Beginning the first of February, the Evacuee Property Section conducted interviews in the various blocks with the people who are moving to Tulalake arranging the crating and shipment of their household goods. Following this series of interviews and beginning on February 10, this freight was picked up and stored in warehouses. This task was completed on February 15th. Beginning February 18, the checkable baggage was inspected, picked up and transported to the Lone Pine station where it was loaded on baggage cars scheduled for the segregees movement starting February 21. During the week of February 21, in spite of bad weather, the movement to Tulalake was completed although the last three trains were a little behind schedule. On February 28, the loading of the freight shipments to Tulalake began and is going forward as scheduled.

A great deal of credit for the smooth operation of the various phases of this movement should go to the evacuee personnel who so whole-heartedly assisted in this work. Also this section wishes to express appreciation to the many volunteer workers who also gave us their help.

ruary 28, one carload per day was shipped as scheduled. No serious
problem was encountered during this shipment.

Since the arrival of some of the goods at Tule Lake however, we have
had a complaint registered that some of the canned goods belonging
to one of the segregants was missing. However, as this property was
under military guard constantly from the time it left the evacuee's
premises until it was loaded on the freight cars, it is presumed
that the vandalism did not occur at this center.

Although this section was quite busy with evacuee property
matters during the balance of the month, nothing of particular
significance occurred.

During the month of September, claim of storage liens was filed against fish nets belonging to several evacuees residing at this center. These nets had been left with the Sea Pride Packing Co. at the time of evacuation and were stored in a warehouse at Wilmington. About a year ago, it was requested that the nets be removed but this request was not complied with. Some of the evacuees requested the WRA to store the nets at that time, but due to lack of facilities for handling them this request was denied. Later, an effort was made to dispose of the nets which had greatly deteriorated during the storage period and the price which were offered were not considered adequate by the owners, therefore, these offers were refused. When the question of storage liens appeared, these evacuees were consulted and advised to appoint one of their number to return to the Los Angeles area to settle the problem for all of them. They decided against doing this and it was not possible for the WRA to do any more regarding the nets, therefore the matter is to be considered closed.

Since the transfer of all contraband picked up by the army to the WRA, we have had numerous requests for the release of items which are no longer considered as contraband and this will probably continue to increase as time goes on.

The usual number of ordinary cases was handled by this division during this period.

During the month of ~~September~~ ^{OCTOBER}, a considerable number of shipments of evacuee property have been made. This number has been augmented by the recruiting of Sea Brook Farms.

Negotiations have been started by the Star Nurseries for the disposal of a \$25,000 parcel of land at Manhattan Beach, California. Also considerable effort has been devoted by this section and by the Los Angeles office to assist Miss Helen Arikawa with the sale of property belonging to her and her brother, James. This deal is presently being held up by the title company on account of trusteeship reports on the property which were made in 1923 to 1927. It is interesting to note that this property is owned by Lieutenant James Arikawa and his sister, that James is at present serving with the armed forces in Italy and Helen is employed in the Washington office of the WRA. One other brother is also in the armed forces and a third brother, Frank Arikawa, lost his life in the invasion of Italy.

We find that our effort to obtain release of contraband articles which were to be turned over to the WRA is halted pending final settlement by the army and the storage company who now are storing this property. The usual number of routine cases have passed through this office during this reporting period.

// The work of this section has continued at about a normal point throughout this reporting period. There have, however, been fewer shipments for relocatees, and there was decided lull in activity immediately after the first of the year. Cases are beginning to appear on which it would seem impossible to accomplish any satisfactory results under the present ruling. I refer particularly to cases where the entire source of income although fairly substantial at the time of evacuation, has been dissipated either through poor management or in some cases, acts of God which leave the evacuee with no means of support whatever. In some cases, this loss amounts to very substantial figures. Plans for the handling of a stepped-up relocation program are pretty thoroughly crystalized and it is possible this can be handled with a minimum of confusion. We have as yet been unable to accomplish the return of any of the articles picked up as contraband, although we have numerous applications for the return of tools of the evacuee's trade, such as pruning shears, axes and kitchen knives etc.

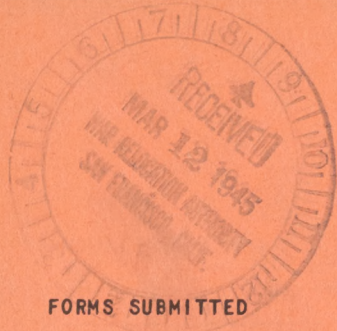

During this reporting period there has been a considerable increase in the activities of this section. Several cases have come to our attention which in our opinion requires assistance from the property division, but which are excluded from this assistance by provision of the manual. Subsequently, we refer to cases where property was stored in private dwellings or garages, and where the owner (not an evacuee) has requested removal of this property. The evacuee has no place to store the property and under the manual, we are not permitted to place it in WRA warehouse. There are also cases at the center where the evacuee request part of the property belonging to him shipped to the point of relocation and a portion to private warehouse in Los Angeles or to relatives in other centers. The manual prohibits this, but it appears that such shipment would be justified in many cases. The progress for property assistance for relocatees from the project has been very well coordinated with the various sections involved and is running very smoothly. Indications are that the number of relocatees will continue to increase with the coming month. This section has also handled numerous cases of returned property from the F.B.I. who have released certain items of personal property to aliens who were formerly interned.

Shipment of evacuee property during July is much below that of previous months. 167 shipments were made aggregating 120,000 pounds as compared to over 200,000 pounds for June. No explanation can be given for this lull in relocation. Relocation of evacuee personnel has impeded the office work to some extent but it is anticipated that this will be overcome by the employment of appointed personnel to fill the vacancies.

During the month of August 193 property shipments were made containing 2,138 parcels and totaling 215,572 pounds in weight. Immediately following August 14th there was a slow-up in shipment due to the fact that Western Truck Lines had no trucks available. However, after 10 days this situation was overcome and shipments are moving regularly again.

The last carload of household goods to be shipped to Tule Lake was loaded on March. A total of seventeen carloads were shipped from Manzanar to Tule. These carloads averaging around 40,000 pounds each. We have had one specific complaint of missing goods from an evacuee named Eaku who claims that several cans of fruit were opened, fruits removed and the cans replaced in the boxes. We have advised Mr. Best it was impossible for any evacuee at this Center to have opened the goods because from the moment the property left the evacuee's premises until it was loaded in the cars, it was constantly under military guard. This is the only specific case although it has been hinted that there were several such cases but no other definite claims have been made.

Other than the above, nothing of outstanding importance has occurred in this section during the month of March. A normal number of shipments have been made and received but none of them have presented any particular problem.

During the past reporting period, we have had sixty interviews with evacuees, sent out ten forms 156 and eight form 155, and ten shipments for evacuees going out on relocation and made one shipment for evacuees going from camp to camp.

SUBJECT: Progress Report from Manzanar

Herewith is the last progress report received from Dave Bromley, Evacuee Property Officer at Manzanar. You will note the statement that one complaint was received of missing goods during the process of the segregation movement. Mr. Bromley states that the goods were under constant military guard from the time they left the evacuees' residences until it was loaded in the cars. I believe it can be assumed then, that if the contents of the cans of fruit were enjoyed by anyone it was either during the period they were under military guard at Manzanar or during the unloading of the cars at Tule Lake.

My purpose in bringing this to your attention is so that we may take such steps as you deem appropriate to prevent recurrence of such conditions in our segregation movements about to be undertaken.
