1994.004 Berkeley Bayfront Conservancy Fund

The fund was established in 1985 to further the environmental preservation of the Berkeley Bayfront by means of open space planning and the public acquisition of privately owned lands and waters along the bay. The president of the fund was Albert Lepawsky, who was also one of the prime movers of the organization known as Urban Care. Lepawsky was a professor in the Department of Political Science at the University of California, Berkeley. These papers cover the period 1975-1986 leading up to the establishment of the fund
