## **SCOPE AND CONTENT OF COLLECTION**

Dr. Naffziger's collection is a potpourri of papers that spans several years on both sides of two World Wars.

The first highlight of his personal life is the log of a fishing trip that he and other physicians made to Montana. It was one of many learning experiences that were an important part of his many faceted life. He wrote several other diaries. The most important of are those dealing with his war experiences and travels, and which display a descriptive genius that livened such somber subjects as gas warfare.

There are many eye-catching items, such as: 1) a certificate of registration in the Arabian Horse Club Registry of America, 2) menus of private dinner parties, 3) a handmade blue and gold clown head name tag for a University of California class of 1907 reunion.

His "In Memoriam" files are interesting and include letters written to Mrs. Naffziger by Admiral Nimitz, Chief Justice of the United States Supreme Court Earl Warren, and Dean Witter.

The World War I is extensive , because he kept everything. The collection of his military orders is complete. A cartoon drawn by those who served under him hints at a near fatal occurrence. There are even records of uniform purchases.

The outstanding wartime files are those containing the notes of notes of his surgical patients: a separate piece of paper for each man. There are some photographs of his neurosurgical cases and the elaborate French manor-house ballrooms that were converted into surgical wards. Some cases are noted by Base Hospitals #8 and #69. The 30th General Hospital of the University of California was evidently manned during both World Wars.

Dr. Naffziger's World War II experience was more of an advisory nature and served as a springboard for his consolatory services in several foreign countries (see series #5).

Since Dr. Naffziger is the only Doctor of Medicine to serve as a Regent of the University of California, his professional in this collection include many aspects of and reach out to several campuses of the University. Of special note are the files dealing with the Howard C. Naffziger Laboratories for Neurological Research, correspondence with Earl Warren (then Governor of the State of California), and the problems of funding a trip to England for the UCSF Medical Illustrator, Ralph Sweet.

This group of folders contains personal papers and rarely deals with day-to-day affairs. There are brochures from Johns Hopkins Hospital celebrating the 50th anniversary of its founding (1889-1939). There is a brochure and financing memorandum from Franklin Hospital (formerly German Hospital, now Davies Hospital). There are manuals of the U. C. Academic Senate. There are folders dealing with university politics and finances: the problem of fulltime vs. private practice, the Guggenheim and Kaeding funds, the funding for the Hooper Foundation, the Langley Porter Clinic (contents of the cornerstone, the agreement of the operation of the clinic), Dr. Hans Lisser's portrait, the medical staff by-laws and membership list (1955-1956), the endowment of and donations to the Naffziger Laboratories, the Proctor Foundation Trust, Research and Development Laboratories, and travel funds for Ralph Sweet. There is personal correspondence with Governor Earl Warren and Dr. Charles Wilson ( Chairman of the Neurology Department succeeding Dr. Naffziger). There are several sets of plans.

A letter from Dr. Graham of Washington University in Saint Louis states that the International Surgical Society has always been under the tight control of "the Belgian group". There are two photographs of the Naffzigers taken in England. The papers include material about the 15 million volt linear accelerator of the Royal Hospital of St. Bartholomew.

The material includes material samples for a garment, an Itinerary of Pilgrimage to the Battlefields of the American Army (WWI), correspondence with William Cary (Associate Director For France, Unitarian Service Committee (1946) regarding dentistry for Czechoslovakia.
