Dear Mr. Myer:

In answering Mr. Stauber's letter of August 9th, we are enclosing WRA 178 Rev. forms on John Kurazawa dated May 25th, correcting the omission on the previous report.

Reference was made to a discrepancy in figures between Item 4 of the monthly statistical reports and the daily summary. Evidently this discrepancy is due to the fact that our files department has maintained a daily correction such as deaths, transfer from work group leave to other centers, and changes from work group to indefinite leave, while our daily running record has held to the figure on all group leave departures.

Recapitulation of changes outside the project from work group leaves to indefinite shows 2 deaths, 27 transfers, 310 seasonal leaves converted to indefinite leave, and 1 recall. We have been carrying our daily summary with a gross figure of departures and returns for seasonal leave only, not compensating for changes to indefinite leave, death and so forth, while out on seasonal employment.

In your letter calling attention to Item 4 of the monthly statistical report, we feel that you must have been referring to II-A line 1 as the figure 878 appears on that line. Finally, the monthly employment outside the

- 2 -

project is gradually going down due to conversions, transfers, and so forth.

Evidently there is a misunderstanding of original instructions which accounts for this difference in figures. We have checked from the beginning and our daily evacuee population summary will carry the changes as we are informed.

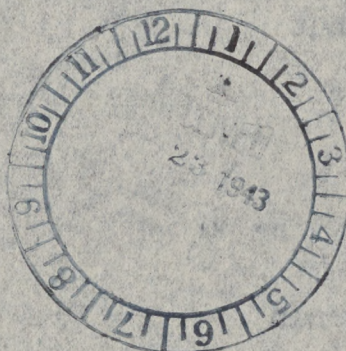

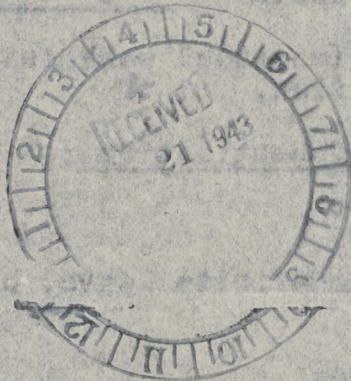

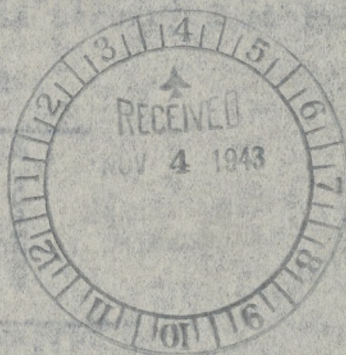

Please refer to our letter of November 17, 1943, transmitting Daily Admission and Departure Advices for the weeks ending Saturday, November 6, 1943, and Saturday, November 13, 1943. Certain errors in tallying have been discovered, and the following corrections should be made: (To simplify matters, new and correct population summaries are enclosed for each day during this period.)

1. On November 2, 1943, 24 persons, 19 of whom were on seasonal leave and 5 of whom were on indefinite leave, who had returned to this center as visitors to assist their families during the segregation movement were recorded as transfers, a supplemental sheet supplying the actual date of departure and the centers to which their families were transferred. We are now recording these persons as visitors, so that their entry and departure will not affect their leave status nor affect the total number of persons on leave from this Center.

Group leave, then, should read 971; the subtotal (a) for general indefinite leaves is correct as recorded, as the five visitors who had received indefinite leave were not deducted from this total.

Likewise, the Recapitulation should show a total of 27 departures, and 2 admissions, leaving a total of 15,021.
