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Biographical Information

The Bard family was a prominent family in the 19th and 20th centuries in Ventura County. A businessman, developer, and politician, Thomas Robert Bard is largely known as a United States senator and prominent landowner in late 19th and early 20th-century Ventura County. Bard was born December 8, 1841 in Chambersburg, Pennsylvania to Robert M. and Elizabeth P. Bard. At the age of 16 or 17, he followed his father's lead and began studying law with a local judge. However, he switched career paths shortly afterward and became a railroad surveyor when family finances became tight.

The direction of Bard's life was significantly altered by the outbreak of the Civil War. The war forced him away from surveying into working as a Union railroad agent. This position took him to aid the Union with the Battle of Antietam, and also acquainted him with Assistant Secretary of War and Pennsylvania Railroad President Thomas A. Scott. Scott took an interest in Bard, and accordingly, invited Bard to assist him in caring for his land and interests in Southern California.

Bard arrived in California on January 5, 1865. Here he worked as assistant superintendent of California Petroleum Company. One of his main tasks was oil surveying, which his training as a railroad surveyor prepared him for. Bard also assisted the first attempt to explore oil resources in California on Scott's Ojai ranch. After this experience he co-founded the Union Oil Company, and later the Graham-Loftus Oil Company. He then started to purchase more land within the county. Bard promoted the development of Ventura County and much of his wealth was built upon an increase in the county's population and in land values. Bard would eventually become Ventura County's largest landholder. He was also an incorporator and president of both the Bank of Ventura and Hueneme Bank, and he co-founded the Elizabeth

Bard Memorial Hospital. His business interests also included laying plans for Hueneme and building the Hueneme wharf.

Bard's political involvement began at an early age during the Civil War. He is credited as being an organizer and promoter for a league of Union men that helped to keep Maryland from supporting secession. After he arrived in California, he held a position as a county supervisor for the Ventura portion of Santa Barbara County from 1869 to 1872. He was instrumental in establishing Ventura as a separate county a few years later. He then served as a member of the new Board of Supervisors of Ventura County. Bard is most remembered for representing California in the United States Senate from 1900 to 1906.

Bard married Mary B. Gerberding in 1878. They had seven children including Beryl Beatrice, Mary Louise, Anna Greenwell, Thomas G., Elizabeth Parker, Richard, and Archibald Phillip. All the Bard children were born and raised at the family's estate, Berylwood, in Hueneme. Like Bard, several of his children and descendants were and remain active citizens of Ventura County.

Thomas Bard died on March 5, 1915 at his Hueneme home. Prior to his death he founded the Berylwood Investment Company to preserve and manage the Bard family's wealth and business interests. After his death, the company and the Bard family continued to invest in the development of Port Hueneme and Ventura County. Richard Bard was particularly involved in the development of the region, especially by bringing the Navy to Ventura County at Port Hueneme and Point Mugu. This ultimately created jobs and brought more people to the region. Other notable Bard family businesses include the Graham-Loftus Oil Company and Berylwood Stock Farm.

The success of the Bards' businesses allowed the family to lead an affluent life and they held much political power within the county and state. The two volumes titled *Oil, Land, and Politics: The California Career of Thomas Robert Bard* by W.H. Hutchinson provide greater detail for those who are interested in more information.

Thomas Bard was also the brother of Cephas "Little" Bard, a prominent doctor in Ventura County.

The Bard family correspondence is dated from 1883 to 1964, with the bulk of it date 1895-1951. Most of the series is autographed signed letters to and from Bard family and friends regarding life, travels, and business. These letters are primarily to or from either Beryl Bard or Richard Bard. Beryl Bard compiled and organized the letters by subject and date. This series also contains books and ephemera belonging to members of the Bard family.

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Series 2: Berylwood Investment Company records , 1907-1952 , (1936-1944)

Biographical / Historical

The Berylwood Investment Company (BIC) was a major player in Ventura County's economy. Its goals included buying and selling property, cultivating agricultural lands, producing agricultural products, and establishing water rights. The BIC impacted much of the history of Ventura, the county, and its communities. Thomas Robert Bard founded the BIC in 1910 and it was incorporated in 1911. It was intended to allow the Bard family to retain their wealth and to minimize the burden of inheritance tax after T.R. Bard's death. Only blood relatives of the Bard family could hold shares in the company, preventing fragmentation of family wealth. All shares were apportioned equally between family members. T.R. Bard served as its first president, followed by his wife Mary after his death, and then Richard Bard. Five family members served on the board at one time; consequently they learned the family business while rotating responsibilities. Initially, the company was located in Hueneme, but in 1950 it relocated to Somis.

T.R. Bard acquired a large amount of land in the Hueneme area during the early years following the formation of Ventura County. His accomplishment included laying plans for the city of Hueneme and the construction of the wharf. The BIC owned and was responsible for all Bard family properties and structures. It leased beachfront property to the city, providing the infrastructure for economic growth. It also funded the construction of the Hueneme post office and then leased it to the government in the late 1930s. Arguably the largest influence the company had on the development of Ventura County was the sale of large amounts of property to the United States Navy for the Port Hueneme Naval Base. Port Hueneme ultimately created many jobs and brought thousands of people to the county.

The BIC was also known for making donations to various causes within the community. For example, the company loaned the old Hueneme post office to the Hueneme Boys Club and gifted acreage for parks. When BIC President Richard Bard became seriously ill in 1969, the company's holdings were sold to new land development partnership Kaiser-Aetna. Richard's son, Archie Bard, donated the collection of BIC records to the museum.

Scope and Contents note

The Berylwood Investment Company (BIC) records are dated 1907 to 1952, with the bulk of them being from 1936-1944. This series includes letters, agreements, documents, by-laws, minutes, and statements. Additionally, it has records for the Berylwood Stock Farm and other farming operations conducted by Bard family members. Other investments include the Calistoga Mining and Development Company, the Italo Corporation, and the Sonora Consolidated Mining Company. Other materials include miscellaneous bound records, Berylwood Stock Farm accounts payable and receivable, lists of accounts and inventories, five journals and one daybook.

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Series 3: Berylwood Stock Farm records , 1912-1964, (1920-1925)

Biographical / Historical

Berylwood Stock Farm was a livestock and poultry farm in Hueneme, California, from 1920 to 1925. This farm focused on raising purebred livestock. Berylwood Stock Farm is best known for its purebred Holsteins and Duroc-Jersey Swine. BIC, a Bard family company, owned Berylwood Stock Farm. The Bards, primarily Mary and Richard, started this farm in 1920. J.W. Snodgrass managed the farm and raised several award-winning livestock.

In 1925 Berylwood Stock Farm was sold by BIC to August A. Rubel. Rubel renamed the farm to Billiwack Stock Farms. Everything on the farm, excluding the land, was sold to Rubel for \$175,000, including a famous award-winning bull that alone was priced at \$110,000. BIC allowed Rubel to use the farmland for over half a year while he made arrangements to move his newly acquired farm.

Scope and Contents note

The Berylwood Stock Farm records were created by the BIC from 1912 to 1964, with the bulk of the records dating to 1920-1925. The series is primarily composed of bookkeeping memoranda, feed sheets, balance sheets, letters, agreements, deeds, indenture of lease, bills of sale, livestock photos, and inventory. Inventories for each folder's contents are in the first folder of Box 5.

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Series 5: Graham-Loftus Oil Company records, 1897-1943

Biographical / Historical

The Graham-Loftus Oil Company operated in Ventura and Los Angeles counties from the early to mid-20th century. Graham-Loftus was incorporated on November 4, 1898. William Loftus, S.C. Graham, Thomas Bard, D.T. Perkins, and C.H. McKevevtt founded Graham-Loftus and all served as company board members. Several board member positions were filled by their sons as the older generation died. This company was originally based in Santa Paula, California, but moved its principal place of business to Los Angeles in 1922.

The main purpose of Graham-Loftus was to profit from oil discovery and drilling. Graham-Loftus was particularly successful in their oil endeavor at a Fullerton drilling site. In 1929 Graham-Loftus Oil Company sold its stock to the Italo Petroleum Corporation of America. A few years later there were a couple lawsuits regarding this change of ownership. Archie Bard, grandson of Graham-Loftus founder Thomas Bard and son of board member Richard Bard, donated the Graham-Loftus records to the museum.

Scope and Contents note

The records in this series are from the Graham-Loftus Oil Company for the period of 1897 to 1943. It contains business records including statements, balance sheets, reports, letters, dividends, insurance records, agreements, stockholder folders, and copies of minutes. The folders are organized by type of business record and when they were created. Information on the lawsuits related to the Italo Petroleum Corporation of America are in the folder titled "Italo Corporation-Documents" in the Berylwood Investment Company records series. The significance of the handwritten numbers on the original folder labels is unknown. It is not clear what the numbering system was for these records.

Bard's recovery from a life threatening illness between September and November of 1902. The majority of letters were written to his wife, Mary. The letters came from all over the United States and were sent by political associates, educators, ministers, family friends, and even the Southern California Women's Christian Temperance Union. The early letters of September and October of 1902 all expressed "sympathy" and would indicate that the prognosis was not good. In late October 1902 the letters began to reflect relief that Senator Bard was recovering.

A personal scrapbook from 1910 to 1912 contains many newspaper clippings and letters. The vast majority of these papers are political in nature. Loose, in the back of the scrapbook, there are several earlier newspaper clippings dating as far back as 1897, also regarding politics. Two other scrapbooks contain newspaper clippings on the 1900 U.S. Senate election. Another scrapbook contains a wide range of topics, including pamphlets and newspaper clippings on farming techniques, Thatcher School notes, and newspaper clippings on local social events. The ledgers and folders include family history, letters, receipts, correspondence, and other materials from Scotland, Ireland, and England regarding research on Bard family history. These ledgers date from 1879 to 1915, concentrated between 1902 and 1908.
