that I would not go back in the Black Community and tell the Black workers about the Peace and Freedom Party until they get their act together as all peace-loving peoples.

I, Lee Brown, was on the Anti Klan-Anti Nazi workshop, on the Resolution on Resurgent Racism. It consisted of four persons, two who were for banning the Klan, and two who were against the banning of the Klan, (one of which was a lawyer). The chairman of this panel was Floyd Walls.

After each member of the panel made a presentation to the general body, there was a discussion from the floor.

There was two resolutions, a second was brought in from Alameda County Peace & Freedom Party movement. So this presented two resolutions on which to act a pro and con discussion around the two resolutions, it created a heated and polarized discussion. The discussion lasted for hours and resulted in no action taken at the final conclusion for the San Francisco committee. All the other resolutions submitted back to the floor from all other workshops were passed by the general body; only the Anti Klan-Anti Nazi resolution was not approved. Despite the fact the San Francisco committee was forced to return to San Francisco, the debate was not finalized, and was still being argued upon with no finalization or conclusion suggested.
