In reviewing his file I find that in your memorandum of Dec. 7 to this project concerning the subject evacuee, it states that Mr. Umons has foreclosed on Mr. Yamazaki's ranch and that the ranch was sold by Artz and Cook Realtors in Sacto. We are wondering what has happened to Mr. Yamazaki's farming equipment. There is nothing in the files to indicate that the farm equipment was mortgaged and we would like to know if the equipment was mortgaged and sold also or if it is still intact at the ranch..

Letter to Mr. Hathh from G. F. Castleberry, Feb. 17, 1944: We are in receipt of letter from Cook of Artz and Cook Co concerning the farm equipment of Mr. Yamasaki. Cook says, "Certain farm tools were stored on the property at the time of sale and were not included in the purchase of Mr. Bertram, and as far as we know, the tools in question are still on the ranch." He further states, "Within the next few days, however, someone from our office will be in the vicinity of the Yamasaki ranch and we will make a further check and will advise you of our findings."

Memo to Ray D. Johnston, Project Dir. Rohwer, from WLP, Oct. 9, 1944: We have been requested by Mr. Yamazaki to help him sell his equipment stored on his former ranch near Dlorin, Calif. This equipment is in bad condition and we have an offer of \$60.00 cash for the tractor and equipment. Due to the condition of this tractor and equipment, it is our opinion that this offer is a very good one and would advise that the evacuee give serious consideration to it. Inasmuch as this offer would not remain in effect very long, we would appreciate it if you would contact the evacuee immediately and let us know just what his decision is.

Dear Mr. Robinson,

I wish to seek your aid and advice in solving our problem.
We've left behind us in San Mateo, Calif. a beautiful modern
laundry built but a year and half prior to our removal to
Tanforan. It was open for business until ~~about~~ four months
afterwards when the man, well-recommended and highly esteemed
who took over management of our plant, gave up mainly due
to lack of labor leaving us with much debt and awakening us to
the realization we would have been much better off had we closed
our plant down before we left.

If we were to tell this in the manner ~~we~~ I desire to, it would take pages, but I shall try to be as brief as possible. He also arranged to live in our home(eight rooms and built 4 years ago) for which we ~~haven't received rental.~~ Our ~~at~~ father who passed away 8 years age established our laundry nearly 35 five years age in San Mateo. During my father's prolonged illness and after his death my two sisters and I with the aid on my mother, my brother now 19 and my youngest sister now 15(when they were able to) ran the business ourselves--- Our work was no mere undertaking-- We worked days and some nights without sleep until we realized the dream of building and owning our home. But inside ~~xxxxx~~ of a ~~year~~ year thereafter we were unexpectedly asked to vacate the premises of our ~~xxxxx~~ laundry to make way for a community center project. We made up our minds to build . Being without funds we were forced to place the ~~new~~ home and contemplated laundry in a combined mortgage with payments on the home to that date to ~~will~~ apply as down payment~~x~~. There were countless obstacles including our fight with the city planning commission, discrimination against our kind being what it was.

Business was wonderful. We worked unceasingly --- until the outbreak of the war.

My two sisters, my brother and I were the first to be ~~releas~~ released for industrial labor to Salt Lake City from ~~Topaz~~ Topaz, and we have received our permanent release. Two of us are working at the Star Laundry here, my sister and brother are at ~~in~~ the Royal and Modern Cleaners respectively. Each of us exchange our services in a private home for room, board and carfare. We have tried to send our attorney Henry F. Wrigley of the Monadnock Building, every cent we ~~can~~ possibly can that our various payments, indebtedness and demands of creditors be met. Mr. Wrigley himself has been a wonderful friend. He has been ~~forced~~ forced to meet many demands of our creditors out of his own pocketbook. The machinery there is useless and there is a good size maintenance bill-- creditors are pestering us-- Our attorney has yet to receive payments for his services--^u My brother is eligible for the draft. We've advertised the machinery for sale. We've tried to contact, through a good friend here Mr. Louis Strike of the Western Laundry Press, various Army groups and machinery salesmen whom we felt might be ~~inter~~ interested in our machinery but ~~we~~ have ~~been~~ received no

favorable replies. There are countless other reasons for immediate action of some sort. Then on Mr. Wrigley's end we've received a sole offer to lease the entire plant, equipment and all at ~~\$1x~~ \$120 a month with a five year lease wich is very inadequate in view of our ~~reading~~ valuing our entire equipment at \$25,000. However there have been a couple of offers of late for several pieces of equipment at a reasonable price. But before we begin to dispense with any of this equipment piece-meal we want to ~~list~~ enlist your aid. Is there not any place we can sell our equipment to as a whole ? Is there not an army group who could take over our laundry for army work ? Can you handle this problem ~~form~~ for us? What about priorities and relative red tape?

That laundry of ours is our whole life; it has been our past ever since we can remember and it is our only future and we want to fight for it.

I realize that our cry is but a mere whisper in view of ~~tk~~ this horrible world catastrophe in which many people have lost everything and have nothing to live for.

I appreciate your indulgence in what may seem like a ~~file~~ ~~lxxx~~ a lengthy expose of my petty grievances but the entire

The original cost of the Laundry: land, building & equipment ^{as of} was \$32,592.57 of which \$16,216.70 is still an outstanding ^{March} debt(\$11,254.76 on the land \$858.80 on a well for the house ¹⁶ & the building, \$16 on electric wiring, & \$4,087.14 on equip- ¹⁹⁴² ment.)). The present value of these have been appraised but Wrigley could not find a copy of that appraisement.(It was supposed to be mailed, but there is nothing in the files of this case.)()

According to Mr. Wrigley a deed was executed by the ~~xxx~~ sisters Yamauchi to him on April 18, 1942, and this deed was recorded in San Mateo County on April 21, 1942. Their trust agreement between Yamauchi & Wrigley has not been recorded. In April of 1942 a lease was given to a Mr. Jos. A. Robel on the laundry and the residence. Mr. Robel was also given the right to ~~xxx~~ purchase. Mr. Robel failed in his agreement both as to the payment of rent on the home and in his operation of the laundry. He also was subsequently convicted of ~~first~~ crime and is now an inmate of San Quentin, according to a Statement made by Mr. Wrigley.

~~\$10,835.98~~ covers both the home & the laundry, and there is now due under the mortgage, the interest on which is in default for a couple of months, the sum of approx. \$10,835.98. Mr. Wrigley states that the Bank is friendly and that Mr. Wisnon ~~of~~ of the bank will give us the exact data on the amount due under the mortgage.

Wells & pumps were installed both in the home and in the laundry under an F.H.A. loan arranged thru the Nat. Bank of San Mateo & that the bank will give us exact data in regard thereto. The Yamauchi sisters are indebted to a considerable number of creditors and a list of these creditors and the amount ~~due~~ owed is being prepared by Mr. Wrigley. Some of this machinery was sold by the Imperial Co. 2221 Union St. Oakland, under conditional ~~sales~~ sales contract with notes, which were discounted with the Bank of America. There is a balance of \$1,876.19 due on this equipment, the original price of which was in the neighborhood of \$4,923. The West Coast Laundry Machinery Co. sold some ironer ~~and~~ equipment to the Yamauchi sisters. This obligation is now three months in default under a conditional ~~sales~~ sales contract. The price was in the neighborhood of \$2,500 and there

is now a balance of about \$1,100 due on it. The home was leased to a new tenant, in December 1942, and the new tenants are now behind their rent.

The pump and well for the home was obtained under an F.H.A. loan. The loan was for \$432 and there is a balance due on this of \$326. These figures can be verified by Mr. Wisnon at the National Bank of San Mateo. A Hoffman press was purchased on a conditional sales contract for the laundry for \$198.63.

Mr. Wrigley states that he has not been paid for his services and that he has advanced certain money for the benefit of the Yamauchi sisters. He also states that they are sending him every month money which they have earned ever since their release from relocation center in Topaz, Utah by working in laundries for others in Salt Lake City.

Mr. Wrigley states that he thought that the sales of the machiner at its present value would more than balance all the current indebtedness of the Yamauchi sisters... Valuable property.

Mr. Wrigley states that the laundry equipment could be used for other purposes, namely that of a store or it could be converted into two apartments.

This renders unnecessary at this time the sale of any machinery or equipment. Thanking you and Mr. Myers for your interest in this matter.

Lease signed on March 1st:

Laundry & together with all furniture, furnishings and fixtures and all machinery & equipment and appliances therein or connected therewith leased for 3 years to February 28, 1946 for \$5,325 payable as follows: the sum of \$525 upon the execution of this lease; and the sum of \$150 on the first day of each month thereafter, beginning April 1, 1943. 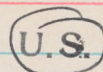
