Abstract

The collection consists of records of the Film Department of the San Francisco Museum of Modern Art dating from 1970-1980, the majority of which are published materials from external film organizations. The department was responsible for curating and screening film series of particular interest to art museum audiences. Experimental and short films were often shown, with series based primarily on topical themes. The department was dissolved in 1978 amidst museum-wide financial struggles. The collection is divided into four series: Curated Film Series, Department Administration, Public Relations, and External Film Organizations.

ADMINISTRATIVE HISTORY

Though the Film Department was founded in the 1970s, the San Francisco Museum of Art had been screening films since its opening in 1935. The start of the Art in Cinema series in 1946 represented the museum's support of non-commercial filmmaking, with a particular interest in films about art and artists. The Film Library had been established in the early 1950s to rent and distribute films in the West, though financial difficulties forced the service to dissolve in the mid-1960s. With its local reputation of supporting independent film, the museum recommitted itself in the early 1970s to the medium by establishing a Film Department and hiring a Film Curator to regularly organize film screenings in the museum.

The program consistently struggled financially, despite strong attendance and moderate ticket prices. Staff and patrons continually complained about the inadequate screening facilities – the museum's auditorium which had bad acoustics, the inability to fully darken the room, and level seating – and the program was unable to expand without improving the theater. Several expansion prospects were explored over the years, including renovating and taking over the Veterans Auditorium (later Herbst Theater) as a regular venue and collaborating with the Pacific Film Archive to produce regular San Francisco programs, but were ultimately deemed too costly. The Film Department was dissolved in 1978 amidst a museum-wide budget crisis caused by San Francisco's redistribution of the hotel tax, which had supported much of the museum's regular programming in the preceding years.

Several Film Curators headed the department during its appearance in the 1970s, including (in chronological order) Edith Kramer, Melvin (Mel) Novikoff, Kenneth (Ken) DeRoux, and Shelley Diekman, who acted as Film Curator for a mere month before it was announced that the department would be shut down.

SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

The Film Department records document the group's brief but active existence in the 1970s with correspondence, program notes, press releases, clippings, research materials, and financial records. The bulk of the records date from 1972-1978. More than half of the records consist of materials published by external film-related organizations, and document the field of non-commercial film and the museum's relationship to it at the time. Though the department was dissolved in 1978, some correspondence and materials from outside film organizations continues through 1980.

The collection is divided into four series: Curated Film Series, which documents film programs shown in the museum; Department Administration, relating to management of the department; Public Relations, including press releases, program notes, and newspaper clippings; and External Film Organizations. The External Film Organizations series is divided into four subseries, each representing a different function of the documentation of film activities: Distributors; Festivals; Newsletters; and Venues.

SERIES DESCRIPTION

SERIES 1: CURATED FILM SERIES, 1972-1978

Carton 1, folders 1-11

Arranged alphabetically.

The records document film programs organized by the Film Curator and shown in the museum, and include contextual records about similar film programs shown elsewhere as well as catalogs from distributors specializing in the topical areas of specific film series. The "Free Films and Theatre" program was a regularly scheduled series of films for children. Though researched, the series of films about Brazil and Berlin were not shown. The SECA film program was not curated by the Film Department, but was screened in the museum.

SERIES 2: DEPARTMENT ADMINISTRATION, 1972-1980

Carton 1, folders 12-28; Card File Box 1

Arranged alphabetically.

Files document the management of the Film Department and maintenance of the film program. The Theater and Program Expansion files document the multiple efforts during the 1970s to enhance the film program, through either collaborating with other Bay Area film organizations to create a more active program or by improving the physical film-screening environment through updating existing facilities or taking over the Veterans Auditorium (Herbst Theater). These files include several folded drawings (Diaz prints) of theater and seating renovation plans that were never actualized.

Department correspondence from 1978 includes internal letters to Director Henry Hopkins about the elimination of the Film Department for financial reasons, and a "Final Descriptive Report" about the state of the department. The Film Publications Index file and cards represent an in-house effort to topically index film-related journals.

SERIES 3: PUBLIC RELATIONS, 1970-1978

Carton 1, folders 29-35; Carton 2, folders 1-18; Card File Box 2

Arranged alphabetically.

Includes monthly screening schedules used to announce upcoming film programs in the museum; press clippings (arranged chronologically by year) which document films shown in the museum and other film-related news; press releases produced by the museum about the film programs; and program notes which describe individual films and provide curatorial statements about specific film series. Also includes mailing lists used to publicize the program and specific film series, some of which are recorded on IBM Magnetic Cards (readable through an IBM Selectric typewriter of the era).

SERIES 4: EXTERNAL FILM ORGANIZATIONS, 1970-1980

Cartons 2-4

Subseries are arranged alphabetically.

The series documents the department's collection of film-related material generated by outside institutions, including catalogs published by distributors of independent films; programs of film festivals, primarily within the United States; newsletters about independent film; and screening schedules published by theaters and venues from around the country that focused on showing independent film.

SUBSERIES 4.1 Distributors, 1972-1980

Carton 2, folders 19-28; Carton 3, folder 1-8

Individual distributors are organized alphabetically, followed by Miscellaneous, and the Distribution Index to Films on 20th Century Artists.

Includes catalogs, announcements, and some correspondence from film distributors. Organizations documented in the files include those dedicated to the distribution of film/video as well as organizations which distributed film/video as part of a larger mission, such as art exhibition or cultural preservation. Most dates for distribution catalogs are estimated.

The Distribution Index to Films on 20th Century Artists, compiled by the Film Department in the mid-1970s, was an alphabetical list of films about artists and art movements, indicating which distributors carried the films. Files include copies of the index, blank order forms, and correspondence about and orders for the index.

SUBSERIES 4.2 Festivals, 1970-1978

Carton 3, folders 9-18

Arranged alphabetically, followed by Miscellaneous.

Files document screenings and activities surrounding film festivals, some of which were circulated. The San Francisco International Film Festival files document the festival from 1971 through 1977, and contain primarily newspaper clippings about the festival, programs, and schedules.

SUBSERIES 4.3 Newsletters, 1972-1980

Carton 3, folders 19-26

Arranged alphabetically, followed by Miscellaneous.

Includes small publications about film and film exhibition. The Association of Specialized Film Exhibitors (ASFE) Newsletter file includes correspondence about membership in the ASFE.

SUBSERIES 4.4 Venues, 1971-1978

Carton 3, folders 27-29; Carton 4, folders 1-19

Arranged alphabetically, followed by Miscellaneous.

Documents organizations exhibiting film on a continual or seasonal basis. Includes calendars, programs, announcements, and some correspondence. File titles include venue name and location. Some files contain small publications created by the exhibiting organization.
