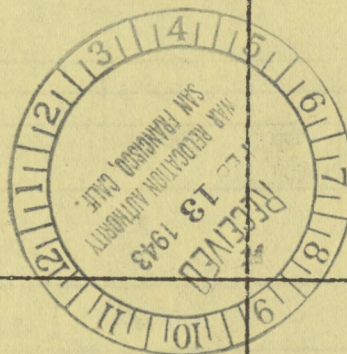

Within the next two or three weeks, 85% of the Industrial employees will be terminated, due to being transferred to other centers. The factory has been assigned the job of cutting and making 5,000 boxes, 2' x 2' x 3'. With the trained men leaving for other centers, and a shortage of help available, it is going to be somewhat of a problem. To meet this problem, I plan to run a night crew and ask for volunteer help.

We will not be able to go on a normal basis until the segregation program is completed.

The 2'x 2' x 3' packing boxes that were issued to all segregees leaving this project, were made by the Industrial Section. In order to complete this task in time for the segregation movement, it was necessary to run two shifts, a day crew and a night crew. Due to many of our employees being transferred to other W.R.A. centers, the cooperation in this work, as a whole, was very good. We completed this job on September 23, 1943.

The problem for next month is to build up a new crew from the segregants that have come in from other W.R.A. centers.

As for the orders on hand, at present we are milling parts for 36 two pedestal office type desks. The supply officer plans to furnish forty new apartments on this project and the furniture factory has been asked to manufacture most of the furniture that is to be used in furnishing these new apartments. This includes beds, chest of drawers, bedside tables, end tables, coffee tables, writing desks, chairs, medicine chests and dinnette sets.

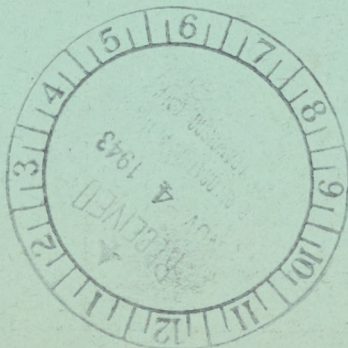

Due to the November 1st incident here at the center and the army taking over the center on November 4th, 1943, the factory crew has only worked three and one-half days this month. All evacuee positions were terminated through-out the entire project on Nov. 4th. On November 9th I requested part of the crew to be reassigned, but none of the evacuees have returned to work. I am told, an effort was made by the factory employees to return to work after they had been assigned, but some Japanese Committee in the colony refused to grant them permission. Negotiations are now under way to try and get the crew to return to work which I hope will be in the near future. When and if the crew does return, we will continue with the manufacturing of household furniture for the new personnel apartments.

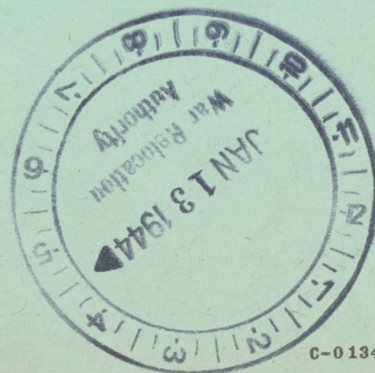

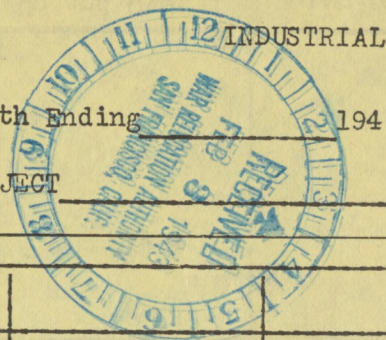

NARRATIVE REPORT:

After one conference with the key workers of this section, a few of the furniture factory evacuee employees reported for work on Jan. 18, 1944.

During the past two weeks many of the old employees have returned to work and we have gradually increased our force so that we now have eighteen of the twenty-four that were employed on Nov. 4th, 1943. We are planning to increase the force to the full quota in the near future.

We plan to continue with the manufacturing of household furniture for the new personnel apartments and the orders on hand for the colony recreation halls.

We have sufficient material and supplies on hand to take care of the present orders.

We have now 20 evacuee workers 4 less workers now than Nov. 4th of last year. Unfortunately we have lost 1 man due to injuries received at the end of January while performing his duty.

At the present we have completed milling and assembling of 125 combination desks for Personnel Apartments. Materials for 14 ping pong tables for Community Activities are being milled and pending for assembling. Eighty chest of drawers are in process of painting. In finishing of 80 chest of drawers we were unexpectedly told to have them painted with enamel for the Personnel Apartments. In the Meantime we have requested to purchase enamel to meet this requirement. Meanwhile we shall proceed painting with the little material we have on hand.

We plan to continue with the manufacturing of the rest of the household goods for Personnel Apartments with any orders that may come from the colony.

At the present we have sufficient lumber to carry on with the orders that are pending. If the orders increase and if it is justified we would like to increase our crew to full capacity.

However, after confering with a Procurement Official, the appropriation of that order has been honored.

We have 125 combination desks for Personnel Housing, 36 tables and 14 ping pong tables, for Community Mangement, which is pending for finishing.

100 toilet tissue racks, 275 towel racks for Personnel Housing, 13 standard size filing cabinets for Property Control, 1 special filing cabinet for the Post Office, 2 legal size filing cabinets and 1 supply cabinet for the "Newell Star," which is in the milling and assembling stage. We will be able to continue manufacturing the rest of household furniture for Personnel Housing with whatever orders that came from the office. It will be necessary for us to procure more materials next month as our present stock in the warehouse is running low.

We feel it necessary to have an addition of 2 more finishers to take care of the production.

We have at present several orders on hand. We are planning to build up the shop in order that it will be able to handle all future orders in a satisfactory manner.

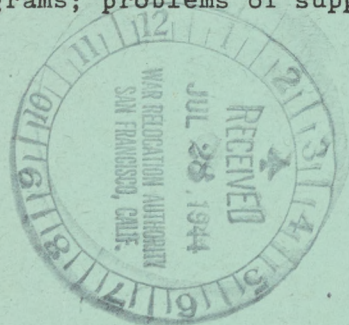

We have several work orders and 100 medicine chests for Personnel Housing. We have sufficient materials on hand to take care of all orders.

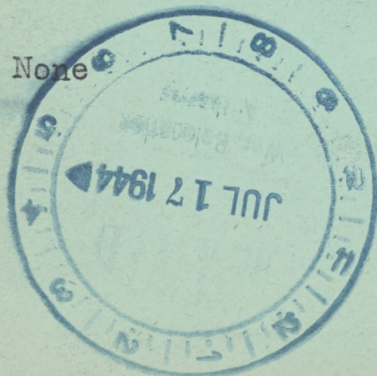

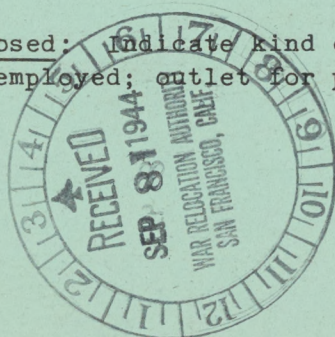

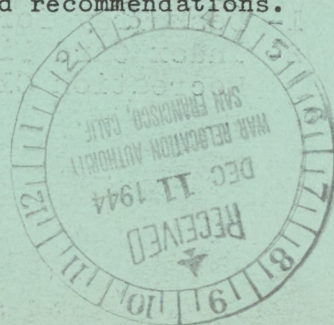
