Scope and Content: Collection of personal mementos and papers mostly of the Franges family of Crockett, CA. The collection was donated in 2012 by Betty Dunlap, a long-time member of the Historical Society.

Arrangement of Materials

The materials are stored in one box, mostly in file folders. The box contains one shawl in a plastic bag, one framed certificate and 27 folders containing various family mementos and papers. The folders include property deeds, the 1897 baptism certificate of Lucy Vincent (later Franges), the 1921 U.S. Naturalization certificate for Stefan Franges (of Austria) from Contra Costa Superior Court, a recognition certificate for Doris Franges from the San Francisco Citizens Committee of the San Francisco-Oakland Bay Bridge Opening Celebration in 1936, a brochure about the Follies Bergiere with advertisements from San Francisco nightclubs in the 1930s, and a C&H Sugar employee publication called "The Cubelet" from 1978. The framed certificate is from bandleader Kay Kyser's "Kollege of Musical Knowledge", a popular radio quiz show-and-music program in the 1930s and 1940s.
