Bennie S. Robison's resignation became effective Sept. 15, 1943. Andrew B. Watson joined the department effective Sept. 16, 1943. Brightwell stationed at Canal Camp. Twenty-one Japanese firemen terminated and 4 joined the department. This leave rather an acute shortage in manpower but to date have been unable to recruit additional men. Due to the shortage in manpower in the rubbish disposal department, a large amount of inflammable rubbish has accumulated in Butte camp. This is rather a dangerous condition and have served notice to have same removed immediately. There has been no pick up for a week but a few trucks are working this morning. Sept. 24, 25, and 26, we had very heavy rain and damage to streets and roads was quite extensive. Very little damage to buildings. Installed 20 water extinguishers at dairy farm, but to date no hydrants have been installed at the dairy farm or camouflage warehouse. Have tested water extinguishers in 20 blocks and found 242 defective extinguishers in which the pumps will have to be replaced. Replaced 192 which were all the pumps we had in stocks. Drills were fewer and we had hopes of replacement before now. Employment department promised to send us men but none were available.

Segregation was one of the highlights of the month. It depleted the manpower in the department considerably and not all have been replaced. We have 17 men at Camp 1 and 26 in Camp 2 - including office force and Inspectors. Inspectors were cut from 9 to 6 as per Washington instructions. Recruiting additional men seems to be rather difficult as the loss of manpower is keenly felt in both Camps.

Due to lack of operators the phone service at Camp 1 is discontinued at 12:00 midnight until 8:00 a.m. We are doing everything possible to have service restored. I believe it will be restored in the near future.

Inspected all water extinguishers in Camp 2 and found 354 defective in addition to the 200 already on hand - total of 554. Returned the 200 faulty pumps to Mfr. in exchange for replacements received to date. Have notified Mfr. that we will need 400 additional replacements.

We had 3 fires, two of which were definitely due to carelessness and one doubtful. The loss in two of the fires was over \$100 in each case. I presume we have lost our excellent fire record.

Due to some difficulty in the rubbish collecting department, we have had a very bad accumulation of combustible material in Camp 2. We made a special effort and succeeded in having it cleaned up during Fire Prevention Week. At present all rubbish is cleaned up daily.

We received badges for all members of the department this month. We now have helmets and badges and have turn-outs on order which we hope to receive soon.

Fire Prevention activities consisted of placing posters in the most conspicuous places. Our supply of posters was very limited. Gave special instructions to employees of warehouses, both written and verbal as to proper manner of maintaining buildings and storage of merchandise. Also the use of auxiliary fire fighting equipment. Garage employees were given similar instructions and in addition the use of different extinguishers.

The school program after consulting with school authorities, consisted of a special lesson on fire prevention and hazards, yearly life and property loss and their causes, how and where to turn in fire alarms, and the use of extinguishers. This lesson contained information matter and 10 questions. Each pupil is required to answer these questions and they will be graded on these same as any other lesson. Questions are based partly on the information given and partly on common sense. We thought this method more effective than giving short talks.



Received Washington approval for the alteration of fire station at Butte but no work started as yet. No hydrants at warehouse or dairy farm. No phone or automobile for Associate Fire Protection Officer nor apartment either.

All hydrant valves and stems tested and oiled - also hydrants given flow test. All found in good condition.

Received 14 pairs of rubber boots. Turn-out should be here any day. Firemen now have badges, helmets and boots.

Have put out 39 foam extinguishers at Butte and 20 at Canal camps. These were installed in Block Manager's offices and some barracks.

Have conducted special campaign on bon fires and have had very good results in both camps.

Serviced all extinguishers at Camouflage warehouse and also installed two foam extinguishers as some automotive repair is being done there. All water barrels were refilled and buckets put into place. Hose racks are not built and play pipes have not been received. We were notified quite sometime ago that hose and play pipes would be shipped. Slat Lake have been especially slow or indifferent. Received wire from there on November 25 that our order was shipped on November 20. Lets hope it materializes.

Two and one-half inch water connection has been installed at dairy farm but none at Camouflage. Have requested two connections at dairy farm as building is quite extensive there and the fire hazard is increasing.

Have had motors in all the apparatus steam cleaned and the cooling systems in 60-1 and 60-2 has been repaired here by the garage as we were unable to obtain correct replacements from factory.

The plumbing department has tested water and gas shut-offs. All were open and in good working order.

The man power shortage is still felt here. We have 7-7 and 8 men on each platoon at Butte and 8-8 and 7 at Canal. The prospects for more men looks better as evacuees on seasonal leave are returning to camp.

Twenty-four hour telephone service has been resumed at Canal camp.

Alteration of fire station at Butte has not been started and the doors to the Canal station have not been installed. The reason given is the man-power shortage.

EXPLANATION OF PREVIOUS MONTHLY REPORTS

Due to lack of understanding and to misunderstandings the Fire Inspector's portion of the monthly reports may have appeared to have discrepancies. This, however, is the result of improper accounting of work done as the field work has been satisfactory. Since Mr. Hoffman's visit and the appearance of 40.4, Fire Protection Handbook, the Inspectors have been thoroughly instructed in the proper method of reporting the work they do. Future reports will conform to the rules and regulations.

To replace defective hand water pump, 400 others have been received. Three hundred and twenty-three have been replaced and serviced. Fourteen new extinguishers were put out.

W. E. Hoffman visited and made a thorough inspection of camp. We are complying with the recommendations he made. A phone has been installed for the Associate Fire Protection Officer; it is on the same line with the Fire Protection Officer. Fourteen suits of "Turnouts" for Firemen were received. Ten coats were returned for smaller sizes. (Our order for size 38 was substituted with sizes 40, 42, and 44). Inspections were made and conferences held in regards the new school buildings now under construction. Seven hundred feet of  $1\frac{1}{2}$ " hose were received. As yet we have no 2" to  $1\frac{1}{2}$ " reducers for the camouflage area.

The only fire involving loss was at the hog ranch. This has been covered by a detailed report. Alterations of the fire stations as yet are not started. The personnel on Dec. 30th is 8-8-9 firemen at Butte camp and 8-8-6 at Canal. Two new men are to report to work at Canal within the next day or two. During Christmas holidays patrols and inspections were intensified on account of the holiday gatherings, celebrations, etc. At a safety meeting on Dec. 31st, methods and programs to insure greater safety from fire were discussed.

One fire occurred this month. It was the result of defective installation of stove pipe at time of building construction. All other installations have been inspected and found to be satisfactory. Through special efforts all 30 and 60 days old fire hazards have been cleared up. This was accomplished without serving any additional written notices.

During inspections this month it was found that the water pumps in the extinguishers are still "going bad". A number of them had to be replaced. It appears that the entire lot of the first 1360 extinguishers received will all "go bad" eventually. To date ~~we have~~ about 550 have been replaced and 300 defective pumps were returned to the manufacturer this month.

Fuel oil shortage which occurred this month caused discomfort and uneasiness among the evacuees and also caused the fire department trouble as many bon fires were built but fortunately no fires occurred from this source. A campaign to eliminate dilapidated awnings has been started through the block managers association.

All WRA equipment and tools have been stamped and all fire hose has been numbered. To date we have not received the 1-1/2" and 2" play pipes for the Camouflage Warehouse. We have ordered a set of stencils so that we can mark and number all extinguishers.

As a result of segregation and leaves, the number of volunteer firemen is somewhat less than previously reported. This factor has caused us to lose some regular firemen and we expect to lose quite a few in the near future from these same causes and from the proposed draft of men of military age.

A. B. Watson's resignation was effective Jan. 16 and to date the vacancy has not been filled.

As of February 1, 1944 our fire fighting force is as follows:  
Butte - 9-8-8 and Canal - 8-8-9.

Later he notified us that he was again available. We then wired him to report for duty but a day later we were notified by Civil Service that Wilson did not qualify. The Personnel office here is still in communication with him. Also, a letter was received from Carpenter asking about the position. He was told that he should get in touch with you regarding the matter.

Work on enlarging the Butte fire station was started about two weeks ago. It is progressing nicely and should be completed in about 30 days. Work is being done by the firemen.

Fire reporting telephones have been installed in both camps, and are now in operation. Already there has been considerable trouble from people fooling with these phones. The Internal Security is cooperating with us in trying to eliminate this trouble. Other phones are being removed from the block managers' offices.

A number of meetings have been held with block managers regarding reorganization of volunteer fire brigades and repair of dilapidated awnings. There has been good progress with the volunteers but little if any with the awnings. Drills have been held with Caucasian volunteer company.

No government fire loss has occurred this month and only \$2.00 individual fire loss.

Companies are still fully manned, except Canal is one man short. Lots of changes are expected in the near future as a result of relocation and selective service.

Fire extinguishers have been installed on the new school buildings. Work on the auditoriums in both camp is progressing nicely.

One major fire occurred in Canal March 5. It completely destroyed one warehouse which with its contents was valued at about \$16,000.00. This loss was due to the fact that no water was available. A detailed written report has been submitted concerning all facts. One fire of minor nature in block 43 was caused by a careless smoker. The result was a loss of Government property valued at \$15.00.

A gasoline stand-by pump now installed and operating in Butte Camp. Barring accidents this should give us ample water supply in this camp. One well in Canal is still out of service. Electric power interruption occurred quite frequently this month due to the necessity of making repairs to main supply lines. Stand-by pumps were used to good advantage during this period.

Addition to Butte Fire Station is about complete lacking only a few minor details. A third engine company will be ready to be put in service if men are available. But present prospects are not very encouraging. At present our fire fighting force for April will be about as follows: Butte 7-7-8, Canal 7-8-8. Relocation and the Army will take quite a few more in the near future and replacements will be difficult until more people are received.

All hydrants were given the water flow test and all gas and water shut offs were operated and found O.K. Have given more complete instructions to volunteer firemen in all blocks. The response was very good.

The position of Associate Fire Protection Officer has not been filled to date.

We expect <sup>to have</sup> a fully manned company in Butte in a few days but prospects are not very good in Canal until the people arrive from Jerome.

Our fire fighting force this date is about as follows: Butte 7-7-7, Canal 5-5-6. Relocation and U. S. Army Service account for the men who have left the service. The men now coming into the department are older and probably will be more permanent.

The fire station is still not finished due to shortage of materials and manpower. The telephone line to the dairy farm has been O.K.'d and will be installed shortly, but the fire hydrant at Central Warehouse area and poultry farm has not been installed. Paul S. Morton, the new Assistant Director of Operations is very fire conscious and evidently will be a great help to us in getting our recommendations carried out.

The new auditorium in Canal is completed and ready for use. The first entertainment will be held Friday June 2nd. The one in Butte Camp is still a long way from completion. The seating arrangement in these places are very poor as the seats are individual chairs not fastened together or to the floor.

All fire extinguishers in both Camps are now marked W.R.A. and numbered. This work was done by the fire inspectors and will account for the numbers of inspections being somewhat lower than last month.

Our water supply has been sufficient to date and all four wells have been operating O.K. No fire occurred in either Camp this month.

Additional house lines and hose cart reel in service at warehouse area. The fence at Central Warehouse remains the same as originally constructed. Have requested that gates be constructed on each side of buildings so that lines can be laid from opposite directions at the same time. Occupancy of buildings is not yet complete. We are employing older men in the fire service so as to overcome the manpower shortage and turn over. We believe these men will be more permanent. Our fire fighting force as of September 1 is as follows: Engine #1; 8-8-8, Engine #2; 9-9-9, Engine #3, 7-7-7. The majority are new members.

Harry M. Frum transferred to Poston September 1. Brown has not reported to date. Received Heart Mountain Fire Prevention report. It is very good and helpful.

New W.R.A. form #158 has not arrived.

All water extinguishers installed in both camps has been refilled.

No fires occurred this month. Water shortage occurred twice but only for a short time, due mostly to power failure and the automatic devices on pumps to operate. An alarm system has been installed in the fire station at Butte and that will ring bell when the water in the tank reaches a low level. This should help some but I believe that manual supervision over the pumps for superior. Manual supervision has been recommended many times but has never been installed.

Occupancy at the Central Warehouse area is not complete and many changes are still to be made. One additional 2-1/2 inch hydrant has been installed at the chicken and dairy farm, making a total of two. Telephones have been installed at the dairy, chicken and hog farms. No water available at hog farm except by drafting. Present supply not sufficient for fire fighting.

All hydrants have been tested and flushed and gate valves turned on and off. All phones tested regularly.

Meetings have been held with all volunteer firemen in all blocks. Response very good.

W. S. Brown reported for duty from Jerome, September 3rd.

The manpower in the fire department is fairly good. Fire fighting force as of October 1st is as follows: Company #1- 7-7-6; Company #2- 9-9-9 and Company #3- 7-7-7.

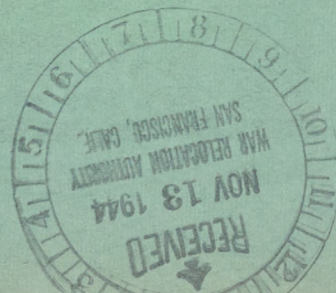

No fires have occurred this month. Fire prevention was observed in the Center and full details appear on attached sheet.

Mr. Hoffman, fire protection advisor, visited the Camp from October 12 to 18 inclusive. The entire Center was inspected. Mr. Hoffman gave instruction on fire prevention to Appointed Personnel and which was very helpful and instructive. It will result in better understanding of fire prevention problems and also for better cooperation from division and section heads, we feel sure.

The man power in Butte Camp is good but in Canal it is not up to requirements. The fire fighting force as of November 1 is as follows: Butte - 9-9-9, 7-7-7; Canal - 9-8-8. All Engineers have been given special instructions in drafting water as that is our only means of obtaining water at the hog ranch for fire fighting.

All fire inspectors in both Camps were assigned to repair and inspect stoves starting October 20, due to the shortage of man power in the Engineering Department.





## FIRE PREVENTION ACTIVITIES

### Blocks

Fire prevention activities were started early in September when all block managers were contacted regarding the removal of dilapidated awnings and rubbish from barracks and to have a real clean up campaign. Special notices were printed in English and Japanese and distributed in all blocks. We believe we received good cooperation and results from this effort.

### Volunteer Firemen

Due to relocation and other activities it was necessary to reorganize the block volunteer firemen. This was done by one of our inspectors who personally interviewed most of the members, arranged for evening meetings in various blocks. In most cases three blocks were included in one meeting. Two meetings were held each evening until both camps were covered. These meetings were started October 1st and completed about the 12th. Total membership in both camp is 562. Lectures were conducted by Fire Protection Officers and consisted of instructions on how to stop fires from spreading from block to block; Removal of common fire hazards; How to turn in a fire alarm and correct procedure when a fire is discovered; Instructed not to fight a fire without calling the Fire Department first; and how to use all kinds of fire extinguishers.

### Schools

The school program consisted of special lessons on fire prevention and fire hazards to be found in the home. We sent out 1500 pamphlets to the higher grades which contained questions and answers on this subject. This was treated as a regular lesson and each pupil given credit for the work. They were also encouraged to paint posters and write short essays. Some of these were sent to us and are very good. On Friday the fire truck visited the schools and we explained just how the truck was operated and what the equipment was for, also gave them a short talk on fire prevention.

### Churches and Mess Halls

The pastors and priests of all the churches were contacted and asked to give short talks on fire prevention on Sunday October 8. Block managers were asked to give fire prevention talks in the mess halls during the week. Several hundred posters were put up in mess halls, administration offices, hospitals, schools and warehouses.



### Hospital

The hospital staff was given a lecture on fire hazards to be found in hospitals and homes. Instructed how to use all fire extinguishers. How to turn in a fire alarm. How to evacuate patients.

### Buildings

All buildings and warehouses were inspected during this period. The warehouse, garage and transportation employees were given instruction on hazards common to such establishments. What kind of extinguishers to use on different fires, how to use them and the use of auxiliary fire fighting equipment. All fire extinguishers were checked in both camps and an effort made to remove all fire hazards.

### Appointed Personnel

All appointed staff were sent information on fire hazards to be found in their living quarters, places of employment and hazards common to camps such as ours. Fire losses in the U.S. and W.R.A. A short talk on fire prevention was also given by the Fire Protection Officer at the Staff Meeting October 11.

Returned all parties to Camp and took injured lady to hospital. X-ray examination revealed no serious injury and doctor stated she was O.K. to travel. As it was too late for dinner at the mess I brought them all to my apartment and gave them what dinner we could provide. Then I took them to Phoenix where they proceeded by train to their destinations. The plane was privately owned and operated between Los Angeles and El Paso, Texas.

All valves and shut-offs have been tested in the water system and all were found to be in proper position. All hydrants were opened and flushed following this test. One was found shut off due to the fact that valve operated in reverse. Valve was opened immediately by Plumbing Department. All other hydrants operated O.K. All valves were operated in sprinkler system at hospital and found to be in good working condition.

Have made special effort to have all grease removed from mess kitchen especially the exhaust fans and have met with very good cooperation.

Installed 100 feet of 1 1/2" hose in the new auditorium at Butte.


