Two units will be given for last year's two hour courses, but only one for those of this year's.

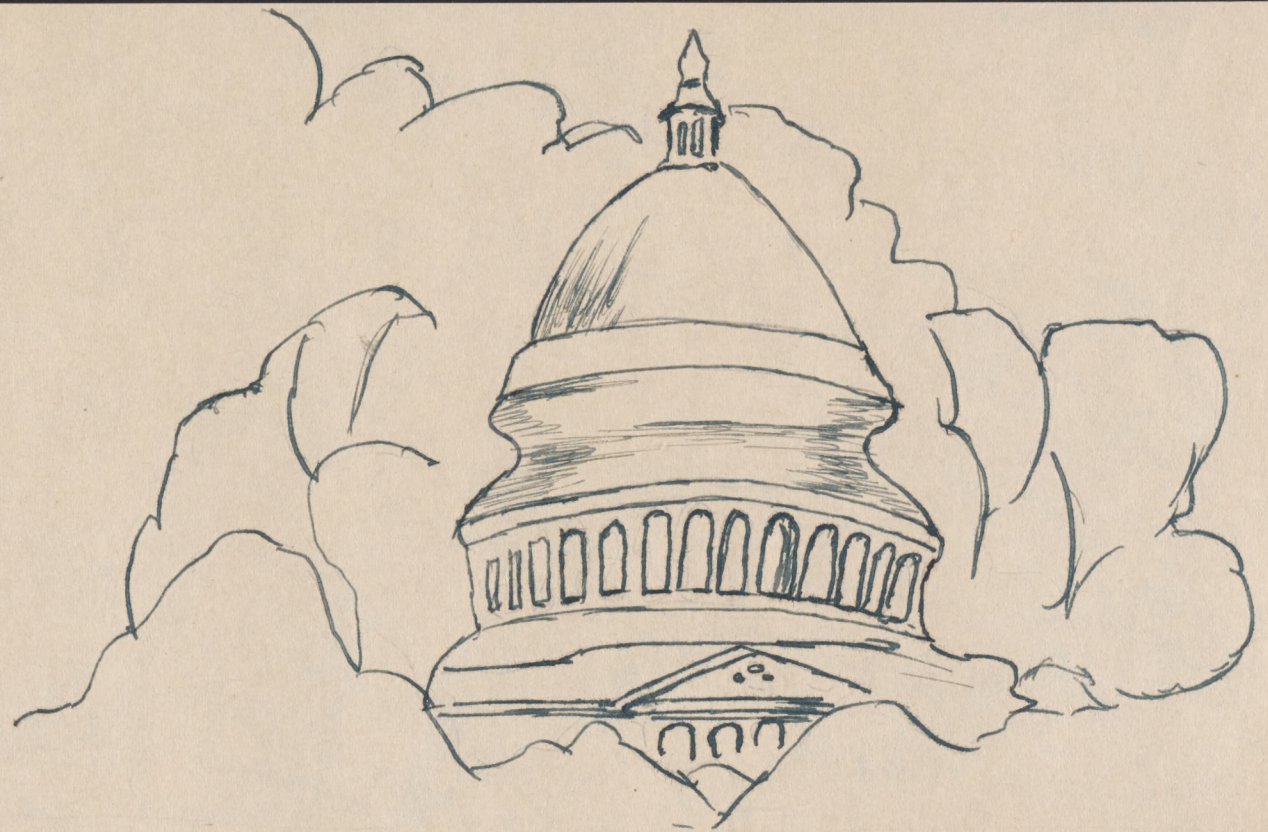
A great loss was felt by the senior class when an active member, Betty Deguchi, departed for Hillsdale, Michigan where she will continue her education.

3. The six seniors ranking highest were picked by a decimal system.

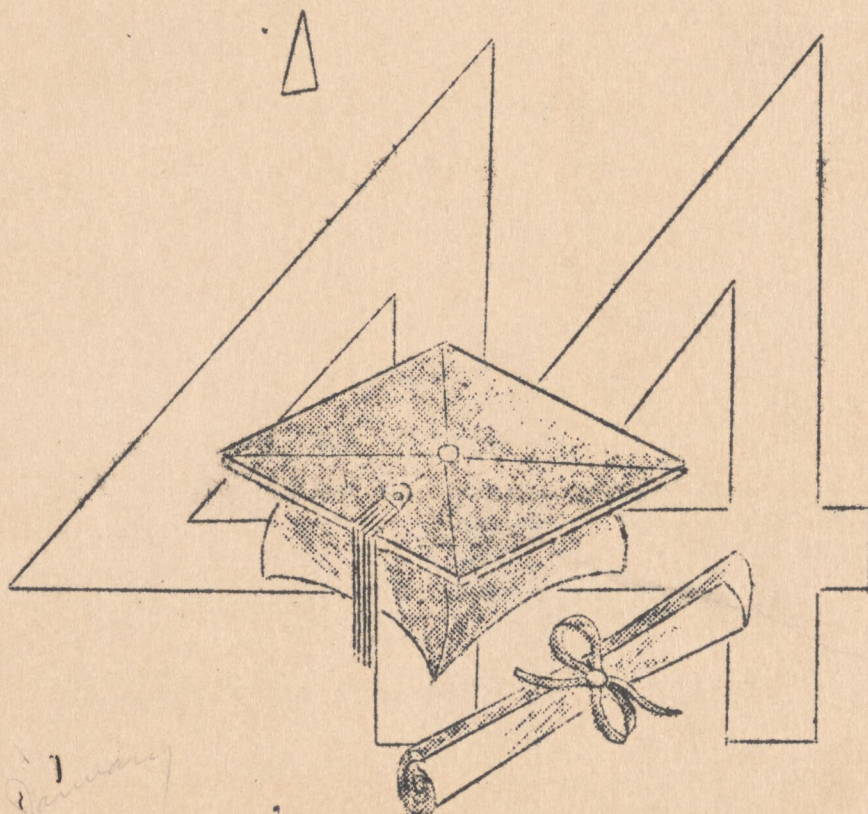
4. The six were given a rating of 3-2-1 in leadership, service, character by all those faculty members who felt competent to grade.
